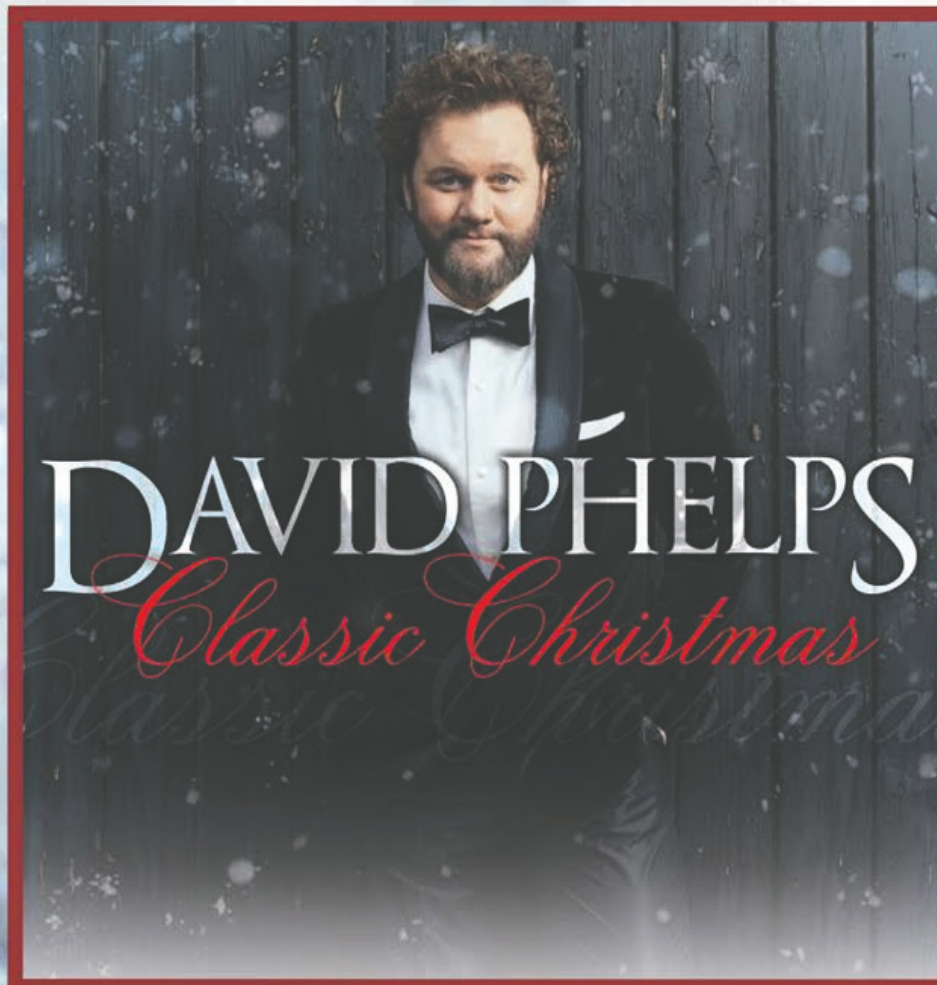

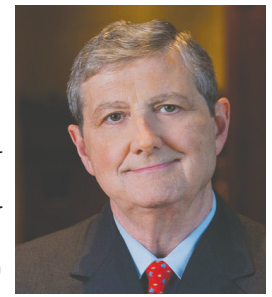

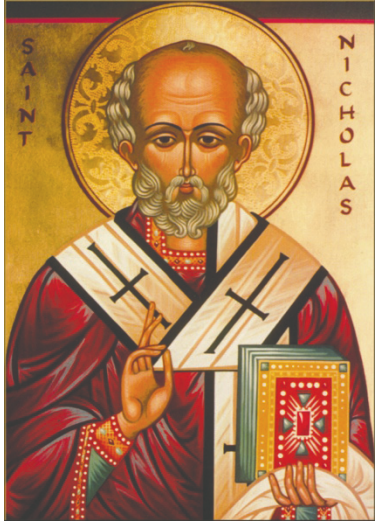

“The Man Before the Myth” Saint Nicholas of Myra

Hardly anything is known for certain about the former bishop of Myra in Lycia, yet, he is one of the most widely regarded saints in the Christian church. Nicholas, who most likely was born at Patara in Lycia, served the church as a bishop until approximately 343 A.D. He was, as one encyclopedia put it, “the saint of the people – of citizens, laborers, merchants; he was

the protector of the weak, the poor, the captive, of the young, especially the poor orphans.” Contrary to the example of some bishops that would follow him in during the Dark Ages, Nicholas chose to serve the poor rather than exploit them. Of all the works of service that he completed, the story of Nicholas’ service to the children in his parish was legendary. Specifically around Christmas time, Bishop Nicholas would give gifts to children who had demonstrated good behavior throughout the year.

The practice of gift-giving in conjunction with St. Nicholas spread throughout the Middle Ages, but underwent somewhat of a change during the Protestant Reformation. As Protestants like Martin Luther discouraged the veneration of saints, someone would have to displace Old Saint Nick.

So Luther encouraged the night of gift-giving to be moved from December 6th to December 24th and the bringer of the gifts to be considered the *Christkind*, which is German for “Christ-child”. To this day, many parts of the world still refer to the *Christkind* as the bringer of Christmas gifts.

The legacy of St. Nicholas of Myra, though, still lives on in a sense through the American mythical figure most know as Santa Claus. The American Christmas tradition, in many ways, is an amalgamation of the legend of the ancient St. Nicholas of Myra, the Protestant response to the veneration of saints, and the modern influence of secularization. Therefore, as Christians gathers to celebrate Christmas this season, we would all do well to remember that the origins of some of our favorite traditions are deeply rooted in the ancient practices of mercy and service to the weak, wounded, poor, and oppressed. Just like Christ Himself, St. Nicholas cared about such people. We celebrate and enjoy Christmas best, when we remember that it was intended to reflect a humble attitude of giving and service to those who need it the most. So, let us not forget: It is more blessed to give than to receive.

The Temporary Body The Eternal Spirit

By the time my father was 75 years old, he had two artificial hips, a total knee replacement, back surgery and his gall bladder removed. Then there was prostate cancer and treatment for that. He often remarked that, "Since turning 65 it's been nothing but patch, patch, patch."

When I was a medical student, a wise professor remarked that most people live to old age by getting a chronic illness and taking good care of it. I suspect that many readers of this article are currently taking good care of their afflictions also. However, no one truly escapes the natural process of aging or the interruptions of temporary or chronic disease. No matter how hard we try to stay healthy, we're all subject to the law of decay. Scientifically expressed, it's the second law of thermodynamics; simply put, time and gravity will have their way.

As a doctor for over 40 years now, I've treated lots of very sick and chronically ill patients. I've been at the bedside of patients nearing death more times than I care to count. When facing almost certain death, some accept that the end of earthy life is near and choose to forego additional treatment measures which are likely be futile, possibly painful. Many others, desperately cling to life, but without chance of recovery, still choose additional treatment just to put off the inevitable a little while longer. Before I bring everybody down, let's allow God to lift us up through the words of the apostle Paul:


2 Cor 4:16 "Therefore we do not lose heart, but though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day. 17 For momentary, light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory far

beyond all comparison, 18 while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen; for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are not seen are eternal. 2 Cor 5:1 For we know that if the earthly tent which is our house is torn down, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. 2 For indeed in this house we groan, longing to be clothed with our dwelling from heaven 6 Therefore, being always of good courage, and knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent from the Lord— 7 for we walk by faith, not by sight— 8 we are of good courage, I say, and prefer rather to be absent from the body and to be at home with the Lord. 9 Therefore we also have as our ambition, whether at home or absent, to be pleasing to Him."

Christian, you are not your body! You *have* a body. You are a conscious spiritual creature that uses your body to move, your brain to think, your eyes to see... Paul tells us here to quit worrying about our bodies. Sure, take good care of the body you have but our hope doesn't dwell in this earthly life. We have a heavenly hope. Though our earthly bodies deteriorate, we are encouraged to focus on our spiritual nature which is not subject to decay. This spirit is instead renewed day-by-day. We're destined to go to a far better place, to a new and eternal creation where we will receive an everlasting body. There, we'll be in perfect fellowship with our Maker, our Savior and each other forever. This is the hope we have and seek to share.

Our Heavenly Father
Matthew 6:8-13

When Christ taught His disciples to pray, He told them to address God as "Our Father." They had previously heard Jesus say, "My Father," but now they, too, shared in that privileged family relationship. All of us who has been born again into the household of God have this same right.

Since our concepts of God are shaped by our earthly fathers, we all have different perceptions of Him, but Jesus is the only one who has a completely accurate understanding of the heavenly Father. Consider some of the ways He cares for His children:

- **Loves:** God's love is unconditional, since it's based on His nature rather than our performance (1 John 4:16).
- **Listens:** When we pray, He gives us His full attention (Ps. 55:16-17).

- **Provides:** The Father assumes responsibility for meeting all our needs (Phil. 4:19).

- * **Guides:** He is the one who directs our path when we trust in Him (Prov. 3:5-6).

- **Protects:** The Lord shields us spiritually, emotionally, and physically, sifting every experience through His sovereign fingers. (Ps. 121:1-8).

- **Stays:** He's not an absentee parent, since He'll never leave or forsake us (Deut. 31:8).

- **Disciplines:** The Lord disciplines us for our good, so that we may share in His holiness (Heb. 12:5-11).

Though experiences with our earthly dads may have distorted our view of the heavenly Father, we can learn to see Him as He truly is. By viewing Him through the truth of Scripture instead of our preconceptions, we will see evidence of His loving care and discover a security we've never known before.
