Scholar: China Notices Link Between Christianity, U.S. Economic Success

WASHINGTON – The officially atheist Chinese government is surprisingly open to Christianity, at least partially, because it sees a link between the faith and economic success, said a sought after scholar who has relations with governments in Asia.

But while the Chinese government is open to Christianity, it also “wants to control Christianity.” Those in authority are very much aware of the Church’s role in bringing down the Berlin Wall and advancing democracy in the Soviet bloc.

“They view Christianity as a belief system that if not controlled will potentially overthrow the government,” said Jeynes during his recent presentation about God, China & Capitalism to the Family Research Council. “But on the other [hand], they see that if you try to oppress Christians it could lead to this explosion as it did in Eastern Europe and [they could] lose control that way. So they want Christianity for the benefits but they want to control it, and that is the balance they are currently trying to achieve.”

The scholar, who has multiple degrees in different disciplines and graduated first in his class at Harvard University, recalled an incident that confirms that China believes Christianity is responsible for the economic prosperity in the U.S. At a Harvard Business Conference years ago, Jeynes recalled top Chinese CEOs one after another asking Harvard scholars not about their talking points but about the relationship between Christianity and economic prosperity in the United States. The Harvard scholars, Jeynes noted, were baffled and did not know how to respond.

China, however, is not the first to make a connection between the Christian faith and economic prosperity. German sociologist and political economist Max Weber wrote the book *The Protestant Ethic and the Spirit of Capitalism* in which he argued that ascetic Protestantism was a major reason behind the rise of capitalism and the economic success of the Western world.

Weber observed that Christianity produces good work ethic and subsequently economic prosperity because it instills a sense of calling and people are more determined and more passionate about their work. The German economist also contended that Christianity promotes honesty, which is necessary to build trust that is essential in economic transactions; encourages people to be their best and to be concerned about their neighbors’ standard of living; and discourages materialism.

Other world religions do not promote economic prosperity like Christianity, contended Weber.

Hinduism believes Hindus are born and not made so there is a large degree of passivity in the religion, Weber observed. In Buddhism, followers

are taught the importance of respect and deference to the point that they support the status quo instead of change. Buddhism also defines “desire” as fundamentally wrong, whereas in Christianity there is a distinction between the desire to glorify God and love people versus selfish and evil desires.

Confucianism, dominant in East Asia, leaves less room for social mobility than Christianity because it emphasizes hierarchy and is more supportive of dominating forms of government than Christianity, Weber noted.

And with Islam, the hierarchical value is even more emphasized. Islam emphasizes compliance rather than freedom of grace that Jesus brings. Christianity’s teaching of God’s love encourages followers to help raise the living standards of others, the economist also observed.

As Weber, other scholars, and now the Chinese government observe, where Christianity is dominant there is economic prosperity.

American Orthodox Rabbi Daniel Lapin, who is a political commentator, noted that 90 percent of scientific discoveries over the last 1,000 years were in nations where Christianity was dominant.

Many in the Chinese government, said Jeynes, believe that Christianity might be China’s best hope to establish morality as well as economic prosperity. “The Chinese believe that if today’s level of immorality persists, sexual immorality especially, then the economic strength of the country cannot continue,” said Jeynes. “So they very quickly want to teach morality, especially to the young before their economy might indeed collapse.

“There are an estimated 100 million Christians in China, about 75 million of whom are in the ‘underground’ church, said Jeynes, and the number of believers is growing by six to seven million a year.”

Professor Jeynes also spent time talking about arrests and persecution of house church Christians in China. He ascribed the crackdown to China being nervous about Christianity and its potential threat to the government’s power.

Christians in China are divided into two groups: those in the independent house church and those in the government-approved registered church. Jeynes revealed that the key difference between the two is whether the Gospel can be shared with minors, those under 18. Christians in registered churches are not allowed to share the Gospel with minors.

Jeynes concluded by saying that the key message he wants to convey is that China is both open to Christianity and nervous about the religion because of the potential problems it could bring to the communist government.

God's Word to Us The Importance of Scripture in Our Lives

Through the ages, God has used a variety of ways to speak to His people. He spoke directly with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, meeting them in the cool of the day (Gen. 3:8). But after they were expelled from the garden because of their disobedience, He turned to other forms of communication. These forms have included direct revelation, dreams and visions, the words of prophets, and others.

Today, God's primary (though not only) form of communication with His people is His written Word, the Bible. God has always placed great value on the written Word. In fact, the Hebrew people were among the first on earth to have an alphabet that allowed them to record documents. The reading of the Torah (the first five books of the Old Testament) has remained a mainstay in synagogue services through the centuries.

The early church received God's counsel through both spoken and written means. The Gospel accounts document the life and words of Jesus, while much of the rest of the New Testament consists of letters from the apostles to various groups of believers.

When we read the Bible today, we can have confidence in its truth for four reasons:

The Bible is God's written record of His works through the ages. It provides substantial evidence of His nature, plan, and purposes so that we can confidently place our faith in Him. Because we have His Word, we are not left to archaeological, historical, or theological guesswork. We can know how to live, make decisions, and worship the Lord, for "it is written" in His Word.

Scripture is divinely inspired. This means that He was involved in every detail that was recorded and written. It is God-breathed, and it is life's

final and ultimate authority. The Bible is the "last word" on issues pertaining to God and His will. No individual, institution, or organization can supersede the authority of Scripture. Likewise, the Bible is God's guide to salvation and wise living. The psalmist wrote, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (119:105). That is exactly why we are admonished not to add to or take away from Scripture (Rev. 22:18, 19). It perfectly expresses the decrees and judgments of almighty God. The Bible is authoritative because it is the truth: "The sum of Your word is truth" (Ps. 119:160).

Through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, the Bible enlightens each individual to recognize personal sin, the need for salvation, and the best possible life course. Without the Bible informing and illumining us, we would be hopelessly unable to know and follow the true and living God. When we say, "Oh, I just wish I could hear God speak to me!" we overlook the fact that He has spoken and is still speaking to us through His Word. He is never silent but is actively involved in every aspect of our lives (Rom. 3:2; Heb. 5:12).

The Bible is also profitable and nourishing. It provides us with an advantage in every department of life—family, business, and personal relationships. It is profitable because it reflects the wisdom of God; and when we abide by its teachings, we learn to live in His peace. As we meditate and consider its truth, our spirits and souls find nourishment. We become established and enriched in every experience of life by living according to God's perspective. The Bible is the Book for everyone. It is revelation, inspiration, and communication of the Person and plan of the eternal, living, and powerful God.

The truth of God's Word applies to all men and women in every culture, in every age, in every walk of life. It is His supernatural manual that alone reveals His mind and ways so that humankind may know and experience His presence and eternal love. Take time to make it a part of your life today.

Christianity and Science Part I

The wedding of Prince William and Kate Middleton recently took place in London. For days, even weeks, the news was full of reports leading up to this grand event. The royal knot was tied in the spectacular Westminster Abbey. Some years ago, my wife and I toured Westminster Abbey where we observed the graves of many notables who are interred within the cathedral. I spotted the gravestone of Charles Darwin within just a few feet of a memorial plaque dedicated to Michael Faraday. Charles Darwin was... well you know who he was. Michael Faraday was a renowned scientist in the 1800's. His studies of magnetism and electricity led to his invention, the electric motor. Michael Faraday was also a dedicated Christian. Most other founding fathers of science such as Copernicus, Kepler, Galileo, Boyle and Pascal were devout Christians contending the biblical virtues of discernment, reflection and testing (I Thess. 5:21). In fact, the enterprise of modern science occurred in the past 350 years mostly within cultures deeply influenced by Christianity. Why was that? Why didn't the scientific revolution begin with the ancient Greeks? They were

smart. Why did cultures of other religions contribute so little to the scientific enterprise which exploded in Western Europe? Christianity's positive influence on science is seldom acknowledged.

Atheist Bertrand Russell, in his controversial 1957 book, *Why I am Not a Christian*, charged Christianity with being an impediment of intellectual progress, especially in science. In coming months I will explore why this is not true, and is in fact an insult, to historic Christianity. I intend to introduce what science is, what the different philosophies and methods of science are, how science is practiced and what conclusions science can draw. First, let's think about the beginnings of science and who the founding fathers were when the scientific revolution began.

In his book, *Without a Doubt*, philosopher and theologian, Kenneth Samples, outlines why science failed to develop in the setting of most worldviews apart from Christianity. He also explains why science flourished amidst the Christian faith. Ancient civilizations like the Mesopotamian, Indian, Chinese and Roman developed some technological achievements but each lacked the foundational ideas about truth, reality and the self-sustaining methods needed to acquire new knowledge. Even the Greeks with their accomplishments in thought, logic and reasoning, failed to develop experimental and testing methods needed to sustain scientific inquiry.

Ancient civilizations and Eastern religions viewed time in cycles, rather than linear such that future events were all predetermined by previous cycles. The cycle of justice, or karma, and the cycle of rebirth, or (*next page*)

reincarnation, both reflect this view which was disabling to the cause-and-effect relationships on which the scientific method relies. In the pagan world, the fatalistic beliefs of astrology that the stars controlled events were particularly crippling to the development of experimental science. Animistic religions taught that natural objects and the heavens were filled with spirits to be appeased or worshipped rather than objects of scientific inquiry. The Hindu concept of maya, the belief that the physical world is not real, could not take science seriously while believing the physical world was an illusion, not even real. The ancient gods were whimsical and unpredictable, not logical and rational. The Islamic deity, Allah, is also somewhat arbitrary in nature. How could science, rooted in reason, reliability and predictability be grounded in religions reflecting the whimsical nature of the gods they worshipped?

For these and other reasons, science was stillborn in the pagan world. Next time we'll explore the philosophical and biblical basis of the Christian faith which served as the foundation that gave birth and nurtured science like no other worldview.

High, president and general counsel of The National Christian Foundation - Heartland, projects there will be a \$20-trillion wealth transfer from the baby boomer generation over the next 20 years.




High explained that, in perspective, if those people would just tithe on this wealth transfer it would be a couple of trillion dollars immediately available, by far enough to complete the Great Commission and properly feed, clothe, provide hygiene, and educate every child in the world. "It's a great opportunity for the Kingdom, and we just have to be aware of the opportunity, he said."

High contends a study conducted by Boston College revealed over 60 to 70 percent of the world's wealth is held by Christians.

"Logically it would stand to reason that if you're a Christian and you run your business by Christian principles, you're going to do well -- you're going to accumulate wealth," he explains. "So there's a lot of it that's out there, it's just that frankly...at times we've hid it or not been willing to speak about generosity as a cause."

In his blog, High writes: "Today, we find that 80% of all giving to churches is done by people 55 years and up. While certainly, stage of life dictates some of this fact, the reality is that these older generations reflect those values. Generation X has not seemed to inherit these values -- at least not yet."

Typically more secular humanitarians like Bill Gates and Warren Buffet have been dominate figures in regards to donor generosity. High says wealthy Christians need to learn how they might leverage their assets for Kingdom-building efforts.

Patent Act Is Dangerous to U.S. Security

More and more dangerous effects of the proposed changes to U.S. patent law¹ keep emerging, especially since the hearings failed to hear from any real inventors. The proposed bill is unconstitutional, an attack on our national security, and an offense against the rule of law.

By awarding patents to the First-to-File an application with the bureaucracy instead of to the First-to-Invent, the proposed bill will deprive inventors of their constitutional property right set forth in Article I, Section 8. U.S. law has always awarded patents to real inventors, not to paper-pushers.

An important letter² sent to House Speaker John Boehner (R-OH) from the 15-member Inventors Network of the Capital Area describes how the proposed patent bill “threatens all individual and corporate Research & Development in America, the backbone of our national defense and economic security.” Here is how this racket will work.

Inventors don’t usually give birth to their inventions like the Greek goddess Athena, who was born fully grown and fully armed out of Zeus’s head. The Wright Brothers required many experiments as they tried wings with different angles before they were ready to patent heavier-than-air flight.

The proposed patent bill will enable Chinese hackers to steal U.S. innovation secrets while they are in development, then file an application with the U.S. Patent Office under First-to-File, and thereby own new U.S. technology instead of merely stealing it. Owning the patents will enable China legally to take away ownership rights and profits from Americans who actually invent new technologies.

Defense technologies would be a prime target of this threat. The First-to-File provision of the Patent Act would become the most effective weapon in China’s arsenal and would threaten our national security in a new and ominously dangerous way.

National security expert Adam Segal testified³

before the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations about the dangers from Chinese cyber espionage, massive theft and piracy, and the policy called “indigenous innovation,” which requires technology transfer in return for market access. He said, “it is clear that the United States must do more to defend itself.”

Since 1870, U.S. law has provided a grace period of one year between the date the invention is disclosed and the date the patent application is submitted. This grace period gives an inventor a year to perfect his invention, to sort out better from inferior features, to raise capital, to gather partners, and to field test the invention before the deadline for filing a patent application.

This grace period is very important to independent inventors, small companies and start-ups. It permits them to delay the costs of filing until the invention is evaluated, a decision is made as to whether it is worth spending money on, and investment capital is raised.

The proposed bill redefines the grace period in a way that is hostile to small inventors and small businesses because it states that any disclosure of the invention by anyone other than the inventor at any time, even within that first year, will bar the real inventor from getting a patent. Weakening the grace period thus poses an enormous risk to the most innovative sectors of our economy.

Another outrage of the proposed patent bill is the provision that subjects to expensive new litigation and retroactively attacks the patent on the check-clearing system which enables banks to return photo-images to their depositors rather than actual canceled checks. This new system saves the banks millions of dollars because they no longer have to truck the checks physically to other banks to be cleared.

This system was created by inventor Claudio Ballard, who received a patent for it, survived post-grant review, and won expensive court battles when he defended his patent against infringement by the banks. After all that, the new patent bill (ignoring the principle of *res judicata* -- the thing is already decided) sets up an unprecedented procedure to overturn the patent office and court decisions, giving the banks another chance to invalidate Ballard’s patent.

A 15-page letter⁴ to Congress from Prof. Richard A. Epstein, the nation’s foremost authority on property rights, explains how the “stacked procedures of Section 18” in the bill are designed to let banks use Ballard’s invention without paying him for it. Epstein, who wrote the book on “Takings” under the Fifth Amendment,

says Ballard deserves just compensation for the use of his patent.

Altogether, the proposed bill, mischievously called “patent reform,” is a bad, dangerous and dishonest bill that must be defeated if we care about respecting the Constitution, inventors’ property rights, and American leadership in innovation.
