Let the Women Come to Me

Rejecting Shortcuts to Intimacy with Jesus

Muslim women are encouraged to memorize the Quran, but they are never encouraged to understand it. One Yemeni friend innocently asked her uncle, who happened to be an imam (a Muslim leader), about something written in the Quran and received a fist in her jaw. She was only ten years old.

Another dear friend of mine says she desperately wanted to know Allah growing up but that the more religious she became — saying her prayers five times a day, covering every strand of hair and skin —the more elusive he became. Muslim women are told to obey Allah, but must not seek to know him personally. Islam is a hard religion for those women who want to understand and know their god.

But the God of the Bible is different. He wants women to understand his word. He wants women to personally know and delight in him as their God. Christians don't just memorize and obey; they "rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation" (Romans 5:11). The Christian God is not a demanding taskmaster. He is glorified when we are satisfied in *relationship* with him.

Jesus, a Lord of Women

Christian bookstores and Amazon are flooded with Christian bestsellers for women, books that promise to divulge the secrets to more intimacy with God. We can read about hearing the voice of God or how to recognize when Jesus is speaking to us. These books are tempting. We're enticed by supposed shortcuts to intimacy with our Creator. We each want a personal word from him. So, how do we enter into his presence? How do we, women, experience joy in fellowship with God?

A woman in first century Palestine knew the answer to this question: Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:38) What's so striking about the exchange between Jesus, Mary, and Martha is that Martha was the one doing what was expected. It was Mary who seemed to deserve a rebuke. She was the one acting out of step with the culture of the day.

Women were poorly regarded in first century Jewish culture. There was a Jewish saying: "Happy is he whose children are male, but alas for him whose children are female." Rabbis had a special disdain for women when it came to religious matters. Women were not worthy of even being taught the sacred Scriptures. One rabbinic saying was, "Sooner let the words of the law be burned than delivered to women."

But that wasn't Jesus's attitude toward women.

To a woman who had repented of sexual immorality he compassionately said, "Your sins are forgiven" (Luke 7:48). To a woman who had been suffering from bleeding for twelve years he lovingly said, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace" (Luke 8:48). To a little girl who

had been dead, he took her by the hand and said, "Little girl, I say to you, arise" (Mark 5:41). And Mary was commended for sitting at his feet, listening to his teaching.

This is why women followed Jesus (Mark 15:41). This is why women financed his ministry (Luke 8:3). This is why women loved him enough to take care of his precious body at the tomb (Mark 16:1). Because he first loved them.

Choose What Cannot Be Taken Away

Sometimes I cringe when I read the account of Mary and Martha. I am all too often just like Martha. I'm anxious about getting everything done. I've got emails to return, clothes to wash, meals to fix — and that's when no guests are coming for dinner. But Mary sits at the feet of Jesus and listens to his teaching. She prioritizes him over completing her tasks. She desires him more than pleasing or impressing others with a good meal and clean house. Mary treasures Jesus as the one thing necessary.

Where do women find Jesus today? Do we need to uncover some mystery to a deeper, more personal relationship with him? Do we need our heartstrings pulled or a particular aesthetic experience? No. Jesus has already given us all we need for intimacy with him. Every time we open our Bible, we sit at Jesus's feet. All of Scripture bears witness about him (John 5:39). God's word is the good portion that we can hide in our hearts, never to be taken away.

The psalmist says, "The Lord is my chosen portion" and, "In your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore" (Psalm 16:5, 11). This is what Mary knew. She was sitting at Jesus's feet for joy! Do you sit at Jesus's feet in the morning? Do you choose him over your email inbox and daily tasks to do? Do you choose the one who will give you fullness of joy and pleasures forevermore?

Bibles aren't just for memorizing. They don't just tell us how to obey. God actually speaks to us through the Bible. Hear from him, and you will experience truer, deeper intimacy and joy with him.

The New Spirituality Part 3 by Stephen R. Patton, M.D

In prior articles I have given some background about a worldview called New Spirituality (NS). This information is available in more detail in Summit Ministry's book titled, Understanding the Times. So far, we have addressed the basic beliefs of NS such as everything is consciousness, every person is God, consciousness can be harnessed to achieve perfection and the purpose of life is overcoming self. Last month we touched on the alleged sources that NS claims can be tapped to gain "awareness". Some of these sources are meditation, channeling (seances), and other occult practices. In regard to human nature, NS says each of us is not a human made in the image of God but a part of the universal consciousness which makes each of us a part of God. Two questions one must ask of any worldview are "What is wrong with humanity?" and "How should we then live?" Let's address these now.

If you are a Christian, you know the answer to the question, "What's wrong with humanity?" as a whole and as it relates to each of us individually. It's called sin. Sin is an integral part of our (fallen) human nature and separates us from God. Only by repenting of our sin and turning to Jesus can we receive forgiveness and escape the power that sin has in our lives. (Rom 1-3) Subsequently, any good is not ours, it's His. The Bible says, "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me."

NS has a totally different take on solving mankind's problems. NS says our downfall is not sin but failing to understand the true nature of consciousness. Tolle, a New Spiritist says, "You do not become good by trying to be good, but by finding the goodness that is already within you, and allowing that goodness to emerge. But it can only emerge if something fundamental changes in your state of consciousness." Beverly Galyean says, "Once we begin to see that we are all God, that we all have the attri-

butes of God, then I think the whole purpose of human life is to re-own the godlikeness within us; the perfect love, the perfect wisdoms, the perfect understanding, the perfect intelligence..."

To my Christian way of thinking, these words indulge the NS devotee in the idolatry of self-worship and reduce the NS practices to the ultimate self-help program.

If the New spirituality is true, then how should we live? I knew a follower of this NS line of thinking who said he thought all the religions of the world were superficially different but fundamentally the same. I think just the opposite. I think most are superficially similar but on close inspection are fundamentally different. Compared to Christianity, the tenets of "right living," according to NS, are a case in point. According to NS principles, we should focus within ourselves and not on the world around us. Love and compassion bind us to pain and suffering and actually prolong negativity, individualism and ego (three "sins" according to New Spirituality). We are to be free of these qualities. Indifference to suffering is the basis of a good life. The reasoning goes something like this: Suffering is the result of bad karma given out as punishment for faults accrued in previous lives. A person experiencing a life of disease, poverty or other affliction must work off his bad karma in this life before he can advance through reincarnation into a better quality of life in the future. Showing kindness and compassion and relieving the suffering of the unfortunate simply retards their cleansing process.

Jesus showed us a better way. He taught us to deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him. Remember the parable of the Good Samaritan, and contrast that with the dispassion of focusing on yourself while ignoring the plight of the downtrodden. James 4:17 says, "Therefore, to one who knows the [a]right thing to do and does not do it, to him it is sin."

Any similarities between NS and Christianity end right here. The contrast could not be more stark. Only through love, compassion, sacrifice and grace can we properly relate to a sinful, lost and hurting world. That's what Jesus said. That's what Jesus did. That's how we should live.

"THE STRANGE DEATH OF EUROPE" AND EUROPEAN CHRISTIANITY

What happens when a civilization forgets—or rejects—its roots?

ROBERTO RIVERA "Europe is committing suicide. Or at least it leaders have decided to commit suicide." Those are the opening words of Douglas Murray's controversial best-seller, "The Strange Death of Europe: Immigration, Identity, Islam."

What Murray means when he says that Europe is "committing suicide" is that "the civilization we know as Europe is in the process of committing suicide." It's a fate that neither his native "Britain nor any other Western European country can avoid . . . because [they] all appear to suffer from the same symptoms and maladies."

It's Murray's diagnosis of these "symptoms and maladies" that should interest Christians.

As the subtitle suggests, Murray's book covers much of the same ground as other recent books by authors such as Mark Steyn, Bruce Bawer, and the French novelist Michelle Houellebecq. These books seek to warn readers about the threat to European institutions and values posed by mass Islamic immigration.

While Murray is, to put it mildly, skeptical about the possibility of successfully assimilating millions of Muslim immigrants and their children, this mass migration alone wasn't enough to cause the "strange death" alluded to in his title.

As Murray tells readers, "even the mass movement of millions of people into Europe would not sound such a final note for the continent were it not for the fact that (coincidentally or otherwise) at the same time Europe lost faith in its beliefs, traditions and legitimacy."

In other words, it is mass Islamic immigration plus Europe's spiritual exhaustion—my words not his—that threaten to put an end to European civilization.

And at the heart of the loss of faith Murray cites is Europe's turning its back on Christianity.



In one chapter he writes about a sense shared by many European intellectuals, including himself, that "life in modern liberal democracies is to some extent thin or shallow and that life in modern Western Europe in particular has lost its sense of purpose."

According to Murray, "Here is an inheritance of thought and culture and philosophy and religion which has nurtured people for thousands of years and may well fulfill you too."

The "religion" Murray refers to is, of course, Christianity, which he calls the "source" of European ideas about rights, laws, and the institutions that protect them. He tells his secularized readers that "There is no reason why the inheritor of a Judeo-Christian civilization and Enlightenment Europe should spend much, if any, of their time warring with those who still hold the faith from which so many of those beliefs and rights spring."

He also derides the varieties of "European Christianity [that] have lost the confidence to proselytize or even believe in their own message." This lack of confidence, in Murray's estimation, is why some young Europeans turn to Islam, which doesn't suffer from the sense that "the story has run out."

What makes Murray's account especially interesting is that he is a self-described atheist. His reasons for disbelief aren't particularly persuasive, but that doesn't negate his much-needed reminder of Europe's debt to Christianity and how its rejection of its Christian past threatens its future. The same, of course, could be said about America.

As Murry writes, "If being 'European' is not about race—as we hope it is not—then it is even more imperative that it is about 'values.' This is what makes the question 'What are European values?' so important."

It's a question that can't be answered without first acknowledging the source of those values.

Matters of the Art, located at 2101 Hwy. 80 in Haughton, Louisiana, is a social enterprise of Evergreen Life Services. Evergreen is a nonprofit organization providing services to over 1.400 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities in seven states.
