

MEMORANDUM

DATE: Christmas 2013

RE: Constitutional Rights of Students, Teachers, and Public Schools to Seasonal

Our Constitution acknowledges that people of faith have a right to openly express their beliefs in the public square...

THE FIRST AMENDMENT'S ESTABLISHMENT CLAUSE DOES NOT REQUIRE SCHOOL OFFICIALS TO SUPPRESS SEASONAL **RELIGIOUS EXPRESSION**

The First Amendment's Establishment Clause states that "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion." This provision is often misunderstood as prohibiting seasonal religious expression in public schools. Many school officials mistakenly believe such expression would violate the so-called "separation of church and state"—a phrase not found in the Constitution, but often misused in connection with the Establishment Clause. As a result, school officials across our nation—whether intentionally or from being misinformed—have denied students and teachers their constitutional rights of religious speech and expression under the guise that the Constitution requires them to do so...

The Establishment Clause only restricts government speech. "[T]here is a crucial difference between government speech endorsing religion, which the Establishment Clause forbids, and private speech endorsing religion, which the Free Speech and Free Exercise Clauses protect." Therefore, it is unconstitutional for public officials to deny individuals the right to religious speech and expression by imposing on them a limitation intended for the government.

Christmas and Public Schools Myth/Fact Sheet

Myth #1: Students are not allowed to sing religious Christmas carols in public schools.

Fact: During school activities, such as choir, Christmas programs, and other events in public schools, students can sing religious carols along with secular ones without offending the U.S. Constitution if the school has a secular purpose for including the religious songs; for example, advancing students' knowledge of society's cultural and religious heritage and the opportunity for students to perform a full range of music, poetry, and drama.

Myth #2: It is unconstitutional for school officials to refer to a school break as a "Christmas Holiday."

Fact: The Supreme Court has acknowledged the government's long-standing recognition of holidays with religious significance, such as Christmas. Congress has even proclaimed Christmas to be a legal public holiday.

Myth #3: It is unconstitutional for public schools to close on religious holidays, such as Christmas and Good Friday.

Fact: The Establishment Clause doesn't prohibit state officials from choosing a religious day as the day for a legal holiday.

Myth #4: Public schools have to recognize all religious holidays if they recognize Christmas.

Fact: A school does not have a legal duty to recognize every religious holiday simply because an existing school holiday coincides with a particular religious celebration.

Myth #5: It is constitutional for public schools to ban teachers and students from saying "Merry Christmas."

Fact: The Supreme Court has stated that teachers and students do not "shed their constitutional rights to freedom of speech or expression at the schoolhouse gate." Guidelines issued by U.S. Secretary of Education Richard Riley (who served under President Clinton) state "students therefore have the same right to engage in...religious discussion during the school day as they do to engage in other comparable activity."

Teachers have the right to greet students with the words "Merry Christmas," in spite of their role as agents of the state. Saying a simple greeting that people commonly use in December does not violate the Establishment Clause.

Myth #6: Public schools cannot have students study the religious origins of Christmas and read the biblical accounts of the birth of Christ.

Fact: The Supreme Court has stated that "the Bible may constitutionally be used in an appropriate study of history, civilization, ethics, comparative religion, or the like." The term "study" has been defined to include more than mere classroom instruction; public concerts and performances may be a legitimate part of secular study.

Myth #7: Public schools cannot display religious symbols.

Fact: The display of a nativity scene is constitutional if it is displayed for legitimate secular purposes, such as to celebrate the holiday and to depict the origins of the holiday. A public school is free to display a nativity scene among other forms of religious and secular seasonal expression.

Leaving Church

Review of David Kinnaman's book You Lost Me

Last month I began discussing the backdrop against which the millenial generation, young people ages 18-29, are dropping out of church, by reviewing David Kinnaman's book, You Lost me. The finding that 59% of this age group no longer attend church by age 30 is a sobering statistic. Why is this happening? What might be done about it and what has this to do with apologetics?

David Kinnaman, president of the Barna Group interviewed large numbers of Millennials and recorded their reasons for dropping out. The major reasons given fell into six predominant categories:

Reason #1. Churches seem overprotective. In this electronic Information Age, twentysomethings have wide access to and participate in popular culture. They say the traditional church "demonizes everything outside the church." They desire faith in Christ to connect with the world they live in, not "ignoring the problems of the real world."

Reason #2. Christianity is shallow. Significant numbers of young adults say church is boring and irrelevant to their career or interests. Something is lacking in their experience. Over twenty percent say, "the Bible is not taught clearly or often enough" or "God seems missing from my experience of church."

Reason #3. Churches seem antagonistic to science. Young adults can feel disconnected due to a palpable tension between science and Christianity. One quarter perceive that "Christianity is anti-science" and have been "turned off by the creation-versus-evolution debate." Many science-minded young Christians are questioning their beliefs and their professional calling to science-related professions.

Reason #4. Churches approach to sexuality is simplistic and judgmental. Living in a hyper-sexed culture many young believers struggle with the churches expectations of chastity and sexual purity especially with a cultural trend of delaying marriage. Among Catholic young respondents, an astounding 40% said the church's "teachings on sexuality and birth control are out of date."

Reason #5. The exclusive nature of Christianity. Wanting to find common ground with one another, younger Americans who differ in race, ethnicity, sexuality and religion often disconnect with Christianity which makes exclusive claims. Our culture now values open-mindedness, tolerance and acceptance. Some young adults feel "forced to choose between my faith and my friends." One fifth say, "church is like a country club, only for insiders."

Reason #6 – The church feels unfriendly to those who doubt. Young adults do not feel safe expressing their doubts or asking questions about their faith or the most pressing issues of life at church. Rather than receiving solid answers to their questions, many feel the responses and answers they receive are trivial.

Whether or not we like them, the above six reasons represent the true attitudes of Millennials who are leaving church ranks. The magnitude of their departure demands a meaningful response. In You Lost Me, David Kinnaman suggests two common responses being made are opposite but equally harmful. One response is to ignore the problem because young people have always had doubts. They will probably return as married 30 year-olds with children living traditional lives. This response ignores the rapid cultural changes that find many young adults who never attain the status of yesterday's normal. They are not reappearing in church later in life. The other harmful response is to accommodate the non-Christian practices of modern culture just to make church seem "relevant". This response focuses on preferences and separates this Millennial Generation from the congregation at large and overall mission of the church.

What better responses might be made to address the 59% Millennial Generation drop out rate? What does this have to do with apologetics? Let's explore those questions next month.




