America's Looming Demographic Winter

CAN WE AVOID A FERTILITY FREE FALL?

Is America heading for a demographic cold snap? The fertility forecast is gloomy these days.

We've talked before on BreakPoint about the fertility crisis facing China, Japan, and much of Europe—all of which face what has been called a “demographic winter.”

Until recently, the United States has been an exception to this distressing trend, but this seems no longer the case.

To understand why, here's a primer. Demographers use two numbers to measure fertility rates: the average number of children a woman gives birth to during her lifetime—that's called the “total fertility rate”—and the number of births per 1,000 women, often referred to as the “birth rate.”

If the “total fertility rate” drops below 2.1 children per woman, a country's population will shrink unless there are compensating levels of immigration.

And that's what's been happening in the U.S. since at least 2008. Our total fertility rate has dropped below replacement levels, but has been masked by high levels of immigration in two distinct, but related, ways.

First, immigrants replaced children that native-born Americans weren't having. Second, immigrant women had higher than replacement-level fertility rates, which, as Jonathan Last of the Weekly Standard pointed out in his book, “What to Expect When No One is Expecting,” made our total fertility rate significantly higher than it would have otherwise been.

The boost from immigration, however, appears to have ended. According to the CIA's World Factbook, our total fertility rate mirrors Sweden's, Norway's, and the United Kingdom's, and is even lower than France's.

And a recent report from the Centers for Disease Control suggests it may drop more. According to the report, the U.S. birth rate has dropped to an

all-time low of 59.6 births per 1,000 women.

So what's the big deal? Well, only economic catastrophe. Writing at The Week, Pascal-Emmanuel Gobry calls the record low birth rate a “national emergency.” And yet people are responding with a shrug.

Here's a case in point: the Washington Post's treatment of the story. To the Post, the story was about policy. Young women are postponing childbirth, and thus, having fewer children, because “Building a family, regardless of age, is expensive.”

Don't be molded by the cultural mindset that commodifies children. Instead, let's declare, along with the psalmist, “Children are a gift of the Lord. . . .”

But the Post, like Gobry, acknowledges that it's not at all clear that governmental support programs would make much difference. Places like Denmark couldn't be more generous to would-be parents and yet Denmark has resorted to advertisements urging people to “do it for Denmark.”

As Last pointed out, once fertility rates drop below a certain level, as they have in places like Japan, a kind of demographic snowball effect makes raising them almost impossible.

Now don't get me wrong: We should welcome any policy that helps people who want more children afford them. But no government policy can make people want to have children. That's a function of worldview.

Which brings me to what Christians should think about this. As my colleague Warren Cole Smith points out, the solution is obvious: Start making babies again. It's easy. It's fun. It's good for America. And it brings great joy!

But you might be surprised at how resistant many Christians are, including young people, to this counsel. Twice this summer, I've made students cry just by suggesting that marriage and babies are biblically a package deal. Though Christians disagree about the morality of artificial birth control, we should agree that the contraceptive mindset, which treats children as optional only if we want them, runs contrary to God's intention for marriage.

The demographic winter is coming. In fact, the first snows have already fallen. Will we make what is already “disaster” even worse?

5 facts about adoption in America

Each year in November, the President of the United States issues a proclamation to announce National Adoption Month, a time dedicated to raising awareness of the need for adoptive families and to encourage citizens to become involved in the lives of children and youth in foster care.

Here are five facts about adoption in America:

- Adoption remains rare, and over the past decade, has been on the decline. In 2002, only 600,000 women age 18-44 (1.1 percent) had ever adopted a child. That rate dropped in half, to about 300,000 (0.61 percent), between 2011 and 2013. In 2002, 1.3 million men age 18-44 (2.1 percent) had ever adopted a child. That rate also dropped nearly in half, to about 700,000 (1.3 percent), between 2011 and 2013. (The rate of adoption for men is higher because men are more likely to adopt their stepchildren during marriage.)
- In 2014 there were 415,129 children in foster care and 107,918 waiting to be adopted. The average age of a child in foster care waiting to be adopted was 7.7 years old. The average age of children in foster care being adopted was 6.2 years old.
- On average, a child will spend 32.3 months in foster care awaiting adoption. About 55 percent of these children have had three or more placements with foster care families, and 33 percent had

changed elementary schools five or more times, losing relationships and falling behind educationally.

- Of children adopted with public agency involvement in 2014, almost two out of three (67 percent) were adopted by a married couple. About one in four (26 percent) were adopted by a single female. Relatively few were adopted by unmarried couples (four percent) or single men (three percent).
- The Child Welfare Information Gateway, a government-funded adoption information service, estimates the average U.S. adoption costs of various types of adoptions:

Intercountry Adoptions — \$15,000 - \$30,000
 Independent Adoptions — \$8,000 - \$40,000+
 Licensed Private Agency Adoptions — \$5,000 - \$40,000+
 Facilitated/Unlicensed Adoptions — \$5,000 - \$40,000+
 Public Agency (Foster Care) Adoptions — \$0 - \$2,500

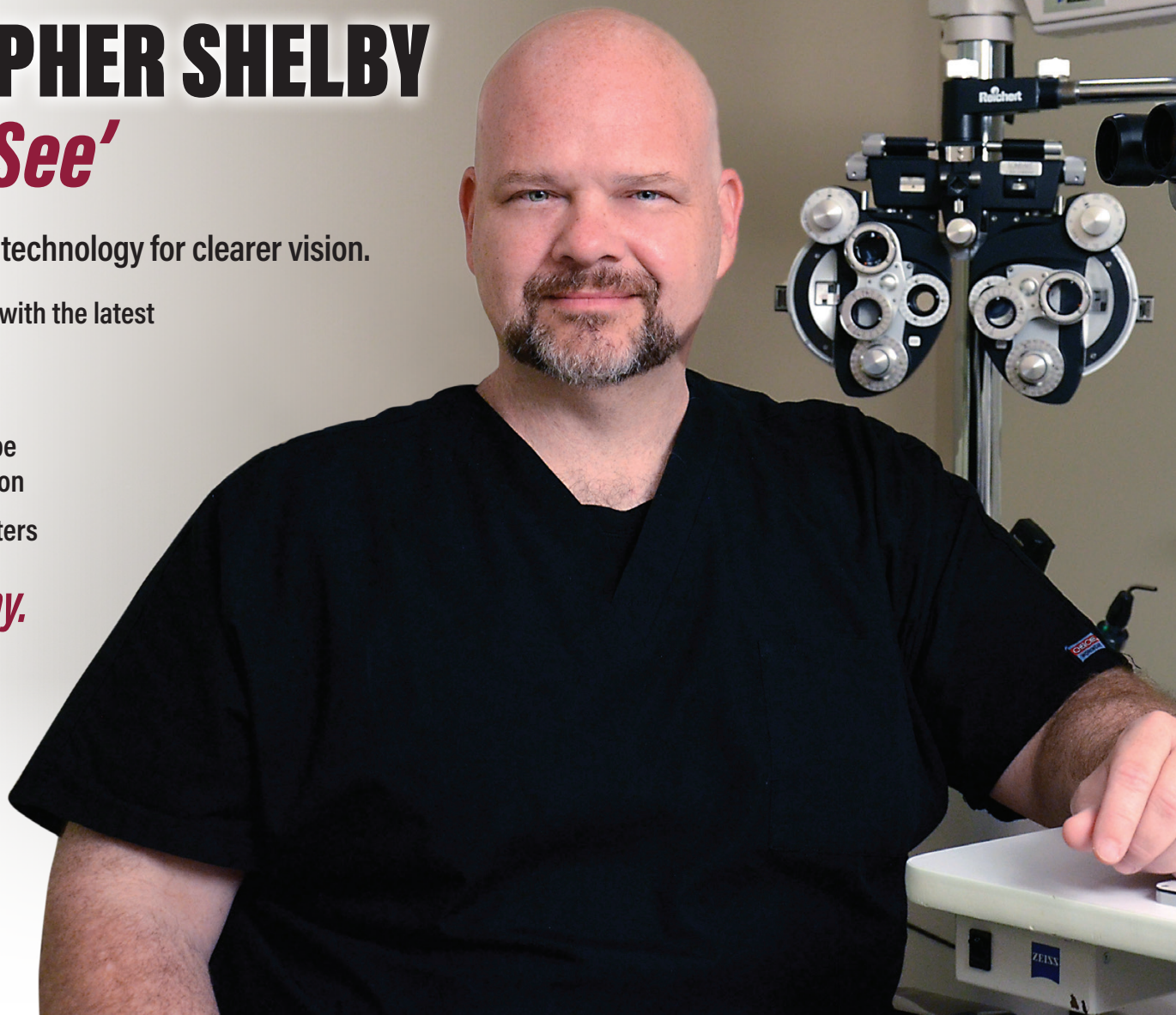

The Rise of Secularism A Humanistic Worldview

Part Two

In a recent article, I began discussing a prominent worldview, Secular Humanism (SH). This worldview's dominance in Western Europe has been shaping culture on that continent for decades. The US is following closely behind. Christian culture in our country has been rapidly replaced by secular humanistic thought. Much of this article has a foundation in the book *Understanding the Times, A Survey of Competing World Views* by authors Jeff Myers and David Noebel.

SH is noted to be concerned with only the here and now (saeculum in Latin means span of time) as opposed to eternity. It is also focused on humans rather than God. In SH God does not exist - only the visible universe does. God did not create us - evolution explains our presence. There is no absolute truth - we each have to discover our own truth. There is no divine law - we can make our own laws to suit our own needs. God does not need to help us - we have science and technology for that. God does not need to save us - we have to save ourselves.

Some of our nation's founding fathers possessed humanistic beliefs. Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson come to mind. They were deists (perhaps God exists but has no active part in the world). Jefferson wrote a version of Scripture (the Jefferson Bible) more to his liking by removing all the miraculous parts of it but leaving the moral code unchanged.

Listed in *Understanding the Times*, some of the thinkers and their written works that have formed current SH thinking are:

Thomas Paine, *Age of Reason*

Charles Darwin, *Origin of Species*

Fredrick Nietzsche, *Genealogy of Morals*

Sigmund Freud, *Civilization and its Discontents*

John Dewey, *Democracy and Education*

Bertrand Russell, *Why I am not a Christian*

Simone de Beauvoir, *The Second Sex*

Abraham Maslow, *Toward a Psychology of Being*

If a student in your family is studying the works of any of these authors or their disciples (a very high percentage of all college professors), rest assured they are getting a heavy and unbalanced dose of the ideas outlined above.

In more recent years, a secular humanist, Paul Kurtz, authored the 1973 *Humanist Manifesto* to which large numbers of their "believers" have since affixed their signatures, signifying agreement. Many more signed the *Humanist Manifesto 2000*, an even more recent revision. None of this is secret. Do a simple Google search on the Internet and you will be reading the most updated version of the *Humanist Manifesto* within minutes. Like any other worldview, SH offers ideas in every aspect of thinking and behavior like theology, philosophy, ethics, biology, psychology, sociology, law, politics, economics, and history.

Let me discuss one issue within the field of ethics and morality, since other articles also in this issue of *The Bridge* also pertain to the sanctity of life. Recently I discussed the subject of personhood as an intrinsic and sacred attribute possessed by all humans. This status has been afforded by the Creator from the time of conception to the last breath; He made us in his image! (Gen 1:26-27). Therefore we need to respect this sanctity in all persons throughout the entirety of their life. Abortion, physician assisted suicide and euthanasia of the elderly and infirm are entirely unthinkable in the context of the Christian worldview.

SH teaches something entirely different. Since humans are merely

biological creatures at a certain stage of evolution like all other life, why not help out Mother Nature and our own evolutionary development by weeding out individuals who shouldn't be allowed to reproduce or even exist? Speed evolution up, so to speak. Early in the 19th century, in this country, a eugenics movement arose promoting just these ideas. Institutionalization of the physically and mentally infirm was carried out. Forced sterilization of black women in the early 1930's was done in some states, and a woman named Margaret Sanger founded Planned Parenthood. In these clinics, abortions were promoted primarily among blacks. The real purpose, according to Sanger, was to reduce the numbers of black people in America. Soon Hitler perpetrated this idea on the Jews, carrying out the Holocaust in Europe. Following Roe vs Wade, Planned Parenthood has made a comeback in a big way. Over 60 million abortions have been carried out in this country since then.

Abortion, physician assisted suicide and euthanasia are a logical outcome to the Secular Humanist idea that God does not exist. They are a blight on our nation and an affront to the God that Secular Humanists say does not exist. In the next issue of this publication, let's explore the Christian response to this worldview and how it might be countered.

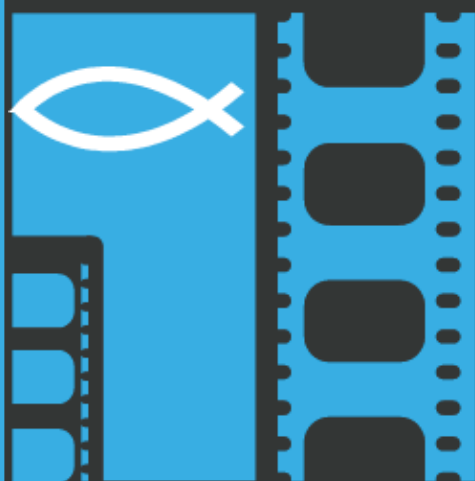
