Religious Freedom Ruling for Answers in Genesis

Answers in Genesis (AiG), an NRB Member, is celebrating an important religious freedom victory. While AiG's Ark Encounter theme park, set to open later this year, would likely otherwise be considered for a state tourism tax incentive, officials in the administration of former Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear (D) had blocked AiG from applying because it was a religious organization. However, a federal judge thwarted that move this week by granting AiG an injunction. Judge Greg Van Tatenhove ruled "that the Commonwealth's exclusion of AiG from participating in the program for the reasons stated – i.e., on the basis of AiG's religious beliefs, purpose, mission,

message, or conduct, is a violation of AiG's rights under the First Amendment to the federal Constitution."

"NRB celebrates this victory," declared NRB President & CEO Dr. Jerry A. Johnson. "We must not allow governments to take dangerous steps down the road of discrimination. People should not be pushed out of the public square simply because they wish to live out their faith in everyday life. I commend Answers in Genesis for standing strong for freedom!"

At issue is a state rebate program intended to incentivize the development of tourist attractions in Kentucky. Essentially, a site could qualify for a refund of a portion of the sales taxes it generates after opening. The court's injunction against former Governor Beshear's decision allows to AiG's Ark Encounter, which will feature a full scale recreation of Noah's Ark, to apply.

Ken Ham, President of AiG, observed, "The law is crystal clear that the state cannot discriminate against a Christian group simply because of its viewpoint, but that is precisely what happened here. The decision today is a victory for the free exercise of religion in this country, including in hiring."

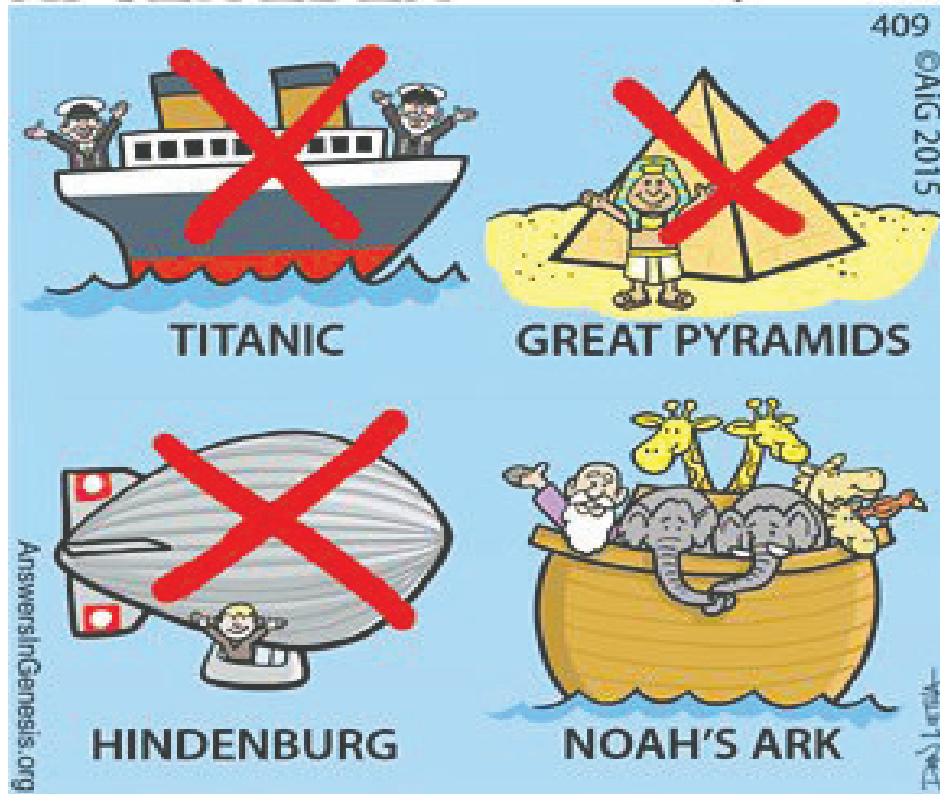

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

Euthanasia Healing to Homicide (part one)

Fifteen months ago, People magazine featured a cover photograph and article about 29 year old Brittany Maynard. Terminally ill with brain cancer, a glioblastoma, her story detailed why she intended to end her own life before developing incapacitating symptoms and loss of personal dignity from her tumor. She determined to travel to the state of Oregon where physician assisted suicide (PAS) laws permit a doctor to administer a lethal dose of drugs to a terminally ill patient under certain circumstances such as hers. A month or so later, in Oregon, Brittany Maynard's life was terminated.

In 2014, only two other states had "death with dignity" or "right-to-die" laws but since then at least 14 other states have enacted or pledged to introduce such legislation. California just recently enacted PAS legislation; PAS is now legal there as well. Is this a good thing or pagan madness? More importantly, what's the Christian position?

First, let's consider in this issue of The Bridge, medical ethics as they have been traditionally applied to end-of-life decision making. In light of that, we can subsequently examine the right-to-die issue. Current medical ethics focuses on four binding determinants in medical decision making as they apply to the patient-physician relationship. These bioethical principles are as follows:

1. The Principle of Autonomy. Competent persons have the right to choose their own medical treatment without coercion. Doctors have a duty to respect the wishes and desires expressed by a competent decision-maker.
2. The Principle of Beneficence. A doctor should act to further the welfare and benefits to a patient and to prevent evil or harm to that person. Beneficence requires the doctor to take positive action.

3. The Principle of Non-maleficence. Doctors should refrain from inflicting harm or unduly risk the infliction of harm. Non-maleficence requires physician restraint from administering harm.

4. The Principle of Life Preservation. Doctors have a moral duty to protect and sustain human life whenever possible. A burden of proof is always placed on factors that might end a patient's life, not on those factors that might sustain it.

These principles have ample biblical support *(Genesis 1:27; Genesis 5:1-2; Gen 9:6; Psalm 8:4-8). Physicians, and those who support them, have a duty to protect and promote the welfare of all who bear God's image. Moral dilemmas arise when duties such as these come into conflict. If, for example, a competent kidney dialysis patient wishes to withdraw from treatment and die, then the principle of autonomy comes into conflict with, say, the principles of beneficence and non-maleficence.

Now let's consider the distinction between deliberately administering a lethal drug and withholding life-sustaining measures like ventilators, dialysis, antibiotics, chemotherapy, and the like? Doctors and families make decisions together to withhold or withdraw futile treatment on a daily basis. This is not euthanasia. When death then occurs, the cause of death is the disease itself. But in active euthanasia or PAS, the cause of death becomes the acting agent, that is, the doctor's role converts from healing to homicide. To me, a doctor, this is a huge difference! It's repulsive! Effective palliative care, not abandonment or homicide, is always appropriate and available when death is inevitable.

In the next issue let's examine the roots of genetic and social engineering (genomics) for the "betterment of society" and where America might be headed when the trend in Europe transfers to this country.

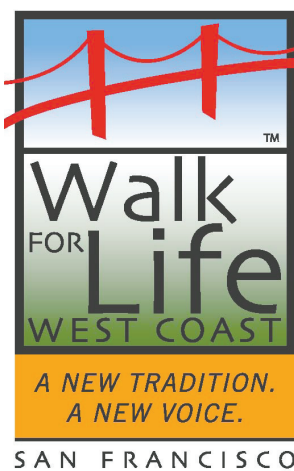

San Francisco

On Saturday, January 23, tens of thousands of San Franciscans, joined by young pro-lifers from as far away as Arizona, Colorado, Oklahoma and Alaska filled the city's Civic Center Plaza and Market Street at the 12th Annual Walk for Life West Coast. Organizers would not give a firm number of attendees, saying only "tens of thousands" but crowd size was consistent with recent years, where local mainstream media estimated 50-55,000 people.

This year's speakers included two international stars of the pro-life movement: Obianuju Ekeocha of Culture of Life Africa, and Mexican musical superstar and pro-life activist Emmanuel, as well as the influential young American pro-life activist, David Daleiden of the Center for Medical Progress.



In the three Louisiana Life March events, in Shreveport-Bossier and Baton Rouge on Jan. 23 and in Pineville-Alexandria on Jan. 30, more than 7,500 Louisiana residents marched for life.



The events were themed "Life is Priceless" in reference to the videos released in 2015 showing Planned Parenthood officials selling the body parts of aborted babies. Participants wanted to send a clear message that the commodification of human life is not acceptable in America.

The broad array of speakers at the Louisiana Life March North included Louisiana Attorney General Jeff Landry; State Rep. Mike Johnson; Dr. Gevan Spinney, president of the Louisiana Baptist Convention; Bishop Michael Duca, Diocese of Shreveport; Jodi Burns, Heart of Hope Ministries; Pastor James McMennis, Word of God Ministries; Vicki Brumley, Ark-La-Tex Crisis Pregnancy Center; Greg and Kim Banks,

Black Advocates for Life; Pastor Ben Brewster, Airline Drive Church of Christ; Dr. Brad Jurkovich, First Baptist Bossier; Chris Davis, coordinator, 40 Days for Life; Alicia Forrest, Ark-La-Tex CPC Director of Healthy Relationship Education; and the Rev. Lane Moore, director of Missions for the Northwest Louisiana Baptist Association.

Speakers at the Baton Rouge march included David Scotton, an LSU senior who was almost aborted 20 years ago; and Sancha Noel Smith, state director for Concerned Women for America of Louisiana;

The temperature was much warmer for the inaugural Louisiana Life March Central, which began at Louisiana College and ended across the Red River in Alexandria. Some of the speakers at that march included Dr. Rick Brewer, president of Louisiana College, Congressman John Fleming, and Congressman Ralph Abraham.

Next year's Louisiana Life March dates are: Louisiana Life March South in Baton Rouge, Jan. 21; Louisiana Life March North in Shreveport/Bossier, Jan. 21; and Louisiana Life March Central in Pineville-Alexandria, Feb. 4.
