

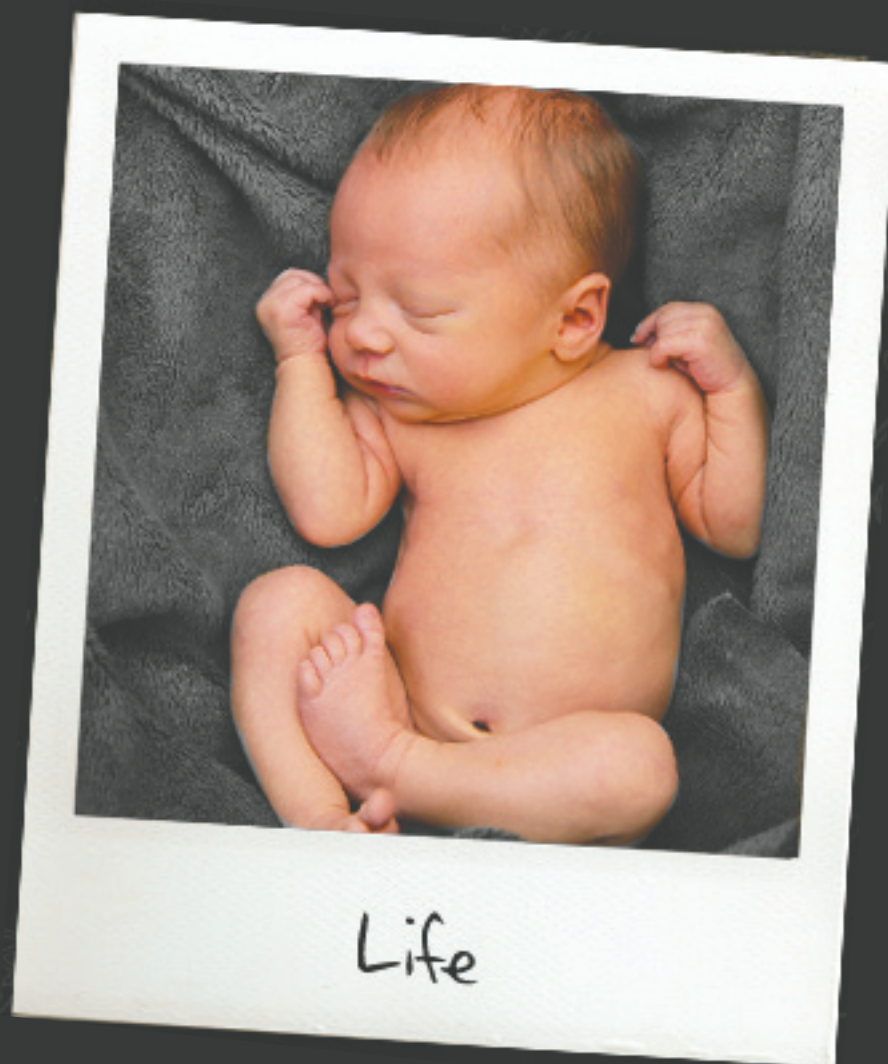

• What is it?

The LLM North is a chance for the citizens of Shreveport, Bossier City, Ruston, Monroe, Natchitoches, and all of North Louisiana to stand together for an abortion-free Louisiana.

The event will consist of a historic march from Bossier City's "Louisiana Boardwalk" across the Texas Street bridge to a gathering in Shreveport's Festival Plaza. At Festival Plaza, nationally-known speakers and local music groups will lead prayer and presentation. After the gathering, a "Life Ministry Mobilization" area will plug you into all the pro-life efforts in your communities.

• Why "3,803 Lives Too Many"?

In 2013, 3,803 abortions were performed at the two abortion facilities in Caddo and Bossier parishes, making the combination of Shreveport and Bossier City the "abortion capital" of Louisiana. In 2013, 9,976 abortions were performed in Louisiana.

The LLM North is the beginning of an effort to save these lives by motivating the faith community to reach out in service and education.

Standing on the Shoulders of Giants

Apologists Past and Present

And so begins a new year with its customary resolutions. Socrates said, "The unexamined life is not worth living," and at this time many reflect on the past, analyze their present positions and chart somewhat different courses. Among top New Year's resolutions are: lose weight, quit smoking, drink less, save money, get fit, eat healthy, get better educated, get a better job, manage debt, take a trip, drink less and manage stress. Sound familiar? Although each is good, please notice all are exclusively focused inward. In short, you can make yourself better by your own resolve. Such unfortunate thinking is part of our American mindset.

As Christians, we believe only Jesus can save us (for eternity) from our sin and change us (in this life) for the better. Only understanding and applying His truth can make us free (John 8:32) and give us abundant life (John 10:10). Remember that the word apologetics comes from the Greek word, "apologia" which means to defend or give truthful explanation. We should always be ready to give an answer to anyone who asks about the hope that is in us (1 Pet 3:15). This is the quest of apologetics. Now is a good time to reflect on the work of apologists who have gone before us and take stock of their inspiring work before pressing on with our own.

The English Christian apologist, C.S. Lewis, who died in 1963, comes immediately to mind. Lewis' works included extensive radio programming in the 1940's and 50's. His books like Mere Christianity have been top choices for decades. The 2005 movie, The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, is just one of a series based on his books. In 2012 Charles "Chuck" Colson died. Among his books Kingdoms in Conflict stands out

but he is likely better remembered for establishing Prison Fellowship, an evangelical prison ministry.

Recently my favorite Christian apologist, speaker, writer and thinker, Dallas Willard, went to be with the Lord. I have read most of his books, among them, The Spirit of the Disciplines, The Divine Conspiracy, Renovation of the Heart, and Hearing God. His focus was spiritual formation and how it can be developed in the believer. Pastor Tim Suttle, wrote on his blog shortly following Dr. Willard's death, "Willard taught me that a disciple is a student who sits at the feet of Jesus day in and day out. A disciple is someone who is with Jesus, learning to be like him, so that when we encounter the world around us, we do exactly what Jesus would do if he were in our shoes."

Inspired by the truth and the apologists before them, current apologetic thinkers are engaging our present unbelieving culture. Here I challenge you to examine a Website that lists 100 top apologists, with links to their works, websites and much more. The Apologetics315 website, <http://www.apologetics315.com/2009/06/100-christian-apologists.html> is a treasure of information.

Please don't misunderstand, apologetics does not replace Bible study. Like theology, Biblical archeology, the history of Christianity and other fields, apologetics is simply another discipline of our faith that helps our mission to present our faith to an unbelieving generation. As the new year begins, I urge everyone to examine their beliefs and practices and look to Christ as the only worthy Source of change. We can stand on the shoulders of giants who have gone before us and work together with those currently leading the battle (Eph 6:10-18) for the hearts and minds of unbelievers.

Can You Answer My Question?

What's the latest on Common Core in Louisiana?

Here's an update from Kathryn Goppelt.

The Common Core Initiative is comprised of copyrighted educational standards, assessments and instructional materials developed outside of state and local control. This fact has caused tremendous frustration for administrative staff, teachers and parents. In the 2015 Legislature that begins on April 13th there will be efforts to place control of education back into the hands of state and local officials as well as more opportunity for parents to be involved in the process of adopting standards.

Although the loss of privacy for students and their families through an educational data-base accessed by the Federal Government was addressed in the 2014 Legislative Session, there are some loopholes that need to be closed. These will also be up for discussion.

Unfunded mandates on states and local school districts brought on by adoption of the Common Core Initiative were never addressed. The 2015 Legislative Session will be a fiscal one, and there will be opportunity to review the high cost of technology, high stakes testing and other requirements of the Initiative with current budget shortfalls.

Every state legislator, member of the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and the Governor are up for reelection in October of 2015.

Candidates supporting the Common Core Initiative have had limited success. More people now understand what Common Core is and they have rejected it along with candidates who support it. Please visit <http://www.louisianacore.org> and sign the pledge. Send a message to candidates that they will not have your vote, if they support the Initiative.

Since September legislators have hosted over a dozen town halls across the state. There will be others in January and February before the 2015 Session begins. These events are listed on the website. Contact your state representative or senator and let them know your thoughts on the subject. The link to find them is on the website as well.

April 23rd will be the Legislative Common Core Day at the Capitol in Baton Rouge. Parents, teachers and concerned citizens are invited to attend. These efforts will prove successful in bringing control of education back to Louisiana when concerned citizens become involved.

LA resident and teacher, Kathryn Goppelt is networking with others across the state to give education control back to parents, classroom teachers and local school districts. For these patriots, the road to recovery is long. Operation Heal Our Patriots, a ministry project of Samaritan's Purse, focuses on bringing spiritual refreshment, physical renewal, and marriage enrichment to wounded and injured U.S. military service members and their spouses. To thank these brave men and women for their service and sacrifice, we offer programs uniquely developed to strengthen the marriage relationship and build hope for the future through the transforming power of God's Word.



A Wilderness Retreat for Military Couples

Samaritan Lodge Alaska stands peacefully within the great wilderness of America's last frontier. It is here, among mountains, glaciers, waterfalls, and wildlife that we minister to the needs of America's own victims of war.



Commercial flights are booked for Sundays from the most convenient airport to Anchorage. Here guests will transfer to a private plane for travel on to Port Alsworth. Lodge staff greets guests at the airport, drives them the short distance to the wilderness retreat center, and drops them off at the front door of their personal cabin.

Guests enjoy a wide range of activities such as fishing, kayaking, hiking, bear watching, and boating. Our specialized 34-foot boat is outfitted with a folding bow that transitions into a ramp to the shore, providing easy ac-



cess. Specific activities are tailored for each group of visitors. The wilderness retreat center is open from June through mid-September. Guests will stay for one week, including travel time.



Each day, our on-site staff chaplain leads devotions and our Marriage Resiliency Workshop. During one session each week, couples split into a wives' group and a husband's group. This course offers couples time away from daily pressures and distractions to study the primary dynamics that have the greatest impact on a marriage.



What military couples learn and experience through Operation Heal Our Patriots gives them a solid biblical foundation upon which to build a Christ-centered marriage. Helping them live it out at home is what leads to their long-term healing. That is why our ministry includes aftercare services that include area military chaplain referrals, local church follow-up, and additional resources for spiritual growth.



The week-long workshop concludes with a worship service, which affirms and celebrates couples' relationship with God and one another, amid the marvels of His creation.



God is doing an extraordinary work among military couples who attend Operation Heal Our Patriots marriage retreats. "Jesus returns us to hope," Chaplain Jim Fisher said. "Though many wounded military personnel may never return to their pre-war 'normalcy,' they can find hope, purpose, and meaning for their lives through a saving relationship with Jesus Christ."

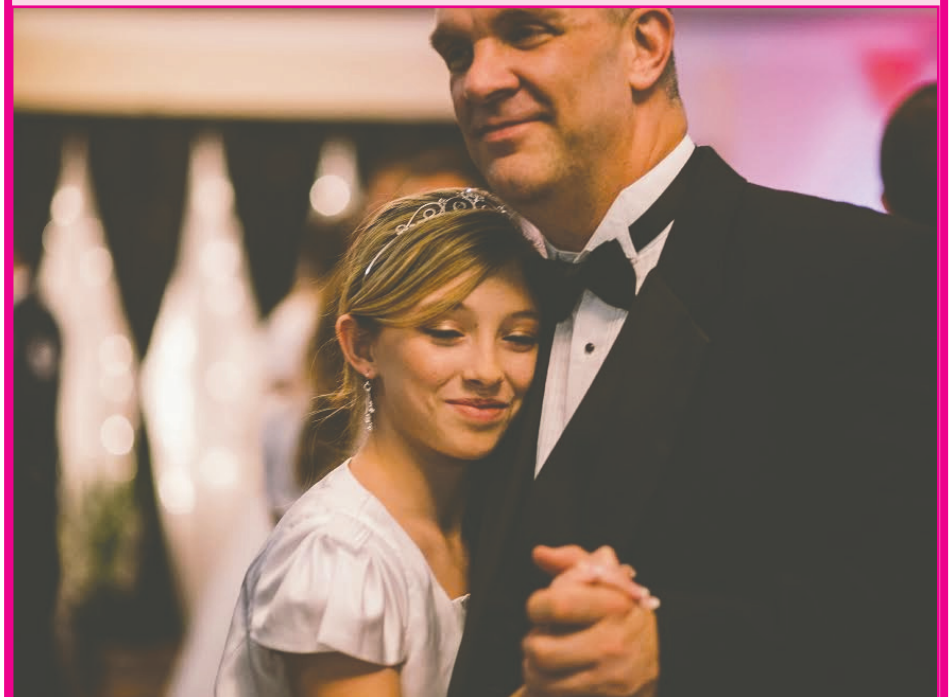
