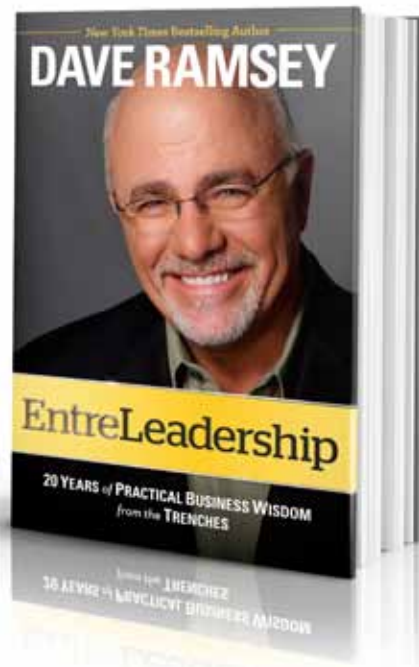

### NRB ON FOX NEWS: MORE SPEECH – NOT VIEWPOINT CENSORSHIP

Manassas, VA – Yesterday, NRB Sr. Vice President & General Counsel Craig Parshall appeared on the FOX News program America's News HQ live from Washington, DC, to discuss last week's release of the first report of the John Milton Project for Religious Free Speech, True Liberty In A New Media Age.

This NRB project concludes an 18-month study, spearheaded by Parshall, that evaluates the practices and policies of new media technology companies to determine the risk of religious viewpoint censorship occurring on their platforms. Specifically, the report highlights the practices of Apple and its iTunes App Store, Google, Facebook, MySpace, and Twitter, as well as Internet service providers AT&T, Comcast and Verizon. “Twitter gets an A+ from us,” said Parshall. “The rest of the new media platforms we studied get a failing grade.”

“[N]ot only Apple, but all of the seven other major new media platforms that [NRB] studied all have policies that forbid what they call ‘hate speech.’ And of course that's not defined, and it's used often as a bludgeon against politically incorrect opinions of a variety of kinds,” said Parshall on FOX. “Steve Jobs, the founder of Apple, made an interesting statement in 1985. He said that these Internet-based communications, of which Apple is one, are to communications in the 21st Century what Bell Telephone – and the invention of the telephone network – was in the 20th Century. [Americans] wouldn't allow the telephone companies to refuse service to our church or house of worship because they don't like the religious beliefs of that church or house of worship, so Apple shouldn't censor those opinions they don't like. We think the solution to ideas that people find reprehensible is more speech, not less.”

### Is Faith Rational?

Almost everyone has heard of Richard Dawkins. He is a world renowned atheist who has written a bestselling book entitled, The God Delusion. That's right! He thinks that God is a delusion, and that anyone who believes in God is "hallucinating".

Now there is a famous Christian philosopher and thinker named William Lane Craig. "Bill" Craig has written some pretty awesome books in the field of apologetics.

What's that? We don't *apologize* for being a Christian! You're absolutely right! An apologist apologizes for nothing! An apologist is someone who defends the validity and truth of Christianity. Dr. Craig has engaged in numerous debates with famous atheists throughout the years, and he always walks away the winner. Why? Because his reasons for believing in the Christian faith are sound, rational, and reasonable; not fantasy! He has even written a very deep book, Reasonable Faith, which is not for the faint of heart. It has profound philosophical rationales for believing that the God of the Bible exists. And, it can be a bit intimidating to the average Joe or Jane.

But, do not despair. If you have wondered how to answer some of the most difficult questions raised by your friends, co-workers, or relatives about the truthfulness of the Christian faith, then there is an answer. Wil-

liam Lane Craig has written an easily understandable book covering the basics of apologetics. It is called On Guard. The local chapter of *Reasons to Believe*, in conjunction with the Shreveport/Bossier Christian Apologetics Network, will be sponsoring a monthly, chapter by chapter study of this book beginning October 17th at 6:30 p.m. at Brookwood Baptist Church. You can't miss the church. It is at the corner of I-49 and Bert Kouns, and there will be signs directing you to the meeting. We will have snacks and spend an hour going over the first chapter.

Chapter One poses the question: "Why should a Christian be concerned about defending the Christian faith through apologetics?" In our study, you will learn just how important the field of apologetics and the defense of the Christian faith are in these turbulent times. People like Richard Dawkins, atheism, and agnosticism are on the rise. People are abandoning a belief in the God of the Bible, because they have never heard the rational, evidential reasons why the Bible is true.

Dr. Craig once challenged Richard Dawkins to a debate, and Dawkins declined. Here is an excerpt from an article citing the opinion of some of Dawkins' fellow atheists regarding his refusal:

... "Some of Prof. Dawkins' contemporaries are not impressed. Dr. Daniel Cane, a philosophy lecturer and fellow atheist, from Worcester College, Oxford, wrote to him urging him to reconsider his refusal to debate the existence of God with Prof. Craig. His colleagues see his refusal to take on the American academic, William Lane Craig, as a 'glaring' failure and a sign he may be losing his nerve."

Wow! Strong criticism from a fellow atheist.

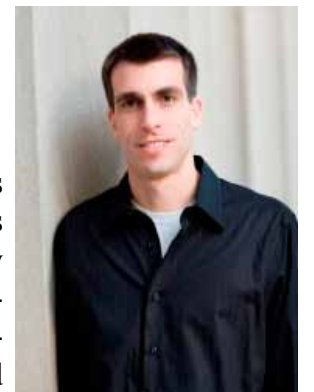

## Denominational Affiliation - Going, Going, Gone?

LifeWay Research says a recent study concludes that of more than 900 American Protestant pastors surveyed, three-quarters (76 percent) personally consider it vitally important to be part of a denomination. Despite the convictions of identity, however, nearly two-thirds of those pastors surveyed (62 percent) believe the importance of identifying with a denomination will decline over the next decade.

While many pastors believe denominational affiliation provides some level of accountability, in recent years, church planters have avoided including a denominational affiliation in the church name in an effort to attract new believers.

"The fact that some of these new churches are just starting without some of that [negative association] allows them to kind of start from scratch and not have to answer questions about something that they weren't responsible for," says Scott McConnell director of LifeWay Research.

According to the study, education and age also affect pastors' opinions of denominations. For example, those with at least a master's degree (62 percent) are more likely to strongly agree that their personal denominational identification is vital than are pastors with a bachelor's degree (41 percent) or some college (48 percent).

And although the age of the pastor does not affect total agreement, the survey indicates pastors 65 and older (62 percent) are more likely to strongly agree that their church considers denominational affiliation vital than are pastors ages 55-64 (48 percent), 45-54 (49 percent), or 18-44 (45 percent).

## Effectively Tackling a Prayer Burden: Praying With a Sense of Spiritual Weight

Have you ever witnessed sorrowful circumstances in someone's life that brought you to your knees? Sometimes it's not our own troubles that weigh most heavily on us, but rather the needs of loved ones that make us cry out to God and long to experience His comfort and direction.

When Nehemiah heard that his people lived in great distress and that the walls of Jerusalem lay in ruins, its gates burned and broken, he responded with prayer:

*I sat down and wept and mourned for days; and I was fasting and praying before the God of heaven. I said, "I beseech You, O LORD God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who preserves the covenant and lovingkindness for those who love Him and keep His commandments, let Your ear now be attentive and Your eyes open to hear the prayer of Your servant which I am praying before You now, day and night." (Neh. 1:4-6)*

Nehemiah was experiencing a prayer burden.

A prayer burden can be defined as a strong motivation to pray for others and to carry the needs of others before God in prayer until He responds.

The Bible has a great deal to say about burdens. We are to bear one another's burdens (Gal. 6:2). Likewise, we are to go the second mile in helping another person (Matt. 5:41). Much of our ability to overcome hardship is derived from developing our ability to carry spiritual burdens in prayer.

A sense of spiritual weight usually accompanies a prayer burden—a heaviness of heart, a spirit of mourning, or a feeling of restlessness. We can't seem to shift ourselves away from a problem or need that has come to our attention.

This is what happened with Nehemiah. He prayed in faith that God would restore Jerusalem, and the Lord answered his prayer by sending him to the city to lead the effort of rebuilding the wall.

James 5:16 promises, "The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much." If you feel burdened to pray for another person, commit yourself to wholehearted intercession, filled with thanksgiving and praise that God will act on that person's behalf (Phil. 4:6, 7). Then listen and obey because the Father may work through you to provide His answer.

And like Nehemiah, you will be greatly blessed when you see God doing mighty things in response to your prayers.

## When Mary Prays...

Mary lives with her husband, Bishar, and their three children in a remote region of South Asia. It's a beautiful land with lush, green hills and clear rivers running through the valleys. People here live a simple, agrarian way of life.

The worship of spirits and the use of witchcraft, both to appease the deities and to take revenge on an enemy, are prominent here. The most rudimentary medical care is hours away. When someone gets mysteriously ill, it is usually due to an incurable disease, black magic, or both. No wonder fear, superstition and despair dominate people's hearts in this beautiful land.

That's why Mary, and God's gift of healing to her, has become a beacon of hope in this area. Mary's life exemplifies gentle humility and wise Biblical discernment. But Mary's life is so effective because she has been there too, in that place of desolation and despair.

After her marriage to Bishar, she began to suffer from terrible abdominal pain. In her search for relief, she visited temples and consulted with priests, visited hospitals and mosques, but nothing changed. Mary and Bishar later learned that angry relatives had placed a curse on her. Mary explained, "I was not able to walk or eat anything. I suffered a lot."

One night, as she was planning her suicide, she had a vision. A light appeared in her room, and she saw Someone standing in the light. "My name is Jesus," He told her. "I am the Lord God, and I will completely heal you; and you must testify of these things wherever you go."

Mary had considered Jesus to be one of many other gods. But realizing that He was the one true God, she gave her life to Him at that moment. "That night I really experienced the power of God," she said. "The next day when I got up, I realized that the pain was gone and that there was not any sickness in my body."

As Mary began to spend time in prayer, once again the Lord spoke to her, instructing her to share the Good News wherever she went and to pray for the sick.

"I slowly started my work," Mary recalls. "I was not able to read a Bible because I was illiterate, but slowly I learned. And through the Word of God, the Spirit increased my faith and gave me the power to go and tell about Jesus. I would go and visit people and share how Jesus healed me. Everybody knew how much I suffered, so my testimony strongly helped people to understand about the living Jesus." Through Mary's prayers for the sick, the Lord has healed and transformed their lives. Throughout the region, word has spread about her ministry.

Mary and her husband Bishar both came to know the Lord and heard His call to ministry at about the same time. Today, Bishar is a Gospel for Asia-supported pastor. "God called us as a family," Bishar says. "And I am very thankful to the Lord for what He is doing."

In their area there is a prayer center. It is the closest thing to a hospital in this region of South Asia; especially for people who have little or no funds for medical needs. It is a simple two-room, mud-walled building with a tin roof; enough for shelter and rest as people wait on God and grow in their faith and understanding. Mary visits every morning to pray with each person, to clean or dress any wounds and to lead Bible study.



One mother brought her little nine-year-old boy to the center with a spine so distorted that he could not walk or even sit, and now he is nearly well. A man who has set up his sleeping mat in one corner is recovering from a demonic attack. He wandered the region as a madman for two years until Christians brought him to Mary. A wounded official with access to the best doctors and hospitals found only the recommendation of amputation after developing a raging infection. Hearing of Mary, his family asked her to pray for him. The begrudging but desperate man finally agreed to let her do so. The very next day after her intercession he noticed a difference. Mary fasted for a week and continued to pray. His pain diminished and his faith increased. After a month, he was completely healed, and decided to follow Jesus.

The men, women and children who experience physical restoration are freed from fear and desolation. They have encountered the God of the universe, who cared enough to touch them personally. As they return to their villages and the official to his duties, they share how this God can do the same for anyone.

Villages that were once resistant to the Good News are now receptive. Missionaries who once faced hostility are now welcome. And fellowships of new believers are springing up in areas that had never heard the name of Jesus before.

Ever since God healed, saved, and called her, Mary has been firmly convinced that the gift she has from God is for a far greater purpose than simply the relief of physical healing.

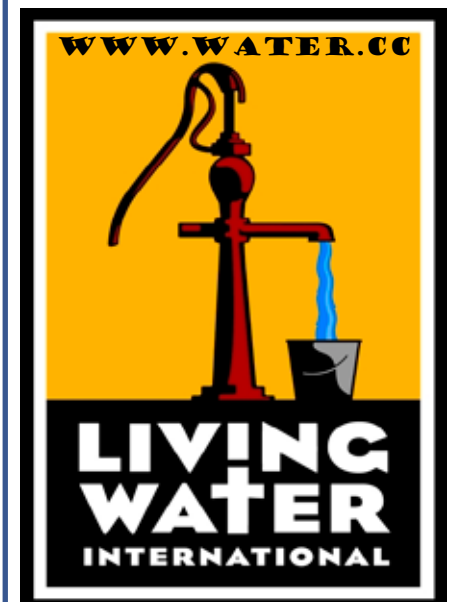
In order to further its ministry, this non-profit 501(c)3 recently announced a new partnership with MeSoap. The partnership is beginning in Sierra Leone, which has the second-highest infant mortality rate in the world.

MeSoap adheres to a “one for one” model, yet rather than donating exactly one bar of soap for every bar sold, MeSoap pledges to donate the equivalent dollar amount to its field partners to be used in funding not only soap, but educational programs, and other sanitation and hygiene supplies, depending on community need. The soap bought will be purchased within the community that they are working with in order to assist the local economy. The MeSoap team will be going out into the field and delivering actual MeSoap bars as often as possible, but the reality of productive giving and ongoing care in saving lives isn’t quite that straightforward.

In 1999 I co-founded a VC backed internet company that grew in excess of \$50mm in annual revenues. Life was good in Buffalo. Then I left that company in 2006 and started another venture. This time it didn’t go so well, and I lost everything. In this time, I moved my family to sunny California with plans to start another company but just couldn’t pinpoint what I wanted to do... plus I had no money.

My life was radically changed there when I started attending Revival Christian Fellowship and found my faith. Money no longer ruled my life, and for the first time in a long time I felt free and at peace. I still had an entrepreneurial spirit but a new desire to concentrate on helping “the least of these” rather than myself. Through the development of some ideas I met up with Garth Humbert, who shared my passion for helping people, good design and start-ups. We surprisingly discovered that the biggest need in our world is access to clean water and soap, and that these items could save and improve the lives of more people than medicines, doctors or peace treaties. Something so simple. It still amazes me.

My two favorite companies are CharityWater and Tom’s Shoes. Their leaders have inspired me. Ultimately, MeSoap was born.

### **How to Wash *Your* Hands**

It’s generally best to wash your hands with soap and water.

- Wet your hands with running water.
- Apply liquid, bar or powder soap.
- Lather well.
- Rub your hands vigorously for at least 20 seconds. Remember to scrub all surfaces, including the backs of your hands, wrists, between your fingers and under your fingernails.
- Rinse well.
- Dry your hands with a clean or disposable towel or air dryer.
- If possible, use your towel to turn off the faucet.

Keep in mind that antibacterial soap is no more effective at killing germs than is regular soap. Using antibacterial soap may even lead to the development of bacteria that are resistant to the product’s antimicrobial agents — making it harder to kill these germs in the future.
