Walk for Life West Coast a Record Breaker

SAN FRANCISCO, Christian Newswire / LifeNews.com -- Tens of thousands of pro-life activists, about 50,000, filled Justin Herman Plaza in San Francisco's downtown and then walked 2.5 miles along the waterfront in a record-breaking turnout for the 7th Annual Walk for Life West Coast.



The Walk was held on the 38th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision legalizing abortion. "Today on January 22nd, I do not honor choice any more, I mourn choice," said former Planned Parenthood clinic director Abby Johnson, who walked away from her job at a Texas Planned Parenthood clinic on October 6, 2009, after assisting in an ultrasound-guided abortion of a 13-week-old fetus. "You are the new generation of the pro-life movement and I can tell you Planned Parenthood is shaking in their boots."

Lisa Hamrick, a representative of the event, told LifeNews.com: "Thanks to all of you who came from far and near to participate yesterday in the Walk for Life West Coast. The San Francisco Police Department confirmed that it was the largest crowd that we have had up to this point — an estimate of 50,000-plus people participated this year." A densely packed crowd walked 20 across in a line that stretched over a mile.

Founded in 2005 by a group of San Francisco Bay Area residents, the Walk for Life West Coast's mission is to change the perceptions of a society that thinks abortion is the answer. A very small group of pro-abortion activists counterprotested and their ranks included anti-war activist Cindy Sheehan, who told the San Francisco Chronicle she participated because, "It does seem that the tide is turning against a woman's right to choose."

Fairness Doctrine: 3 Votes and It's Back

Manassas, VA – The messages from Washington, D.C., are mixed. President Obama's speech in Tucson, Arizona, was dignified and Presidential. Yet NRB expects the battle to define "civil discourse" to ramp up in coming months, bringing with it a renewed effort to reinstate the Fairness Doctrine.

"The so-called 'Fairness Doctrine' was anything but fair," said Dr. Frank Wright, NRB President & CEO. "It was a misguided FCC regulation on speech that even Dan Rather called an affront to the First Amendment, in which 'an invaluable element of freedom has been lost'. Yet in the wake of the tragic shooting in Tucson, Capitol Hill liberals have practically tripped over themselves to see who would be first to call for reinstatement of the Fairness Doctrine."

"It appears that Rep. James Clyburn (D-SC) claimed that dubious honor... when he told the Charleston Post & Courier that 'vitriol in public discourse' led to the shooting and announced his plans to introduce legislation to reinstate the obsolete and nefarious Fairness Doctrine," added Craig Parshall, NRB Sr. V.P. and General Counsel. "That policy did devastating damage to the free speech rights of broadcasters... before being wisely abandoned in the 1980's. It is sad to see some lawmakers using a human tragedy to promote a constitutional outrage like the Fairness Doctrine."

"Should FCC Chairman Genachowski decide to support the Fairness Doctrine...NRB would expect the FCC to reinstate this dangerous regulation," concluded Dr. Wright. "Only three votes and it's back."

Loving As He Would

I believe the most powerful emotion you and I can experience is love. This is because love is central to God's character, and He wants us to be His representatives to others—caring for them as He would. Showing love toward those we encounter means we are committed to their satisfaction, security, and development so that they can become all He created them to be. This enables us to be patient in trying circumstances and allows us to make sacrifices for the people we meet without complaining. The Father's love also gives us the energy to remain faithful to those we care about and helps us to forgive when we are wronged.

As wonderful as love is, it can be the most difficult emotion we experience. First, many people think they understand what it truly means to care for others. Unfortunately, what they've learned is the world's definition of love instead of the Lord's. They think they are devoted to another person, when what they really feel is attraction and not much more.

Second, past hurts and sorrows can rob us of the joy the Father wants us to experience—leaving us distrustful of others' intentions or perhaps fearful of expressing our heart to someone we care about. How do you learn to love, especially if you have been deeply hurt? There is only one way, and it is by tapping into the inexhaustible love of God through Jesus Christ. His sacrificial death on the cross was the greatest display of love that this world has ever known. He gave Himself freely for you and me—not just so we could be set free from sin, but so we could have an intimate relationship with Him.

First John 4:10–12 tells us, —In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. . . . If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love is perfected in us.

Do you have difficulty receiving or expressing love? Many people do. They fail to understand that His love is gentle, long-suffering, and can soften the hardest heart. However, when you express His love to others, you are not only doing what He created you to do, you are also opening yourself to all of the awesome blessings He has for you.

Therefore, my challenge to you this month is to embrace His profound love and share it with others. Jesus said, —By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another (John 13:35).

Do you wish to be an effective follower of the Savior? Would you like to experience the fullness of His love for you? Do you want to change others' lives by leading them to Him? Then demonstrate your devotion to the Lord and compassion for His people by sharing the gospel and engaging in meaningful ministry. Care for others as He would—that is when you know for certain that His love is flowing through you.

CELEBRATE REASON, AMEN!

Not too long ago, I saw a story about a bulletin board in New Jersey. The advertisement pictured a manger scene with the words, “You know it's a myth. This season, celebrate reason.” What interesting words! The billboard was bought by a group called American Atheists, whose aim was to “encourage atheists who are going through the motions of celebrating Christmas to stop.”

But there is something more insidious on that billboard. The atheists putting up the advertisement are trying to monopolize reason. They believe they have reason on their side. The opposite of reason is foolishness. In their mind, therefore, people who believe in God are foolish. But is this the case?

Reason is defined as “sound judgment or good sense.” The atheists present no reasonable case for believing that there is no deity on their billboard, they simply make the assertion. So, the question follows: Is belief in God more reasonable than not believing in God? There are three arguments any Christian can present for the reasonableness of their faith. First, the universe had a beginning. At the beginning of the twentieth century, the universe was thought to be eternal. This was thought to be necessary to allow naturalistic evolution enough time to work. Modern discoveries have shown that the universe had a specific beginning in time. As we all know, clocks do not make or wind themselves. If the clock needs someone to get it started, then the universe needed someone to create it. The beginning of the universe requires a Beginner.

Second, the universe exhibits design. We see so much complexity in nature, from the individual patterns in snowflakes to the DNA code in each cell in our bodies. Chaos does not produce information. Randomness does not produce patterns. As we learn more, we see how complex life is and how difficult it was for life to have come about by mere chance alone. The design in the universe and in life requires a Designer.

Third, we have an inborn sense of right and wrong. Mankind is the only creature on this planet that understands about morality. This sense transcends location and culture. It could only have come from a transcendent Source. The moral law requires a moral Lawgiver.

In each case, the atheist answers with only chance, randomness, and naturalistic evolution. It is more reasonable to believe in God. Celebrate reason? Amen!

Mission and History of AHG

American Heritage Girls (AHG) is dedicated to the mission of building women of integrity through service to God, family, community and country. AHG offers merit badges, service projects, leadership opportunities and outdoor ac-



tivities. But the vision of AHG is different from that of its secular counterpart: American Heritage Girls embraces time-honored moral standards while encouraging each member to grow in her faith in God, personal integrity, family values, citizenship and community service. AHG is unabashedly Christian, recognizing that there is no greater purpose than providing a firm foundation for our children. As AHG Founder Patti Garibay says, "Through diligence, commitment, and sacrifice, our daughters can enjoy an environment that upholds the Truth while allowing joy-filled living."

When AHG started over 15 years ago, it was just a handful of families determined to make a change in the world of scouting. Disappointed with the ever-shifting values of the Girl Scouts, Garibay decided that she could offer something different—something that provided clear Christian moral guidelines and emphasized charac-

ter-building on a firm foundation. From 100 Cincinnati-area girls in 1995 to now over 12,000 members in 41 states, American Heritage Girls has experienced explosive growth. Thousands of families across the nation have joined AHG.

Our Troop's Journey

My own journey with American Heritage Girls began in 2003. My daughter was part of a Girl Scout troop. We had a fantastic Christian leader. But some of us also had boys in Cub Scouts, and we became increasingly aware of the vast differences between the Boy Scouts (BSA) and Girl Scouts (GSUSA).

Add GSUSA's shifting value system to the decision to drop the mandatory oath to honor God ("when reciting the Girl Scout Promise, it is okay to replace the word 'God' with whatever word your spiritual beliefs dictate"), and we parents were convicted that we needed a different scouting organization. We "stumbled" ultimately upon American Heritage Girls. The program we had envisioned had already been established!

Sheila Jackson was thrilled about the possibility of AHG. "I wanted my girls to grow up with everything centered around Christ, and I wanted to be around other parents who felt the same way. I wanted my kids to have a love for family first, and an attitude of serving in our community and country above a desire for 'Girl Power.' That's not what it's all about." We begin each meeting with a flag ceremony and devotion. Troop meetings focus mainly on badge work and service projects. Troop meet-



ings offer the girls a safe place to build relationships. Meetings provide an opportunity for girls to interact on a regular basis. And the relationship-building isn't just for girls: AHG is family-focused.

Serving Others

Service is an integral part of the program. Our troop performs many hours of service, from packing care bags for foster kids to reading poetry at nursing homes, and more. These girls define love in action. AHG members logged more than 108,000 service hours for the 2009-10 program year. From reading to the elderly to picking up trash, these girls are learning to be servants. Encouraging a lifestyle of service prepares Kingdom workers, and that's what AHG is all about.

Starting a Troop

The hand of God is evident in American Heritage Girls. It is beautiful to hear girls re-

citing the AHG Oath in unison: "I promise to love God, cherish my family, honor my country, and serve in my community." How encouraging to hear a parent say, "AHG would be the last thing I would ever drop off our schedule!"

I encourage parents to consider forming a troop. Ask your church, private school or local homeschooling support group if they would prayerfully consider chartering a troop. Record Numbers of Women Turn to Faith in Christ

*Daughters of Destiny
leaders witness a surge
in conversions,
interest in life change*



COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., Nov. 11 /Christian Newswire/ -- For more than 30 years, Mel Goebel has been going into prisons to share the gospel. Throughout the years, he has seen men and women transformed through the gospel message. But what he sees now is just plain amazing.

For the first time, Mel and his wife, Annie, who head Daughters of Destiny prison ministry, are witnessing women inmates come to Christ in record numbers. In the past year, more



than 20,000 inmates have attended Daughters of Destiny evangelism events, and nearly 7,500 have made decisions for Christ.

“What a holy privilege to watch God move in this ministry,” said Annie. “There’s an excitement and fervor for God. In the past, 7%-10% of the inmates at a facility might attend our meetings. Now we’re seeing 30%-90%!”



The mission of Daughters of Destiny is to equip volunteers to reach incarcerated women for Christ and disciple them while in prison and after their release. Recently, Mel and Annie led an event at the largest women’s prison in California, which houses 9,000 inmates. Kay Warren, wife of The Purpose-Driven Life author Rick Warren, was the featured speaker, and once again, the response was phenomenal.

“We are experiencing revival in women’s prisons throughout the U.S.” said Mel.

“We see a movement of repentance, and as a result the women inside are passionate to share their faith with others in prison.”

Daughters of Destiny ministry includes a Full Circle ministry modeled by what Annie and Mel experienced in their lives. Currently, approximate-

ly 850 trained volunteers provide on-going ministry in 25 states for 3,711 inmates in 203 detention facilities and for 3,488 women who have been released from prison. This Full Circle Ministry then encourages women back in their communities to help other women in need.

“More than 1 million women in the United States are incarcerated,” Annie said. “Many of these women are young wives and mothers. The majority of them want to change, to make better choices



when they return to society. They need to know that God changes all who ask Him.”

Mel & Annie have a remarkable story of redemption. Both committed their lives to Christ while in prison over 20 years ago. Today, as husband and wife, both transformed by Jesus Christ and given a new destiny, they serve to empower hundreds of thousands of women of faith. Together they are placing a net of God’s grace across our country for women in prison and upon release.

True Love Waits in Africa

NASHVILLE, Jan. 18, 2011 /Christian Newswire/ -- From April to October 2010, more than 70,000 young people in Africa committed to biblical purity through True Love Waits International, bringing the total number of commitments to more than 959,000 since LifeWay Christian Resources launched its strategic initiative there in summer 2007.

During that three-and-a-half-year period, more than 1.6 million African youth heard the True Love Waits message promoting sexual abstinence until marriage. In addition, nearly 46,000 married adults have committed to faithfulness, and more than 41,600 decisions to follow Jesus Christ have been recorded by True Love Waits team members.

In the Philippines, which joined True Love Waits International in 2009, nearly 22,000 students signed commitment cards last year after going through training, with plans in place for aggressively expanding outreach to Filipino youth between ages 15 to 24 beginning this year.

“We are very close to having 1 million young people in Africa make documented commitments to biblical purity through this initiative, which will be an incredible milestone,” said Jimmy Hester, co-founder of True Love Waits.

“In a continent ravaged by AIDS, these African commitments literally have life-and-death consequences. We also are encouraged by the vital work being done throughout the Philippines.”

In Africa, the greatest response to True Love Waits is in the Eastern Cape province of South Africa. In November, True Love Waits International South Africa was approved as a registered organization, and ministry partnerships there are growing, according to Sharon Pumpelly, lead consultant for True Love Waits International.

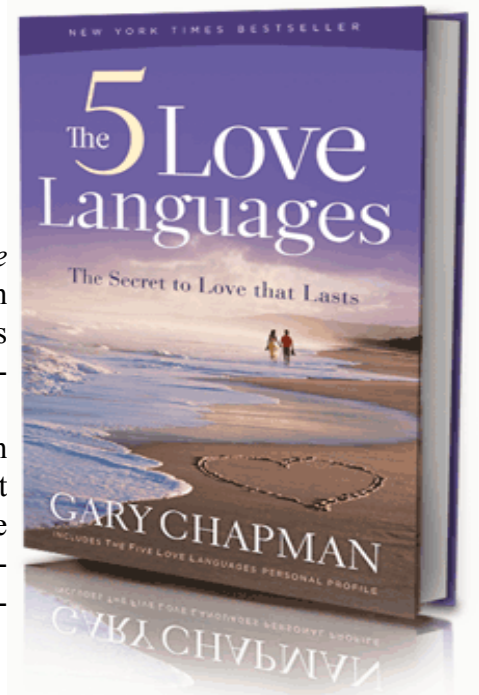
During a presentation in Zambia one girl stood and said, “True Love Waits is a good program. We have benefited and our lives have changed for the better. This program is different from our peer-educating programs because it is bringing salvation [in addition to] promoting sexual purity.” She concluded by making an appeal to True Love Waits team members “to come and train us as presenters.”

“There are many more requests and hopefully, we will be able to meet those,” Pumpelly said. “I believe God is using True Love Waits to reach the next generation for Christ, and that He is raising up people who are hungry and passionate for the message of purity.”

- Quality time – spending undistracted time together.

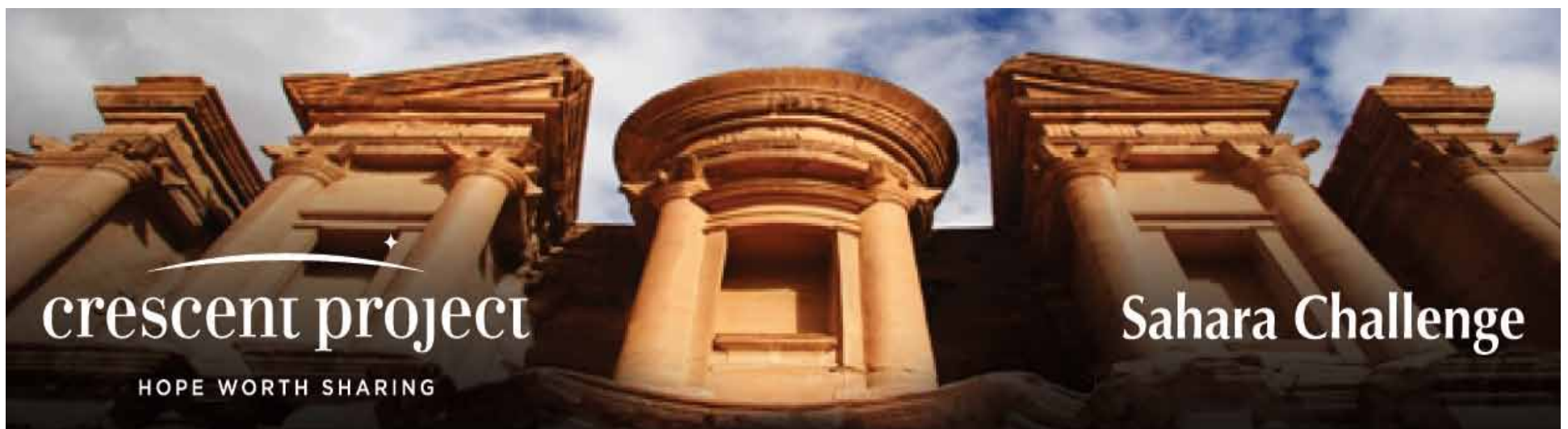
Dr. Chapman says knowing which one you like and which one your partner prefers can dramatically change the direction of how well you get along.

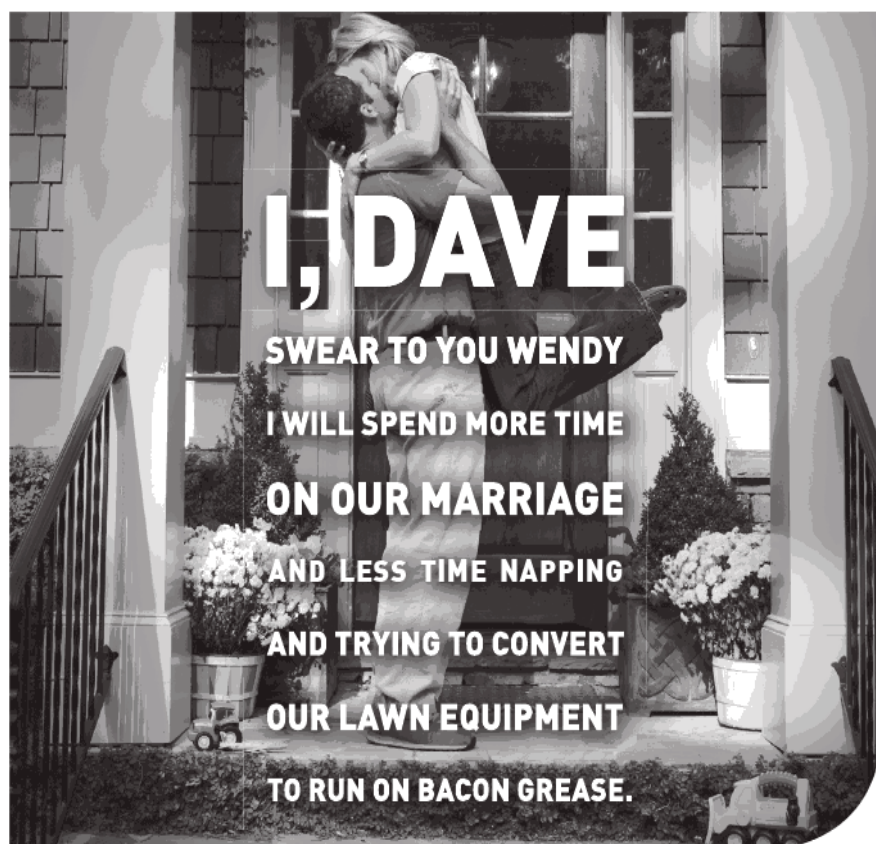

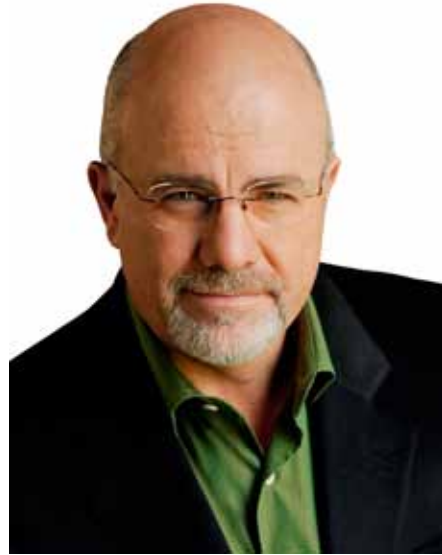
