What Are Policemen Made Of?

Don't credit me with the mongrel prose: it has many parents-at least 420,000 of them: Policemen.

A Policeman is a composite of what all men are, mingling of a saint and sinner, dust and deity.

Gulled statistics wave the fan over the stinkers, underscore instances of dishonesty and brutality because they are "new". What they really mean is that they are exceptional, unusual, not commonplace.

Buried under the frost is the fact: Less than one-half of one percent of policemen misfit the uniform. That's a better average than you'd find among clergy!

What is a policeman made of? He, of all men, is once the most needed and the most unwanted. He's a strangely nameless creature who is "sir" to his face and "fuzz" to his back

He must be such a diplomat that he can settle differences between individuals so that each will think he won.

But...If the policeman is neat, he's conceited; if he's careless, he's a bum. If he's pleasant, he's flirting; if not, he's a grouch.

He must make an instant decision which would require months for a lawyer to make.

But...If he hurries, he's careless; if he's deliberate, he's lazy. He must be first to an accident and infallible with his diagnosis. He must be able to start breathing, stop bleeding, tie splints and, above all, be sure the victim goes home without a limp. Or expect to be sued.

The police officer must know every gun, draw on the run, and hit where it doesn't hurt. He must be able to whip two men twice his size and half his age without damaging his uniform and without being "brutal". If you hit him, he's a coward. If he hits you, he's a bully.

A policeman must know everything-and not tell. He must know where all the sin is and not partake.

A policeman must, from a single strand of hair, be able to describe the crime, the weapon and the criminal- and tell you where the criminal is hiding.

But...If he catches the criminal, he's lucky; if he doesn't, he's a dunce. If he gets promoted, he has political pull; if he doesn't, he's a dullard. The

policeman must chase a bum lead to a dead-end, stake out ten nights to tag one witness who saw it happen-but refused to remember.

The policeman must be a minister, a social worker, a diplomat, a tough guy and a gentleman.

And, of course, he'd have to be genius....For he will have to feed a family on a policeman's salary.

Paul Harvey, 1918 – 2009, was a conservative American and long-time radio broadcaster for the ABC Radio Networks. He was famous for, among other things, his broadcast "The Rest of the Story." His father, a Tulsa, OK police officer, was killed in the line of duty when Harvey was 3 years old.

Show Your Support for Law Enforcement Rep. Mike Johnson

Like you, Kelly and I and our family have been in prayer for the families of those heroic law enforcement officers who have recently fallen in the line of duty. In these tragic situations, the grief of those officers' families is often accompanied by sudden financial hardships as the survivors try to make ends meet.

Thanks to the Legislature's unanimous passage of my bill this spring (Act 678), I'm grateful that Louisiana residents will have a chance this fall to help families in these situations in a substantial way.

When you go to the ballot this fall, be sure to vote in favor of Act 678-which proposes a state constitutional amendment to allow the surviving spouses of these fallen heroes to be exempt from paying annual property taxes on the family's home after they suffer such a loss. The amendment will cover all military personnel, law enforcement officers, and fire protection officers who lose their lives in the line of duty.

As the son of a firefighter who was critically burned and permanently disabled in the line of duty, I know firsthand some of the heartache and challenges that lie ahead for these families. Certainly, when a hero pays the ultimate price in service to their country and their community, they have paid enough already.

Thank you for joining us in supporting those who serve and protect us all.

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

Understanding Islam (Part III) Differences between Christianity and Islam ^{by} Stephen R. Patton, M.D.

In two prior articles I introduced Islam, its major beliefs and practices, and a little about its founder, Muhammad. I explored something about the history of Islam and defined mainstream Islam, Islamism and jihadist beliefs. It's the latter two Islamic positions that dominate the news cycle and make headlines. But the majority of Muslims in the world today are not trying to destroy the West or dominate the world. Peace loving Muslims, numbering perhaps one and a half billion, make up the mainstream. Remember, most of the violence suffered at the hands of ISIS has been committed against other Muslims. Perhaps those who are now fleeing from these unspeakable atrocities committed in the name of Muhammad might be willing to reconsider their faith. They might be more receptive to gentle persuasion about a loving God and salvation through Isa al-Masih (the Muslim name for Jesus).

There has been public debate about immigration of Muslims into our country but my discussion only seeks to recognize that many Muslims are already living here and need to encounter the risen Lord. This is for good reason; God loves them (Jn. 3:16) and so must we (Matt. 28:19,20). It is up to us to understand Islam and lovingly engage Muslims in our community with the gospel. Knowing some basics about Islam, let's consider what most Muslims believe about Christianity and their own faith which separates them from the truth and hinders them from accepting the gospel.

In the book *Encountering the World of Islam*, Edward F. Hoskins suggests several answers to common questions Muslims pose to Christians. These responses are designed to avoid a shouting match (Prov 15:1).

Q: What do you think about Muhammad?

A: "I don't believe exactly what you believe about him. I do respect him. Politically, he was a reformer, a statesman and a national leader. Religiously, he called idolatrous people back to worship the One True God. He also said many positive things about my Lord Jesus. ...each of these things makes him worthy of my respect."

Q: What do you think about the Qur'an?

A: "I don't believe exactly what you believe about the Qur'an...I appreci-

ate it because of the many wonderful and beautiful things it says about my Lord, Messiah Jesus."

Q: Was Muhammad prophesied in the Bible? (Gen. 12:1-3) (Gen 12:20) (Deut. 18:18)

A: I do believe that God, in the Bible, prophesied about a very special prophet...A few of the prophesies could be confused with Muhammad. However, there are more than three hundred prophesies, which are very specific...I believe there is only one person who could (and did) fulfill each of them--the Messiah, Jesus, son of Mary.

Another roadblock to salvation Muslims have is their view of sin. Again, in Encountering the World of Islam, Bruce McDowell and Anees Zaka point out that the holiness of God and the sinfulness of men are "two vital omissions in the Qur'anic revelation." And if either of them is overlooked or diminished, "the need for salvation by grace disappears, and a religion of good works becomes plausible." Patrick O. Cate further points out, "believing that Christ is God and the Son of God, and believing in the trinity does not make a person a Christian. A person has to believe he is a sinner, confess his sin, repent, and believe that Christ died on a cross for his sin...Muslims do not seriously consider themselves sinners who are an affront to a holy God. Therefore they could care less about a Savior who delivers them from their sin."

In response to this, he offers a simple and useful visual aid when explaining the importance of sin to a Muslim: If I offer some tea (good works) to a Muslim, he would happily drink it. If I then poisoned the tea by adding a small amount of Drano (sin), the tea would become completely unacceptable. If I then add more tea to the cup, no matter how much, it would still remain completely unacceptable to drink because of the poison. In the same way, each of us is completely unacceptable because of our sin to a perfect and holy God. Adam broke fellowship with God and was expelled from the garden because of a single sin. Since we are all sinners (Rom. 3:23), no matter how good a life we live, there is no earning our way back to fellowship with God (Eph. 2: 8,9). Only a savior can remove the poisonous sin that forever separates us from our maker (John 14:6).

Other objections to the Christian faith revolve around the authenticity of the Bible, the Christian view of God as a trinity, and the deity of Jesus. Next time we will discuss these areas.


