FCC Chair Supports NRB Rule Idea

Manassas, VA – National Religious Broadcasters applauds FCC Chairman Julius Genachowski for directing the FCC Media Bureau to “move forward” with an important rule change for non-commercial broadcasters. The announcement was made at an FCC field hearing titled: “The Information Needs of Communities.”

For many years, NRB has advocated changing the waiver process for non-commercial broadcasters, in order to allow a non-com to spend up to 1% of its annual on-air time raising funds for third-party non-profit groups recognized under IRS code §501(c)(3). NRB Sr. Vice President and General Counsel, Craig Parshall, gave testimony at the hearing and was present when the announcement was made.

“It remains to be seen exactly what the new rule will look like, and what proceedings if any will be necessary to implement these changes,” said Parshall. “Still, this is a tremendously positive development, and a remarkably logical step forward in energizing non-profit, faith based groups that will now be able to partner on-air with non-commercial Christian stations to raise funds without the burden of outdated rules that have made such partnerships a difficult if not impossible task.”

Worship on Empty

Years ago, I read a definition of worship that to this day rings with clear and magnificent terms.⁽¹⁾ The definition comes from the famed archbishop William Temple: “Worship is the submission of all of our nature to God. It is the quickening of the conscience by his holiness; the nourishment of mind with his truth; the purifying of imagination by his beauty; the opening of the heart to his love; the surrender of will to his purpose—all this gathered up in adoration, the most selfless emotion of which our nature is capable.”

The more I have thought of that definition, the more I am convinced that if worship is practiced with integrity in the community of God’s people, potentially, worship may be the most powerful evangel for this culture of ours. When people come to church, it is generally “beaten down” by the world of deceit, distraction, and demand. There is an extraction of emotional and spiritual energy that brings them on “empty” into the community. Yet that community’s task is to so prepare during the week that it is collectively the instrument of replenishment and fresh energy of soul. Even being in the presence of fellow believers in worship is meant to be a restorer of spiritual hope. We so underestimate the power of a people in one mind and with one commitment. Even a prayer can so touch a hungry heart that it can rescue a sliding foot in a treacherous time.

A few years ago, two or three of my colleagues and I were in a country dominated for decades by Marxism. Before we began our meetings, we were invited to a dinner hosted by some common friends, all of whom were skeptics and, for all practical purposes, atheists. The evening was full of questions, posed principally by a notable theoretical physicist in the country. There were also others who represented different elements of

power within that society. As the night wore on, we got the feeling that the questions had gone on long enough and that we were possibly going in circles.

At that point, I asked if we could have a word of prayer with them, for them, and for the country before we bade them good-bye. There was a silence of consternation, an obvious hesitancy, and then one said, “Of course.” We did just that—we prayed. In this large dining room of historic import to them, with all the memories of secular power plastered within those walls, the prayer brought a sobering silence that we were all in the presence of someone greater than us. When we finished, every eye was moist and nothing was said. They hugged us and thanked us, with emotion written all over their faces. The next day when we met them, one of them said to me, “We did not go back to our rooms last night till it was early morning. In fact, I stayed in my hotel lobby most of the night talking further. Then I went back to my room and gave my life to Jesus Christ.” I firmly believe that it was the prayer that gave them a hint of the taste of what worship is all about. Their hearts had never experienced it.

Over the years I have discovered that praying with people can sometimes do more for them than preaching to them. Prayer draws the heart away from one’s own dependence to leaning on the sovereign God. The burden is often lifted instantly. Prayer is only one aspect of worship, but one that is greatly neglected in the face of people who would be shocked to hear what prayer sounds like when the one praying knows the heart of God. To a person in need, pat answers don’t change the mind; prayer does.

A God Who Gives Why We Can Trust the Lord to Provide for Our Needs

Who do you turn to when you have an unmet need in your life? Sometimes close friends and family members can help in times of hardship, but sometimes it feels as if there is no one to turn to and no one who cares.

Thankfully, we have a God who loves us and wants to meet our needs. From cover to cover, the Bible is filled with His promises to provide for us. Our heavenly Father always loves and remains generous toward His children.

In the first few chapters of Genesis, the Lord gives the first man and woman a perfect garden. In Revelation, we read about our ultimate home—the perfect and eternal heaven He’s created for us. In the sixty-four books in between, we see how God delights in blessing His people. At the very outset of the New Testament, we read how God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, as His ultimate gift of blessing to provide what we need most—forgiveness of sin and restored fellowship with our heavenly Father.

When you limit yourself to your own abilities and resources, you run

out of both commodities very quickly. But when you focus your faith on what God can do, you discover a supply that cannot be measured or depleted. Because, while your means may falter and fail, God’s are one hundred percent inflation and recession-proof.

The very nature of God gives you assurance of His abundant provision. God is:

- Omniscient—The Lord knows your needs more completely than you do, oftentimes before you are even aware of them (Matt. 6:8).
- Omnipotent—The Lord has all power to supply whatever you need (Phil. 4:19).
- Omnipresent—The Lord is at work at all times to provide for you (Ps. 34:7,8).
- Omnibenevolent—The Lord’s love for you is perfect and unconditional, so you can be sure He will always provide the very best (Eph. 2:4–7).

Both the character of God and the testimony of His past performance in providing for His people assure believers of the Lord’s promise to sustain them. Scripture repeatedly points to Him as the faithful source of all life and goodness (Heb. 5:9; James 1:17). Consider just a few examples from the Book of Exodus:

- He made a way for His people to cross the Red Sea and be delivered from their enemies (Ex. 14:1-30).
- He provided manna for the people to eat in the wilderness (Ex. 16:1–21).
- He caused water to gush from a rock to quench the people’s thirst (Ex. 17:1–6).
- He gave His commandments to the people, even when they lacked moral integrity (Ex. 20-31). (Cont. on page 5)

• He provided all the Jews needed to construct the tabernacle (Ex. 12:35-36; 35:21-29).

As the Israelites left Egypt, the only home they had ever known, God provided for all their needs. Everything from protection, basic physical necessities such as food and water, spiritual instruction, and healing was granted to them.

The Lord does the same for us today. Even in our darkest moments, God desires to provide healing, protection, restoration, and life. If you are experiencing a need, do not lose heart. Bring it to the Lord in prayer, remind yourself of His promises by reading them daily, and trust in Him to provide for your every need.

Dead Sea Scrolls Enter the Digital Age

The Dead Sea Scrolls have been upgraded from desert to digital! Access to the Scrolls has long been restricted largely to scholars, but thanks to Google and photographer Ardon Bar-Hama, now anyone can view the the celebrated manuscripts online at the Digital Dead Sea Scrolls project. <http://dss.collections.imj.org.il/>

The Dead Sea Scrolls, discovered by accident in Khirbet Qumran in 1947, contain some of the oldest and best preserved Biblical texts ever found, including the oldest known copy of the book of Isaiah. Until now, they've been kept largely out of the public eye. With this digitization project, they'll finally be available to the public. This video briefly describes the significance of the Scrolls and what this digitization project offers: You can peruse high-resolution images of the Scrolls and even do Google keyword searches of the text. Five of the seven scrolls have been digitized thus far: the Community Rule Scroll, the Commentary on Habakkuk Scroll, the Temple Scroll, the War Scroll, and the Great Isaiah Scroll.

If you're a Bible Gateway user, you're well accustomed to searching and reading digital Bible texts online. However, the incredible photography on display at the Digital Dead Sea Scrolls project adds an almost tactile element to reading the texts—you can practically feel the texture of the ancient parchment as you read. 180 Movie on Abortion Reaches 1 Million Views

The documentary 180, produced by Ray Comfort shows how asking questions about Nazi, Germany can spark a change of heart on the issue of abortion.

Since its official launch in September, the film has been viewed more than 1 million times on YouTube, and the Facebook page associated with the documentary has catapulted to over 22,000 people.

Comfort has had requests to translate 180 into 19 languages, and ten different television networks have plans to air the film. More than 135,000 copies of the DVD have been sold to pro-life groups and individuals. Recently 200,000 copies of the DVD were distributed to 100 different college and university campuses on a single day.

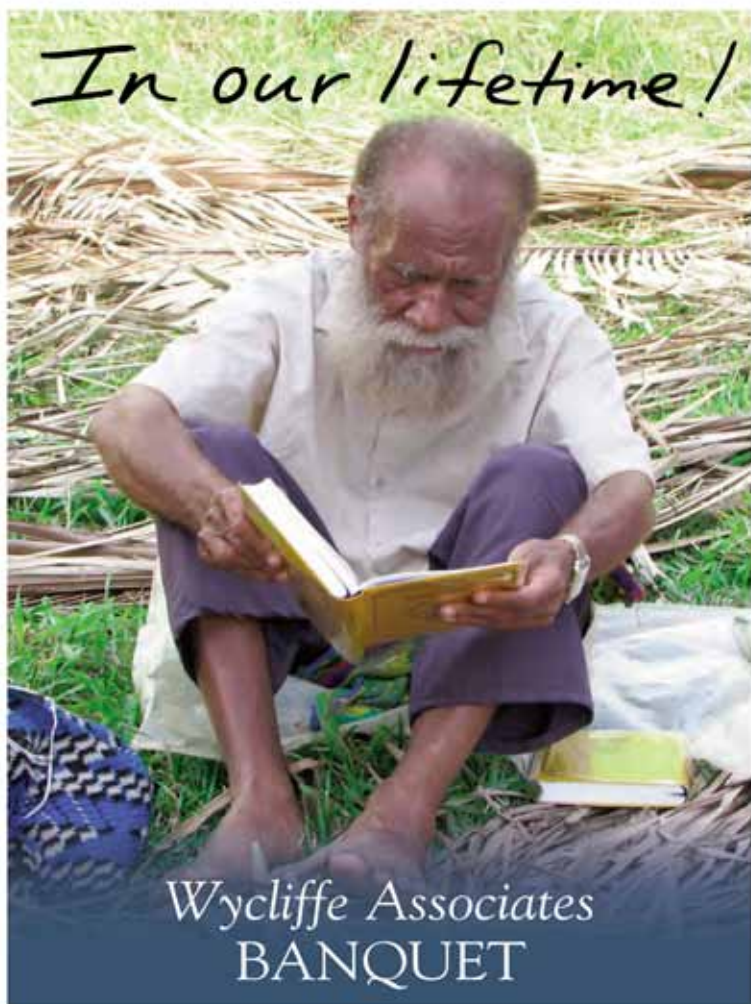

1 SHOE BOX

Use an empty standard size shoe box or similar sized plastic container with a lid. If wrapping, wrap top and bottom separately, but wrapping is not required. **Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.**

2 BOY OR GIRL

Decide if your gift is for a boy or a girl, and the child's age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Print appropriate labels at www.samaritanspurse.org/OCC. Mark the age category on the label, and tape to the box top.

3 FILL WITH GIFTS

Fill the box with a variety of gifts such as: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, writing pads, pens, coloring books and colors, yo-yos, jump ropes, toothbrush and toothpaste, mild bar soap and washcloth, caps, t-shirts, socks, sunglasses, hair clips, hard candy, mints, gum. **Do not include: damaged or breakable (glass) items, out-dated food, or any medications, vitamins, liquids or lotions.
