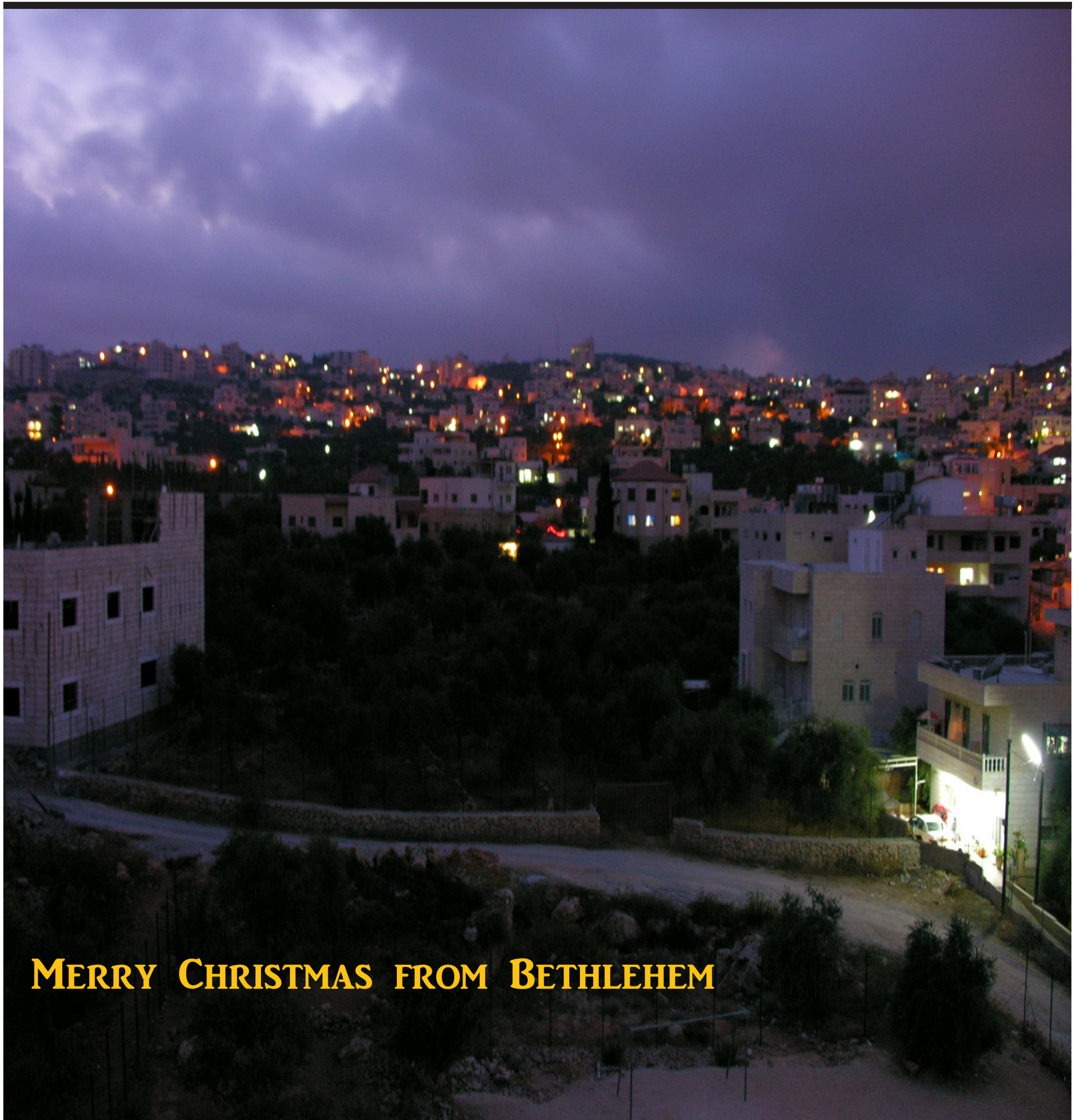

Unclaimed Property Listings
*Treasurer Kennedy says odds better of finding
Unclaimed Property than winning lottery*

BATON ROUGE, LA - If you missed it in the newspaper, "I encourage everyone to check the listings at www.LATreasury.com for your name, and the names of your family members, friends and neighbors, too," said Treasurer Kennedy. "The Treasury holds \$518 million dollars that needs to be returned to its rightful owners. No matter how small the amount, I want to get it back into your pocketbook."

One in six individuals has Unclaimed Property, and the average refund is \$300 to \$400.

Unclaimed Property is money held by businesses and other entities that goes unclaimed and must be turned over to the state. It includes savings and checking accounts, uncashed payroll checks, certificates of deposit, stocks and dividends, insurance proceeds, oil and gas royalty payments, utility deposits and other funds. When a business cannot locate an individual the Unclaimed Property belongs to, usually because of a wrong address, the money is turned over to the state for safekeeping.

Since 1972, the Unclaimed Property program has returned nearly \$270 million to over 200,000 Louisiana citizens. "The Unclaimed Property Program had a record-breaking year, collecting \$73 million in unclaimed money and reuniting \$27 million with the rightful owners," said Treasurer Kennedy.

Defending Our Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

The Biology of Sin:

“Grace, Hope, and Healing for Those Who Feel Trapped”

A Review of Matthew S. Stanford, PhD’s Book, part IV

My previous four articles have touched on the altered chemistry and biological differences in the brains of affected individuals which make certain sinful behaviors more difficult for them to resist. In his book, *The Biology of Sin*, Dr. Matthew Stanford discusses the scientific knowledge recently acquired about those individuals who are predisposed to rage, lust, adultery, homosexuality, lying, addiction and stealing. Research shows definite biochemical alterations in some people involving different areas of the brain where specific behaviors such as these are regulated or modified. It is important for believers to recognize that these differences exist and impact behavior.

Just because affected individuals have a degree of predisposition, such behaviors need not be excused. In the Bible, Peter points out that “corrupt desires” are not to be followed like animals follow instincts (1Pet 2:11). Dr. Stanford points out that “broken biology can never be used as an excuse for sinful behavior” and quotes Robert Gagnon who says, “A biology-equals-morality rationale has no place in a worldview that talks of denying one’s self, losing one’s life, taking up one’s cross, dying with Christ, new creation and living for God.” Dr. Stanford also says, “The fact that we have sinful DNA is simply another example of why we so desperately need a Savior with the power to completely renew and recreate us.” This renewal is not the elimination of sinful desire but instead, the transformation of desire. We turn from sinful ways to God’s ways (repentance) by the power He supplies, the Spirit within the believer.

In treating affected patients, Dr. Stanford notes, “The conflict between

who we are in Christ and our fleshly lusts occurs in the mind (Rom 8:5-7). Whether a non-believer or fellow Christian, renewal of the mind is the ultimate goal (Rom 12:2). That is why faith in Jesus Christ is so important to overcoming sin. The area of the mind in a believer which is in conflict between sinful desire and God’s standard, has a more powerful force for good than prior to salvation.

According to Dr. Stanford, the first step in treatment is submission, moment-by-moment dependence on Christ. “God didn’t ask you to save yourself and he’s not asking you to sanctify yourself.” Submitting to the spiritual power He provides makes lasting inner change possible. Jesus said, “Without me, nothing is possible.” (John 15:5). The second step is preparing the mind. Before receiving Christ, the mind is set only on worldly things (Eph 4:17-19). Through prayer, study of Scripture and meditation, the mind can be retrained and prepared for temptations that inevitably come (Matt 7:24-27). The third step is taking thoughts captive where sinful thoughts are turned over to the Spirit or mind of Christ within the believer and allowing that force to overturn the temptation no matter how strong it may be (1 Cor 10:13). Finally, having accountability before other believers in a format to confess sin gives transparency and a place where temptation can be dealt with (James 5:16). None of this disqualifies treatment with medication, and other counseling measures.

In Dr. Stanford’s final thoughts, he reiterates that the behaviors such as rage, lust, adultery, homosexuality, lying, addiction and stealing are all referred to in Scripture as sin. Sin cannot complete us the way Christ can. These practices destroy the level of intimacy with God He intended but change, no matter how seemingly difficult, is possible through Him (Matt 19:26).

Jesus' First Appearance

Anticipating and rejoicing in the birth of Christ

When you think about the first Christmas so long ago, do you consider it to be merely a sweet story or one of the most significant events in human history? People often regard the narrative of the Savior born in a manger as a quaint fairytale, legend, or religious myth.

They don't understand the amazing work God performed. Yet, 2 Corinthians 5:19 tells us, "God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation."

In the Fullness of Time

In Galatians 4:4, Paul tells us, "When the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son." This means that in His great wisdom, God knew the perfect moment to send His Son, Jesus, to be our Savior. We needed someone to redeem us ever since Adam and Eve disobeyed God and fell from grace in the Garden of Eden. Romans 5:12 tells us, "Sin entered the world through one man [Adam], and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned." Humanity was condemned to be separated from God for eternity because everyone since Adam has been born with a sin nature—and because the Lord is holy, He will not tolerate sin.

Yet, God also knew that we could not save ourselves, so He looked down from heaven and chose a godly man—Abraham—to work through and set His plan in motion. He promised Abraham, "In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have obeyed My voice" (Gen. 22:18). Abraham fathered Isaac, who in turn had Jacob and Esau. From Jacob came 12 sons who would become the patriarchs of the 12 tribes of Israel.

The history of Israel is long and instructive. God worked powerfully through His people and saved them from many enemies. He even taught them how to serve Him and what sacrifices would be necessary when repenting for their sins. Yet, when the people turned away from God and gave into their wickedness, they suffered greatly—even facing bondage in Egypt and captivity in Babylon.

Although Israel prayed for the Messiah to come during those terrible times, God waited until the world was ready to receive His Son—when the message of the gospel could be carried to the ends of the earth. This came after Alexander the Great spread the Greek culture and language throughout the known world, making communication easier among people. It also happened after the Romans created extensive highways that connected nations and made travel faster and safer.

All of these events had to take place not only to save Israel, but also to make it possible for the entire world to know the Savior. Of course, each part of God's plan took hundreds of years. Why did it take so long? Because God knew exactly what He wanted to accomplish. He wanted for us to see His mighty work throughout history and the fulfillment of His promises to Abraham and His people. He also wanted us to understand that serving Him through sacrifices will never be enough because we always fall short. Only He can save us; all we must do is believe in Him and obey.

The Triumph of His Appearing

Looking again at Galatians 4:4–5, we see that not only did Christ come

in the fullness of time but also that He was "born of a woman, born under the Law, so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons." It was important to note that Jesus was born of a woman rather than of a man and a woman. The virgin birth is an absolutely imperative factor of God's plan, and it represents the triumph of Christ's first appearance.

Remember, everyone since Adam has been born sinful because we inherit the nature of our father. Yet, Jesus was not conceived through an earthly father—He was conceived by the Holy Spirit. That means He is absolutely sinless, and He is the only one who could ever be the unblemished sacrifice for our transgressions.

Jesus' miraculous birth and sacrificial death made it possible for us to be acceptable in the eyes of God. That is why the angels in heaven sang out, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased," when He made His first appearance (Luke 2:14). He paid the ultimate price and did what we could not so we could be reconciled to the Father.

A Personal Appearance

Jesus said, "The Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). He came at the perfect moment to undertake an extraordinarily humble mission and triumph over our worst enemies—sin and death.

Has Jesus made an appearance in your life? Have you opened your heart to the sinless Savior? You either believe in Him or you do not. When you place your trust in Him, He saves you, reconciles you to the Father, and promises to stay with you forever. However, when you reject Him, you reject the loving, merciful plan God has orchestrated throughout time.

Jesus Christ has already done something miraculous on your behalf through the most significant event of human history—His wonderful birth and sacrificial death. Therefore, accept Him as your personal Savior. He's willing to forgive and cleanse you and show you His amazing, life-changing love. And that's certainly the best story ever told.

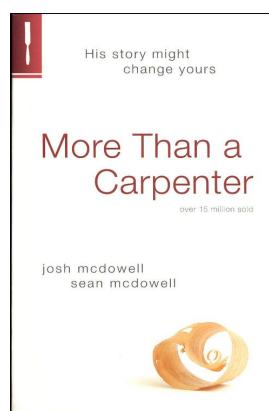
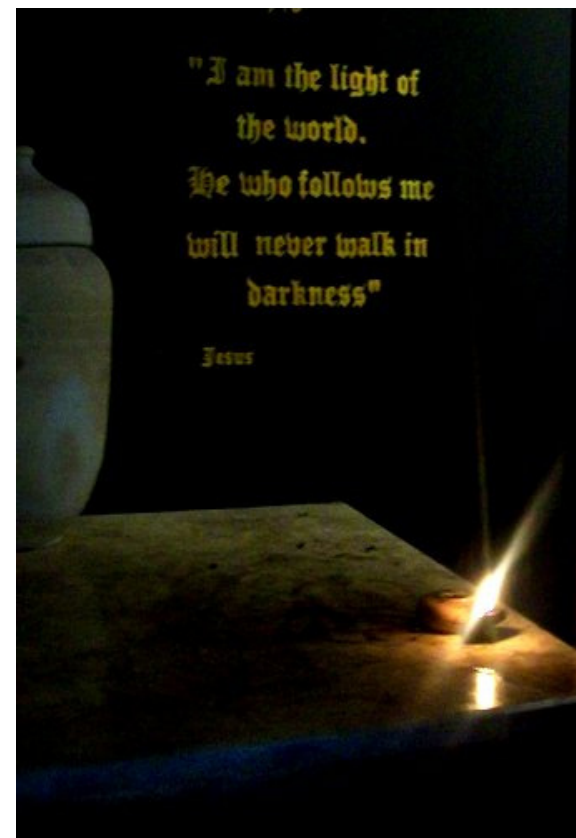

Tips for Good Holiday Photos

It's the holiday season and we all know what that means: picture time! Everyone is racing outside to get Christmas pictures in the beautiful, fall weather for their yearly Christmas cards. So whether you're an aspiring photographer taking pictures for your clients, or you've chosen to snap a picture yourself for your family, here are a few tips that may help you out this season as we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth.

Tip #1:

If you're snapping a picture on a sunny day, be careful of "splotchy" lighting. As the sun shines through the trees, it creates "splotchy" lighting that can make odd shadows on faces. Find a spot that is mostly shady and you should be good to go.

Tip #2:

When dressing for pictures, keep lighter colors with lighter colors, and darker colors with darker colors. Mix and match all you want with patterns and solids, but if you put a dark shirt with a light shirt, the light will bounce off the darker shirt and overexpose the person wearing the light colored shirt.

Tip #3:

If you're shooting inside, do not put your subject(s) directly under a

light. Overhead lighting will keep you from seeing everyone's eyes because there will be deep shadows making the eyes disappear.

Tip #4:

When posing your subject(s), think geometry. Now, this was never my strong area of study, but when I see a ready-made frame from a doorway, columns, etc. I like to place my subjects directly within the "frame" so that the subjects are the first thing the eye is drawn to when my picture is seen.

Tip #5:

If you're photographing a family, place the tallest people in the middle and the shortest people out on the end. Basically, you'll be creating a "pyramid" effect so that everything looks proportional and less chaotic.

Tip #6:

Last, and most important, capture the personality. It is ok if you don't get everyone looking. We all know how hard it is to get kids to look right at the camera and smile their best smile, all the while hoping and praying that everyone else in the picture is looking right at the camera. That's OK! No family is perfect. Some of the best photos I've taken have been when mom and dad are looking fantastic while 4 year old son and 2 year old daughter are looking off in the distance or cuddling into mom's neck because they're shy. So long as you capture the feel of who your client is on film, that's what will make their Christmas card truly theirs and have your client walking away very happy.

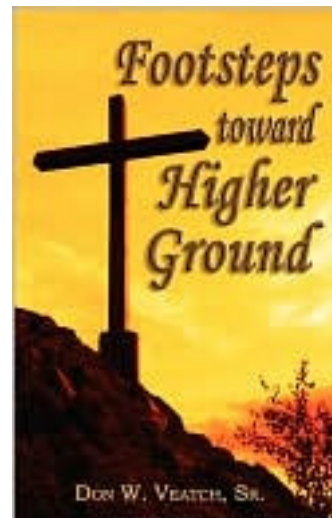

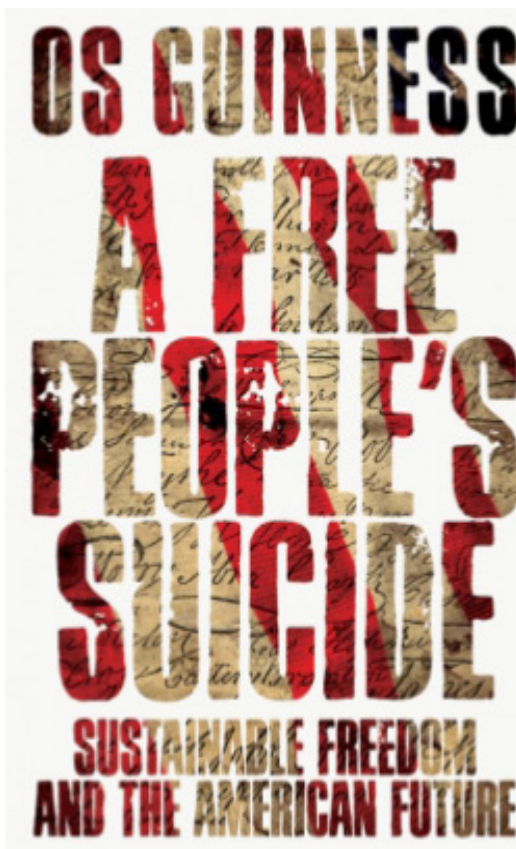

"Christian Post:" **Throughout the book you talk about "ordered liberty," which sounds a bit like an oxymoron. What do you mean by that?**

Guinness: The greatest enemy of freedom is freedom. Now the reason for that paradox is that freedom requires an order, or a framework, and the only appropriate framework for freedom is self-restraint, and yet self-restraint is precisely what freedom undermines when it flourishes. You've really got to consider, what is ordered freedom -- in other words, a framework of freedom? Put differently, freedom is not just negative, freedom from, it is positive too, which means freedom to be or freedom for, but that means you need to know

who you're supposed to be. So in a Christian understanding, Jesus says you will know the truth and the truth will set you free -- that is ordered freedom.
