Louisiana Right to Life Leads the Way to State's #1 Pro-life Status

NEW ORLEANS, La. - Louisiana has been ranked the most pro-life state in the nation for the sixth consecutive year by Americans United for Life.

AUL released its 2015 "Life List" Tuesday after analyzing progress made legislatively or in litigation in 2014. The annual "Life List" ranks all 50 states based on each state's body of law associated with the life issues, ranging from abortion to euthanasia.

Following Louisiana as top pro-life states are Mississippi, Kansas, Oklahoma, and Arkansas.

Washington state ranked as the worst state for life for failing to protect women from an unmonitored and under-regulated abortion industry. Ranking just above Washington are Vermont, Oregon, California, and New Jersey.

"We are thankful to be named the most pro-life state in the nation once again," said Benjamin Clapper, executive director of Louisiana Right to Life. "Our Legislature and our governor made significant strides in 2014 to protect women from the abortion industry and defend the value of every human life. Louisiana Right to Life led the way in 2014 as well as in the past six years to make sure we set the standard for our nation on how to defend human life.

"We know, however, that our work is not done. We will continue until every life is protected by law and every women is defended against the profit motive of the abortion industry."

Louisiana Right to Life, together with the legal and legislative expertise of the Bioethics Defense Fund, led the effort to pass several pieces of pro-life legislation in 2014, including the historic HB 388, the Unsafe Abortion Act, which requires abortionists to have admitting privileges at a hospital within 30 miles of their facility. This bill was signed into law by Gov. Bobby Jindal and is now being challenged in federal court, with a trial scheduled for March.

Other pro-life legislation included:

• HB 305, which provides that no representative of a business or organization that performs abortions may provide instruction in schools that receive state funding. • HB 1274, which protects the lives of the unborn at 20 weeks in complicated cases involving the condition of the mother. If no advance directives are in place, the life of an unborn baby at 20 weeks post-fertilization and older will be preserved in the situation where his/her mother falls unconscious during pregnancy.

• HB 1058, which ensures educational information is offered to families up on the diagnosis of Down syndrome. This information does not include offering abortion as a solution to the diagnosis.

• HB 1262, which establishes that information will be provided to all women prior to an abortion warning them of the psychological impact of abortion.

• HB 1254, which protects a patient's right to medically necessary treatment by prohibiting insurance companies from denying treatment based on a person's life expectancy or condition.

• HB 1105, which requires abortion facilities to post the National Human Trafficking Resource Center hotline in a visible location.

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

In the Image of God Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide _{by}

Stephen R. Patton, M.D.

In Oregon last November, 29 year old Brittany Maynard committed suicide by voluntarily drinking a lethal concoction legally prescribed by a physician who assisted her in this life-ending process. Oregon, which legalized physician assisted suicide in 1997, currently requires the consent of an adult patient declared terminally ill. Maynard's cancer, a Glioblastoma brain tumor, treated surgically just six months before, had returned quickly following surgery causing symptoms. Having run out of medical treatment options, she moved to Oregon to take advantage of existing euthanasia statutes there. Publicity was extensive as she discussed her case publicly and shared her decision via YouTube and People magazine.

January 18th was Sanctity of Life Sunday. This gave us pause to consider the value of human life, and reflect on issues such as abortion, human cloning, embryonic stem cell transplant, prisoner execution and end of life issues. As a Christian, what are we to think about the implications of the life-ending process outlined above. Is it okay to commit suicide? Is it permissible to allow others to do so? Most importantly, what does God have to say?

The Bible is very clear about the supreme value of human life as God created only mankind in His own image (Gen 1:27; 5:1-2). Accordingly we have been given stewardship of His creation (Psalm 8:4-8), been commanded to multiply His image (Gen 9:7), protect the innocent who are being sent to death (Prov 24:11) and punished those who have taken life with loss of their own (Gen 9:6). Human life has supreme value and is possessed by all humans from the time of conception (Jer 1:5).

From these passages and others, Ken Samples, Christian philosopher and theologian, concludes the following about God's image:

- Universal in all humans.
- Not lost by The Fall or sin.
- Not possessed more in some than others
- Not dependent on intelligence, race, gender, defect, etc.
- Contains God's communicable attributes like rationality, willfulness, mercy, grace, etc.
- Qualities enable free will and exercise of dominion

Samples concludes, "Only humans are capable of a spiritual relationship with God. We aren't just different in degree; we're different in kind." Accordingly we can conclude that it is morally wrong to take human life, even one's own.

A distinction needs to be made, however, between active euthanasia (death at the hands of a person) as in our case above vs allowing patients to die by withholding life support either because of the patient's refusal of treatment or due to unlikelihood of benefit (standard medical practice). In these cases, death is caused by disease.

Although the numbers of euthanasia cases in Oregon are not yet huge, similar statutes now exist in a few other states and the pressure is rising for more to follow. To see where all this might lead, one need only look at Europe where Holland made euthanasia legal more than a decade ago. In that country, courts have allowed physician assisted suicide in patients not terminally ill but in pain, not only physical but mental pain. Growing at a rate of about ten percent annually, last year more than 4,000 were euthanized. Patients there are now being euthanized against their will. Even worse than this, Belgium which also has essentially the same laws, has recently enacted euthanasia statutes applying this practice to children.

Is the United States really far behind the Europeans? Probably not. When considering the issues involving the sanctity of life, please keep in mind the image of God whose glory we first need to uphold.

Can You Answer My Question?

Does Louisiana have a Pro-Life license plate like other states do? It's a great way to promote the cause.

Yes, they do.

The specialty license plates came into being in 1997, through Randy Harris' founding of Choose Life, Inc., a pro-life advocacy group based in Ocala, Florida. Harris, who at that time was the Marion County Commissioner, had noticed an environmental license plate and had the idea to use specialty license plates as a way to raise funds for promoting adoption over abortion.

The plates, to this day, feature the phrase "Choose Life," and in many states, including Louisiana, there have been various objections and court battles over these "Choose Life" license plates. But at present only five states in the union do not have them or have a group working on getting them. Those five states are California, Idaho, Wyoming, Kansas and West Virginia. Are they available in Washington, D.C.? Yes.

These plates are not only a good reminder of an important cause; they give financial support as well. The total reported Choose Life license plate sales/renewals nationally is 955,810, and they have raised \$20,906,962 as of September 30, 2014.

Back to Louisiana. The Choose Life plate fee is \$25 per year, but since the DMV registers plates on a two year cycle, the fee for getting a Choose Life plate will be \$50, plus a \$3.50 handling fee for the state. Any cost over and above this amount is the remainder owed on your normal license registration. Visit <u>www.ChooseLifeLA.org</u> or call 1-866-463-5433 for more information. You don't have to wait till your current plate expires to get one.


Life March Here – March for Life There... 1/26/15

While no exact #'s have yet been reported, it is believed that tens of thousands turned out for the Jan. 22 March for Life in Washington, DC. commemorating the 42nd anniversary of Roe vs Wade. Among those attending, and for pro-lifers around the country, there was great disappointment and disgust from some, that the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act did not go to the floor of the House as it was originally scheduled to – on the same day as the March. But in turn many were pleased and excited to know that the No Taxpayer Funding Abortion Act did pass through the House that day enabling it to go on to the Republican controlled Senate. That in itself is a good move forward.

The major pro-life marches in Louisiana culminated January 24 with The March for Life South event taking place in Baton Rouge. Due to construction at the usual venue, the State Capitol Building, and the fact that the *Response Louisiana* event would be held on the same day at LSU, the Life March was changed to that location. The March ended at the Pete Maravich Stadium where Response Louisiana was taking place.



Response Louisiana came into being through Gov. Jindal's call to the state and nation to observe a time of prayer and fasting for America. And that's what it was. Besides being the keynote speaker for the Life March, the governor was an active participant in *Response Louisiana*.

Life March North



Louisiana Life March North was held a week earlier, starting at the Board Walk in Bossier City and finishing up at Festival Plaza in Shreveport. The March was sponsored by Louisiana Right to Life, in conjunction with the Northwest Louisiana Baptist Association, Louisiana Family Forum, Louisiana Conference of Catholic Bishops, Ark-La-Tex Crisis Pregnancy Center, and Heart of Hope Ministries. It is estimated that there were about 6 thousand in attendance. At the end of the walk, the marchers gathered under a pavilion for music, testimonies, and worship, sponsored by local churches and various ministries.
