

So now what's the latest on Common Core?

Common Core's meltdown continues at both the state and federal level.

Last week, the Senate passed Senator David Vitter's budget amendment that prohibits the federal government from mandating states to adopt Common Core standards or assessments. Additionally, this amendment also revises current No Child Left Behind (NCLB) waiver conditions to prohibit the loss of federal funding for states that remove themselves from the Common Core Initiative. This is a hopeful smoke signal, but despite multiple lawsuits, Louisiana is still using the Common Core standards, tests and data collection that goes with it.

Undermining Senator Vitter's noble efforts in Washington are the moves for reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) that dished out dollars through NCLB and then Race to the Top. HR 5, that was predicted to pass overwhelmingly by the House was set back on the shelf over two weeks ago because grassroots activists melted down the phone lines to Washington to protest ESEA reauthorization. The Senate version was moved out of committee, then sent for adjustments that would find bipartisan support, and is now set to be back on the table on April 13th, the first day of the 2015 Louisiana Legislative session!

Thus far only Oklahoma has been successful in removing itself from the CC Initiative. Other states have pulled out of the PARCC testing consortium, but Pearson who holds the PARCC testing contract, is allowing states to lease the test questions through a third party contractor. Some politicians think this gives them cover to say they are not supporting Common Core by getting out of PARCC. At the end of the day, nothing has changed and students remain trapped in the PARCC maze.

Meanwhile, Governor Jindal is working to pass legislation that will remove the state from the Common Core Initiative while establishing Louisiana standards and assessments that we own and control. Never mind that the Republican Speaker has appointed two Democrats to the House Education Committee who are pro Common Core and vocal about it. The Governor has promised every Louisiana legislator will have an opportunity to voice their position on Common Core. Then voters will head to the ballot box in the fall to elect every seat in the House and Senate and eight members of BESE. The political reality will complete the meltdown. Finally, the professional educrats and politicians will be forced to listen to the parents and the people!

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

Secrets of the Koran Current Wave of Islamic Terrorism Examined Part Two Stephen R. Patton, M.D.

Recently in Yemen, several terrorists walked into mosques wearing concealed suicide vests and blew themselves up along with scores of Muslim worshippers. Within hours, ISIS officials claimed credit praising Allah and the brave men who carried out the violence.

Last month I discussed parts of the Koran as serving to justify such violent action and drawing example from the historical actions of Mohammed. Don Richardson's book, Secrets of the Koran, served as the source of this analysis.

Simply stated, in Islam the world is divided into two dominions; the House of Islam (the Dar al-Islam) and the House of War (Dar al-harb). In the former, a Muslim government rules by Islamic law. In the latter a perpetual state of war, or Jihad, exists until the entire world is subjugated under Islamic rule, a caliphate or world dominion under a caliph, a successor of Mohammed.

In Secrets of the Koran, Don Richardson points out the rapid rise of Islamic schools, or madrassas, throughout the Islamic world. Many of them exist to promote an extreme form of Islam called Wahhabism with Saudi Arabian origin and heavy past and present funding. This particular brand of Islam denounces even moderate Muslims, both Sunni and Shia as apostates and has paved the way for the current path of death and destruction. Groups like ISIS are violently purging "unfaithful" Muslims as well as infidels, like Christians, from their midst by prosecuting a holy war to re-establish a "pure" form of Islam and impose harsh Sharia Law on all they subdue. You can witness their sobering methods by tuning on the evening news.

Since the 1970's, massive petroleum profits have helped countries in the Middle East to export, finance and teach this particular interpretation of Islam throughout the Muslim world. In some countries, like Pakistan and Indonesia, thousands of schools, or madrassas, have been established. In them, boys primarily from impoverished circumstances are taken in, excluded from normal society and knowledge about the rest of the world. With heavy monetary subsidy from the Saudis and others, they are housed, fed and taught a curriculum of "fundamental" Islam emphasizing violent means and justification for such actions. They are taught that they are the "true believers". The young men graduating from these schools who die in the cause of jihad are promised paradise where seventy virgins await. Whether labelled as Al-qaeda, Hezbollah or ISIS, they all have a common ideological foundation. We are now witnessing with horror the implementation of a well-funded movement with deep roots, fertile ground and imperial goals.

In Pakistan and Indonesia alone there are tens of thousands of madrassas many of which are teaching just this one brand of Islam and rejecting the teaching of history, mathematics, science and other subjects. Their students number in the tens of millions. Richardson labels this part of the world as a ticking time bomb with the potential to explode and unleash its graduates "like a swarm of locusts" on the rest of the world.

But why write an apologetics column about this? It's because God loves Muslims and wishes for them to be drawn to himself through the sacrifice of Jesus and worship Him in spirit and truth. (2 Pet. 3:9) Only through understanding the times can we be prepared to minister to them effectively and explain that violence is not the way but only love and the truth of the gospel can bring us to salvation. Next time perhaps we can explore how this might be accomplished.

Massive Scripture distribution under way in Egypt following ISIS killings Andrea Rhodes

The distribution of 1.65 million Scripture leaflets designed to bring comfort to a nation in mourning is well under way across Egypt, following the murder of 21 young Egyptian Christians by ISIS in Libya three weeks ago. "This is by far the most widely distributed Christian leaflet in Egypt's history," notes Ramez Atallah, General Director of the Bible Society of Egypt, which created the leaflet the day after the video of the killing was released.

Distribution of the leaflet, entitled 'Two Rows By the Sea', began just two days later, on Wednesday, February 18, at Pope Tawadros' weekly Bible study in the Coptic Cathedral in Cairo. The leaflets were rapidly made available in churches across the country.

Nationwide distress - "Because of the nationwide distress over these brutal assassinations, and because the leaflet was so quickly available, Christians have been distributing it everywhere – streets, shops, buses, and trains," says Mr Atallah. "And it's reaching people from all walks of life: we have heard many cases of Christians receiving it through Muslim friends and neighbours who got it first!"

The leaflet features a poem about the faith of the young men, and contains a collection of five Scripture passages. "We wanted to provide something that would comfort the grieving," notes Mr Atallah. "People are in

despair about what happened. They're feeling lost and have so many questions about why those young men were killed. And while there are no easy answers, the Bible reminds us that there will be times of trial but that God's love for us is everlasting.

"1 Peter 4:12, for instance, says, 'Dear friends, do not be surprised at the painful train you are suffering.' It goes onto say in verse 14, 'If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you."

United Christians and Muslims - Mr Atallah says that the killing of the young men has united Christians and Muslims in the troubled country. "ISIS hoped that by showing the video of the murder, they would foment sectarian strife in Egypt between Christians and Muslims, but it has had the opposite effect. Christians have responded by sorrowfully calling out to God, and Muslims have shown love and care towards them.

"Please join us in praying that during this period of sadness and unprecedented openness God will use this Scripture leaflet to comfort and challenge many Egyptians."





Ryan Galorport: Bible Translator

IN 1981, Diola married Ryan Galorport, a member of the Translators Association of the Philippines (TAP), a ministry closely linked with Wycliffe Bible Translators. They were assigned to the Central Subanens in Zamboanga, Philippines. It took over an hour to fly by helioplane into the first village. From there, they hiked five hours—crossing rivers and mountains.

The Galorports lived with the Central Subanens for one-and-a-half years, teaching literacy, com-

munity health, and development. About to see the fruit of their labor, they were forced to leave the area by local dissidents. "After so much work, this decision brought countless tears."

Next, in 1989, Ryan and Diolia answered the challenge to serve the Northern Subanens. This people group is animistic, one of five Subanen ethnic groups, with an estimated population of 85,000. They are river dwellers and peace-loving people. In spite of insurgency trouble and flooded rivers God always protected them from danger.

During the early years of the Galorport's ministry with the Northern Subanens, they met Gloria, a middle aged villager. "Do you have the Book?"

she inquired. "What book is that?" Ryan replied.

Gloria said, "Today, I'm supposed to be in a distant village, celebrating a big Subanen feast. But last night an old man in my dreams told me that I have to ask you for the Book that has the truth and shows the way to Heaven."

"You mean the Bible that we are translating into your language?" Ryan answered.

Gloria again asked, "May I have it?" Ryan carefully explained how long it may take to complete the Book because of the process involved in translating it. Gloria then explained how she wanted to help. As she faded from view, Ryan and Diolia took a deep breath, praying, "Lord, help us finish the New Testament quickly. One day we will come back to this village and present the precious New Testament to Gloria and to the Northern Subanen people."


In 2012, by the grace of God, the New Testament was completed and the dedication was joyfully held with the Northern Subanens. Now it can be used in churches, homes and schools. Gloria and thousands of others now have the Word of God in their own language. But, the work is not yet completed, for Ryan along with 40 Northern Subanens are making great progress in completing the Old Testament.

April 15 Josh McDowell Releases Most Convincing Apologetic Book, Reveals Rare Artifacts Confirming Ancient Biblical Texts

Since his radical conversion to Christianity in college, Josh has been a walking testimony of how ancient fragments of Scripture powerfully drew him to God. Those ancient manuscripts and the evidence of their reliability brought him to the conclusion that they were not only true and reli-

able, but also that Christ was who he said he was—the Son of God who came to save the world.

"Each book, each page and each paragraph of Scripture was written through the lens of its human spokesmen, yet it still communicates the *exact* message God wants us to receive," McDowell said. "His God-breathed words were supernaturally guided through his selected human instruments so that his truth would be vivid and relevant to our lives. With God as the author and men as the writers, the sixty-six books of the Bible can rightly be called the Word of God."

In December of 2013, McDowell assembled a team of international scholars, to identify Egyptian and other ancient artifacts -- dating back as far as 1,600 and 2,200 years -- in hopes of finding fragments of ancient scriptural writings. Ancient manuscript and language experts extracted

and initially analyzed and identified the papyri within these artifacts as six New Testament passages and one from the Old Testament—seven treasures in all! While all the manuscripts

are yet unpublished and must be further

scrutinized to determine the exact content and more precise dating, we do know what passages these are from—Mark 15, John 14, Matthew 6 and 7, 1 John 2, Galatians 4 and Jeremiah 33.

In the U.S., skepticism about the truth of the Bible continues to rise according to a 2014 Barna Group study. It found the number of those who are skeptical or agnostic - who believe that the Bible is "just another book of teachings containing stories and advice"—has nearly doubled from 10% to 19% in just three years.

"My hope is that this *God-Breathed* book will help people realize not only that the word of God is true, but also that it is alive and powerful. I equally want people to be convinced they can trust the Bible because the evidence is so incredible," Josh said. He has also launched the Heroic Truth Experience, a live speaking tour to showcase his ministry's museum-quality biblical artifacts as irrefutable evidence of the Bible's reliability.

In 1961, Josh joined the staff of Campus Crusade for Christ International. Not long after, he started the Josh McDowell Ministry to reach young people worldwide with the truth and love of Jesus. Well known as an articulate speaker, Josh has addressed more than 25 million people, giving over 27,000 talks in 125 countries. Josh has authored or co-authored 142 books in over one hundred languages including, More Than a Carpenter –over 27 million copies distributed—and New Evidence That Demands a Verdict –named one of the twentieth century's top 40 books.
