The 5 Love Languages

An Interview with Dr. Gary Chapman

Whether you've been married for 50 years or 5 months, *The 5 Love Languages* is a tool couples can use to strengthen their relationships. Written by Dr. Gary Chapman, a marriage counselor with more than 30 years of experience, *The 5 Love Languages* is a guide that helps us express love to our spouses in a "language" they understand.

Dr. Chapman came up with the five love languages after noticing a pattern in the stories his clients were telling him. "I began to see a pattern. Over and over I would hear someone say, 'I feel like my husband or my wife doesn't love me.'" Over time, Dr. Chapman realized that the problem may not be a lack of love, but a lack of expression of love.

"I began to ask what the client meant when they said he or she 'doesn't love me'" Dr. Chapman said. "What did they want? What sort of expression of love were they looking for?" When Dr. Chapman began asking his clients these questions, he was able to take their answers and divide them into five categories.

Those whose love language is Words of Affirmation have the need to hear an expression of love. They like to hear the words "I love you, and this is why..." Conversely, insults or derogatory comments cut deeply and can leave them hurting.

The love language of Quality Time is expressed by doing just that: spending quality time with your loved one without distractions. In a busy world, it is difficult to set time aside to simply be together, but for those who feel love expressed this way, it's crucial to find that time. Lack of attention from a spouse communicates to these people that their spouse is not "loving" them.

Some feel love through Receiving Gifts. As important as gifts are to this group, the gift itself is not as important as the gesture or thoughtfulness put into the gift. The gift makes these people feel special and remembered, and a forgotten birthday will hurt.

If your love language is Acts of Service, you feel love by someone performing a ser-

vice as a favor for you. For example, vacuuming or cleaning up the dirty dishes could be acts of service. You would feel wounded by someone adding to your responsibilities or not keeping a commitment made.

The final love language is Physical Touch. This language is expressed through hugs, pats, holding hands or anything else that makes one feel the presence of another. These people are especially sensitive to the cold shoulder.

After Dr. Chapman categorized the love languages, he was able to help his clients learn how to express love to their spouse in a language they would understand. "I found that all the couples were sincere in their expression of love," Dr. Chapman said. "Each thought they were expressing love to other, but they weren't connecting." By learning to speak each other's "language," Dr. Chapman's clients were able to express the love they felt for their spouse.

However, a love language is not always an easy thing to learn. Dr. Chapman found that most of the time, a couple will have different love languages, and it can be difficult for one to learn the language of the other. "This is particularly difficult if the language was never expressed when they were growing up," Dr. Chapman said. "The language won't come naturally. The good news is all languages can be learned. It's just a matter of understanding how important it is for our spouse to feel loved."

It can even be difficult for couples with the same love language to connect. While they speak the same language, they may speak different "dialects" and have to work out how to express love even in a comfortable language.

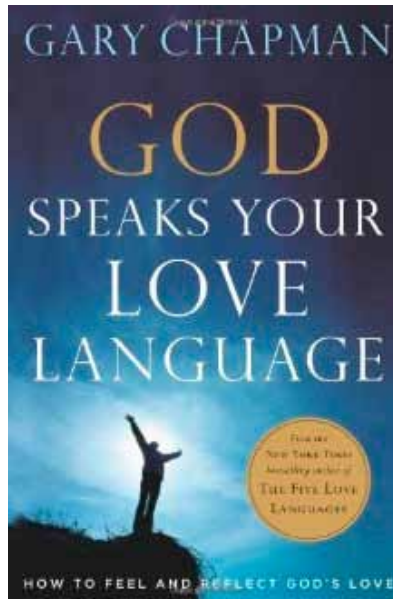
While Dr. Chapman's love languages are based on his experiences as a counselor, he has found that all five of the love languages can be found in scripture. Based on his experience with the five love languages and his faith, he was able to write *God Speaks Your Love Language* and apply his love languages to God's relationship with His people.

"We all feel a deep need to be loved," Dr. Chapman said. "And, the person we would most like to be loved by is our spouse. When we feel loved, the world is light and when we

don't, it feels dark."

Dr. Chapman also noted that these love languages are not strictly for couples. Aside from our relationship with the Lord, the love language concept applies to children. "If we give heavy doses of the five languages to our children, they will learn to give and receive all five languages. And, that makes for the healthiest adults," Dr. Chapman said.

Since the first official "baby boomer" turned 65 on January 1, we are seeing a plethora of articles and reports on how boomers are stepping into what used to be called "retirement."

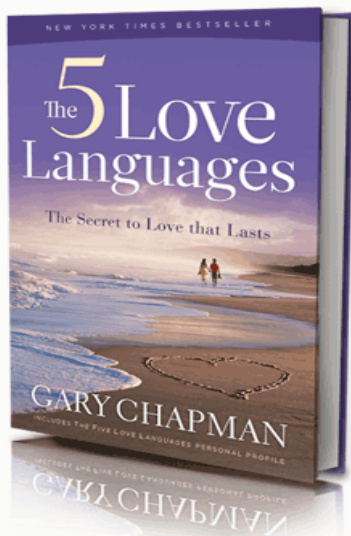

The Priority of Prayer

Do you ever find yourself trying to accomplish goals by yourself? You work and strive, but don't seem to get anywhere. Then, after days, months, or years of trying to succeed, you realize that you're no closer to achieving the objectives you've set. It's not because you didn't try—you did. The problem is you didn't bring your situation to God in prayer.

Years ago, before I finished seminary, the Lord spoke to my heart about an important principle that has helped shape my life and ministry. What He showed me was so crystal clear that I will never forget it: No matter what I hoped to achieve, no matter what He called me to do, I could accomplish it only on my knees. That is, if I wanted God to fulfill His purpose for me, prayer would need to become the central focus of my life.

It was as true then as it is today: Prayer must always be a priority because it is how we invite God to exercise His power in our lives and provide for our needs. However, when we fail to communicate with the Father, we miss out on the blessings of knowing Him better and watching Him work mightily in our lives.

I want to ask you: Is prayer the priority of your life? Do you go to God first whenever you need wisdom, counsel, or direction? If not, I encourage you to start today by getting on your knees before God and making your time with Him a daily discipline. Thank Him for all of the good things He has done for you. Bring your hurts and concerns to Him. Lift up those who need to know His Son Jesus Christ. Be available to the Lord and obey Him in whatever He tells you to do. Because it is during those times of prayer that you will grow most in your intimate relationship with the Father and experience life at its very best.

The truth is, none of us know what the day will bring—but God does. So if you are in constant communication with Him and fight all of your battles on your knees, you will win no matter what challenge or opportunity comes along. Therefore, as Hebrews 4:16 instructs, "Let us draw near with confidence to the throne of grace, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." Reversing Troublesome Trends

Part I

At the annual NW Louisiana Baptist Association meeting not long ago, Dr. Chuck Kelly, president of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary and lifelong evangelist, delivered the main address. He's an exceptionally warm and upbeat person but his message that night had a more somber tone.

Dr. Kelly reported from the battlefield what our denominational status is as we engage in the culture war. "Quite frankly", he said, "We're losing." From nearly a half-million baptisms per year in the mid-1950's, the numbers have declined sharply within a changing culture. Despite intensified efforts, present methods aren't yielding the results they once did. Southern Baptists now have more of everything; churches, money, pastors; everything but more spiritual fruit.

Other denominations are experiencing similar declines. Often in an effort to be seeker-friendly, churches have become more like the culture they wish to convert rather than the other way around. The apologetic thinker, J.P. Moreland, in his book, *The Lost Virtue of Happiness*, points out the rather disturbing qualities in the population at large that also extend into the church. One such trait is passiveness. Our reliance on church officials alone to provide the means and atmosphere of worship, the evangelistic outreach, education of their children and recruitment of new members often prevents effective outreach.

The Christian pollster, George Barna, recently outlined how the U.S. religious environment is "morphing into something new." (<http://www.barna.org/culture-articles/462-six-megathemes-emerge-from-2010>). There were six "megathemes" recently identified:

1. The Christian church is becoming less theologically literate. "What used to be basic, universally-known truths about Christianity are now unknown mysteries to ... especially young adults."
2. Christians are becoming more ingrown and less outreach-oriented. Especially among the young, there is a reluctance to engage in conversation about spiritual matters even with individuals they trust the most.
3. Growing numbers of people are less interested in spiritual principles and more desirous of learning pragmatic solutions for life. The article says, "Faith... takes a back seat to life accomplishments... lifestyle comfort, success, and personal achievements." Church can be taken to be just a self-help organization.
4. Among Christians, interest in participating in community action is escalating. This strikes me as a good trend as it does Barna, "...with the intrinsic joy of blessing others, churches have a window of opportunity to support such action with biblical perspective."
5. The postmodern insistence on tolerance is winning over the Christian church. Barna relates that, "The idea of love has been redefined to mean the absence of conflict and confrontation, as if there are no moral absolutes that are worth fighting for."
6. The influence of Christianity on culture and individual lives is largely invisible. In short, the behaviors of an average church member generally mirror those of his non-Christian neighbors.

This information together with the knowledge that well over 50 percent of our nation's church youth abandon their faith once they leave home is deeply troubling. Not knowing exactly how to react to these trends, continuing the status quo or redoubling current efforts probably isn't going

change the present course. Some evangelical thinkers believe a direction more toward discipleship would be helpful. New approaches toward evangelism might be as diverse as each individual or church group might make it. Apologetics plays a role here within the context of a broader effort. Next month let's explore what some Christian thinkers envision might help reverse the current downward trend and lift up each Christian and church to greater discipleship.

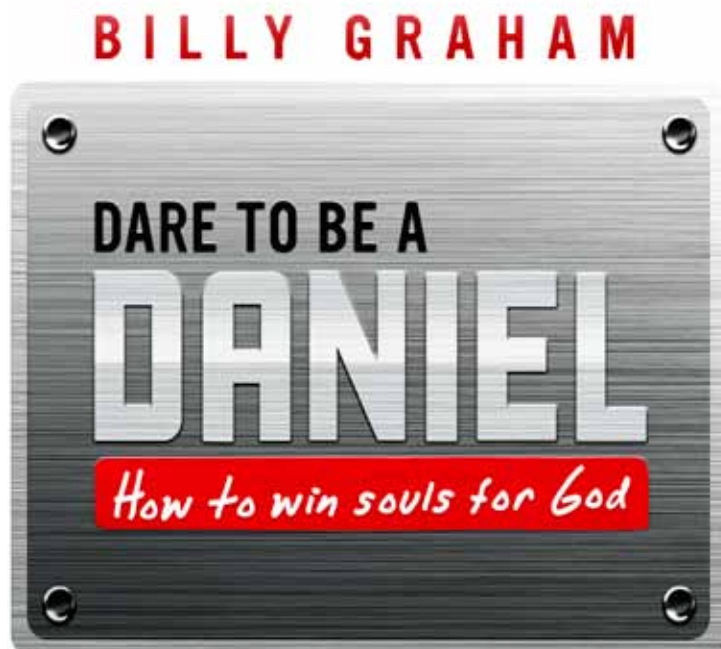
Dare to be a Daniel

Youth learning to share the “Good News”

The youth evangelism ministry Dare to Be a Daniel is a resource for Christian students who want to learn how to share their faith. DaretoBeaDaniel.com, the ministry’s online training site, now offers greater interactivity by offering a Facebook page at www.facebook.com/DaretoBeaDaniel and a Twitter feed at <http://twitter.com/TeamD2BD>.

The site is a valuable information resource for students. In addition

to the training of sharing one’s faith, it hosts engaging videos featuring athletes, popular music artists, and a range of articles on various topics to help students understand and live out their Christian faith. They can also submit their own spiritual questions, which are ad-



ressed with biblical guidance.

Good News for CEF's Good News Clubs

Last month, Child Evangelism Fellowship received the green light to begin setting up Good News Clubs in Bossier Parish schools. The scheduled date is this April.

Child Evangelism Fellowship is a non-denominational organization with the goals of sharing the gospel with children, strengthening them as disciples of Jesus Christ, and helping them become involved in a local church. CEF has chapters throughout the state of Louisiana, and the world, but the organization has been largely inactive in Caddo and Bossier Parish for the past four years. With the approval of Bossier Parish Schools Superintendent D. C. Machen, the organization began contacting local principals for permission to establish weekly after-school clubs in Bossier Parish.

"Our biggest challenge is finding volunteers to step up and get involved," said Randy McKee, state director of CEF Louisiana. CEF provides training for volunteers who want to help with a Good News Club. McKee explained that local churches can also get involved by sponsoring a Good News Club in a nearby school. Sponsoring a club includes providing financial support for the Bible story curriculum, snacks, and weekly prizes such as stickers. It can be as elaborate or simple as the church chooses, McKee said.

Julie Norton is one of the volunteers who received training last month to lead a Good News Club. Norton first discovered CEF in college and was impressed by the visuals and object lessons in the curriculum. The curriculum for the Good News Clubs is written for children ages five through twelve.

Older children can get involved by getting trained to lead the groups.

Norton explained that "there are opportunities to use a variety of gifts and to work within people's different time constraints. The clubs need people to prepare snacks, teach lessons, lead songs or games, and shop for the weekly prizes." She believes the Good News Clubs can impact not only the children who attend, but also the children's families and the entire community. Since CEF is a non-denominational organization, church doctrine is not taught in the Bible lessons. Norton hopes people and churches from several denominations will get involved in the Good News Clubs. "The image of Christ can be changed through the service of the people in our community, as they realize that our service is long-



term and based on love and compassion," Norton said.

CEF conducts background checks on all volunteers and requires parental permission for children to attend. The after-school clubs meet once a week at local schools for an hour and a half. Good News Clubs are allowed to meet in public schools under a 2001 Supreme Court ruling.

Child Evangelism Fellowship in 5 More Countries

MEDIA ADVISORY, Feb. 25, 2011 /Christian Newswire/ --CEF, the largest Christian ministry to children in the world, has established ministry in five more countries bringing its total to 170. According to Harry Robinson, Executive Vice President of International Ministries at CEF, these five include Kosovo, Grenada, one country in the Middle East and two more in Africa.

Rather than sending missionaries, CEF finds nationals eager to go into full-time service, to evangelize children in their own country. In preparation they attend a 12-week training course usually taught by CEF workers from the same region of the world. They are then equipped to go back home and train local volunteers to establish CEF's Good News Clubs. The workers try to partner with local churches. "Our goal is not to compete with the local churches, but to support them," said Mr. Robinson.

CEF International Headquarters in Warrenton, Missouri provides training materials for workers as well as the curriculum. CEF also arranges financial support for many of the full-time workers through its program, Sponsor a National, until local financial support is established. Most of the support for this program comes from the charitable contributions from citizens of the United States or other western countries.

Currently, CEF has 2700 workers around the world, 95% of whom serve in their home countries. "We are committed," said Mr. Robinson, "to establishing a CEF presence in every nation and territory of the world by 2017. By our count, we have 37 to go."

MADISON, WI - Christian ministries with chapters on college and university campuses have agreed to cooperate rather than compete with one another.

InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, Campus Crusade for Christ, The Navigators, Reformed University Fellowship, Baptist Collegiate Ministry and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes are among 17 groups signing a document called the "Chicago Agreement: Unity in Mission" [PDF].

The organizations agree not to criticize or take members from one another, but rather work alongside each other in evangelism and ministry.

InterVarsity spokesman Scott Wilson says there's plenty of room on campuses for Christian ministries that serve students in different ways.
