



Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

What do you Think?

It's a simple question. But, for many Christians, the idea of thinking seems hostile to faith. Many Christians have the wrong conception about faith. Is faith nothing but blind belief? Or, is there a deeper meaning to

The original meaning of the word faith comes from the Greek word, pistis. The definition? Trusting in something for which you have seen the evidence. This may seem at odds with our concept of faith, but it is very Biblical. Look at Hebrews 11 (NKJV):

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. For by it the elders obtained a good testimony. By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.

There is a pesky word in that first verse. Evidence. How can we examine the evidence for God and still find that mystical connection with a God we cannot see? This is the greatest of paradoxes. God calls us to look at his creation in Romans 1. And yet, He calls us to step out on faith like a child. So, faith has equal mixtures of the innocent trust of a child and the seasoned reason of an adult. Bring the two together and we have the kind of faith that will not and cannot be shaken. Why? Because we have seen the evidence. Because we take Jesus' command literally to "Love the Lord with all your heart, your MIND, and your soul"!

Apologist and philosopher J. P. Moreland author of "Love Your God With All Your Mind" says "We need to admit the mind into Christian fellowship again. We need the mind disciplined in Christ, enlightened by faith, passionate for God and his creation, to be let loose in the world."

Perhaps it is time to think again. Perhaps it is time for Christians to engage in the academic pursuit of the most profound and greatest words ever written, the Bible. Perhaps it is time for Christians to bolster their faith with reason and marry the two disciplines that we see in the mind and life of Jesus Christ. Then, when we are asked, "What do you think?" we can carry out a reasonable, rational discussion of the evidence for the God of the Bible. Our faith is NOT blind belief. Our faith is real!

Can you Answer my Question? Is There a Key to Godliness?

Whether you are in your twenties or sixties, you probably have some long-standing heart-responses you don't like. These are like reflexes. You don't choose them. They spring up unintentionally from your heart, usually in response to the people around you.

It may be anger, anxiety, envy, resentment, self-pity, disgust, frustration, discouragement, lust, irritability, impatience, hard-heartedness, brusqueness, unkindness, withdrawnness.

When any one of these attitudes springs up unbidden, you hate it. You have fought it for years with gospel-faithfulness, trusting in the blood of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit to cover it and conquer it.

Still it returns. You weep over it, and ask your closest friends to pray for you. There is a short season of reprieve. And there it is again stamping you. Telling you: This is who you are. You say no. In Christ, this is not who I am. His stamp is on my life. True. But O you would be done with this! O to be new, through and through! Not in such a limited way.

Is there a remedy? Is there a key? No. There are a thousand.

The point of this post is to remind us that "every Scripture is profitable for training in righteousness" so that we might be "complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16–17). Every verse is profitable. Thousands of them.

Do Not Give Up

In other words, you don't know what word of God will suddenly (or gradually) be used by the Holy Spirit to give the long-awaited victory. God has his reasons for why he allows us to fight so long. But he never intends us to give up on Scripture.

Owen wrote his Mortification of Sin. Ryle wrote his Holiness. Bridges has written his Transforming Power of the Gospel. Chapell his Holiness by Grace. Piper his Future Grace. And when they are all done, hundreds of verses remain untouched and profitable. God has said so much more than any of us has said.

Don't give up the fight. God's designs are to bring a surprising verse

into your heart in a surprising moment in a surprising situation and do a surprising work of transformation.

The Immeasurable Moment

For example, you may be reading one morning and see for the hundredth time Psalm 90:12, "So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." And in a way that never happened before you feel how utterly short and fragile and uncertain and precious your life is. You feel, as never before, the connection between a wise way of life and the shortness of life.

And in that surprising awareness of death — that deeply felt awareness — you recall what James says about wisdom. You have never made this connection before in your whole life. You recall that James says, "the wisdom from above is gentle and full of mercy" (James 3:17).

Then you sense what God is doing. All your life, you have struggled with being harsh rather than gentle. Your reflexes are not merciful. And now, God is touching you at a place you have never been touched before. He's making a connection in your heart that you have never made before. The connection between your coming death and your unkindness.

Awakened to a New Possibility

And the point is not that after death you will have to give an account. That's true. But that is not what God is doing now. He is awakening in you a new possibility of life. He is opening you to a kind of gentleness and peace and kindness that could actually begin to feel natural to you. The shadow of your death is softening you. The numbering of your days is shaping in you a humble, gentle, heavenly wisdom. Your heart is actually softening.

This long-standing struggle with the reflexes of hard-heartedness, and unmercifulness, is suddenly (or gradually) different. doing a strange and sweetening and wonderful work.

Will it last? Perhaps. If not, there are 999 more verses waiting to do their surprising work. You do not know what victories await. Read on. Pray on. Believe all things. Hope all things. "Every Scripture" is profitable. God is not done with you.

"O Lord, make me know my end and what is the measure of my days; let me know how fleeting I am!" (Psalm 39:4).



18 Reasons Why Doctors and Lawyers Homeschool Their Children

I'm going public today with a secret I've kept for a year—my husband and I are homeschooling our children. I never dreamed we would. I wanted my kids integrated and socialized, with their eyes opened to the realities of the world. I wanted the values we taught at home put to the test in the real world. But necessity drove me to consider it, and I timidly attended a home school parent meeting last spring. Surprisingly it was full of doctors, lawyers, former public school teachers, and other professionals. These were not the stay-at-home-moms in long skirts that I expected.

An estimated 2.04 million k12 children are home educated in the United States, a 75% increase since 1999. Although currently only 4% of all K12 students nationwide experts are predicting an exponential boom in homeschooling in the next 5-10 years. Most states even provide free online public schools, known as virtual schools or virtual homeschools for K12 students. A useful information site is College@Home.com.

For a year I was afraid to tell any of my work colleagues that we were homeschooling. People would stereotype me as a right-wing kook or assume that I wasn't committed to an academic medical career, and I wasn't sure I could do it well. I feared the whole year would be an academic failure and emotional nightmare, but this week our kids are finishing their curriculum and will spend the rest of the school year doing enrichment activities. Alas, I think we can call this success.

We've had our kids in both public and private schools, but homeschooling has turned out to be the best option for us. Here are 18 reasons why we have joined America's fastest growing educational trend:

- 1) We spend less time homeschooling each day than we used to spend driving. With four kids in four locations last year (including a newborn at home), school drop-off and pick-up took four hours, on a good day. Now we spend about four hours per day homeschooling, instead of four hours in the car.
- 2) We can't afford private education. Even on a doctor's salary, private education has become unaffordable, especially for larger families. Which choice would you make: save for college, save for retirement, or pay private school tuition? Few families can afford all three, and most can only afford one.
- 3) Our kids are excelling academically as homeschoolers. Homeschooling allows us to enrich our children's strengths and supplement their weaknesses. The kids' education moves as fast or as slow as required for that particular subject area. They are not pigeon-holed and tracked as gifted, average, or special needs.
- 4) Homeschooling is not hard, and it's fun! We bought a "box curriculum" from a major homeschool vendor, and all the books and the day-by-day curriculum checklist came in the mail. We have a lot of fun supplementing material through YouTube and online educational sites like Dreambox, Khan Academy, and others. Our kids do about half of their math online.
- 5) *Use whatever public school services you like. Need speech therapy, the gifted program, or remedial academics? Homeschooled kids are still eligible for all these services. Some homeschoolers come into public



school daily for "specials" like art, music, PE, or the school play. Your kids can even join high school sports teams once they are old enough. Our kids are still in sports and scouts sponsored by their old schools.

- 6) I like parenting more, by far. As a mom of school-aged kids, I felt like my role as parent had been diminished to mini-van driver, schedule-keeper, cook and disciplinarian. I was not born, raised and educated to spend my days like this. Now, I love being a mom.
- 7) Our family spends our best hours together. We were giving away our kids during their best hours, and getting them back when they were tired, grumpy and hungry. I dreaded each evening, when the fighting and screaming never seemed to end, and my job was to push them through homework, extracurriculars, and music practice. Now, our kids have happy time together each day. At recess time, the kids are actually excited about playing with each other!
- 8) We yell at our kids less. Homeschooling forces us as parents to maintain a loving authority in the household. We stopped spanking our kids. Spanking and corporal punishment establish fear, not effective, loving obedience.
- 9) Our kids have time for creative play and unique interests. Once my kids entered school, they seemed to stop making up their own creative play together. They didn't have time for creative play during their busy evenings. Now they build forts and crazy contraptions, play dance parties, and pursue their own unique interests
- 10) We are able to work on the kids' behavior and work ethic throughout the day. My son's poor work effort at school was nearly impossible to address. The teachers didn't have time to make my son repeat work they felt was average quality. Finally, we've been able to push him to his full potential.
- 11) Get rid of bad habits, fast. I never really had the time to implement most behavioral techniques when my kids were in school. I knew what I needed to do to get my kindergartner to dress herself, but it was easier to dress her myself. Now, if she takes too long to get dressed, she misses out on free play time.
- 12) Be the master of your own schedule. Homeschooling provides a great deal of family flexibility, which is a tremendous asset. For example, we save a lot of money, even on plane tickets, because we have the flexibility to go places on weekdays. Scheduling anything is eons easier.
- 13) Younger children learn from older siblings. During school time, our four year old sits with our six and eight year old. He wants to do his worksheet, too. Some of that math and phonics work rubs off on him.
- 14) Save money. Committing to homeschooling requires at least one parent at home for most of each day. Although you may lose an income with this commitment, you save (a lot) of money not needing daycare or needing private school for the older children. We also save a lot of money on gas. We pull off homeschooling because I work nights and my husband works part-time from home as an independent IT developer. I know many families homeschooling on family incomes of 40-60K.

Homeschoolers save tax payers money, too. According to The National Home Education Research Institute, homeschoolers saved the taxpayers \$16 billion in 2006.

15) Teach your kids practical life skills. Homeschooled kids learn parenting skills, cooking, budgeting, home maintenance, and time management every day. Time management skills are learned out of necessity. Our kids help with younger siblings while under our direct supervision. What better way is there to learn parenting? I learned to write a fake grocery budget

once as a home economics exercise. My kids write real grocery budgets and help me shop.

16) Better socialization, less unhealthy peer pressure and bullying. Our kids no longer beg for video games we don't want them to have or clothes we don't like. One of our children struggled socially in school, and his schoolmates were ruthlessly mean. Last year he played alone on the playground everyday. Now he's organizing playground games at our homeschool co-op, and he's smiling again. No one has ever said an unkind word to him at our co-op, because every child is there with a parent.

Research continues to show that homeschooled kids do well socially. Our kids have no shortage of time with friends—each week there's homeschool co-op, scouts, piano, religious education.... Add in the birthday parties and field trips, and we find ourselves declining activities to get our homeschooling done!

- 17) Sleep! A research study by National Jewish Health released in March, 2013 showed that homeschooled students get more sleep than their peers who attend school. The result may be that homeschooled kids are better prepared to learn. Parents get more sleep, too! Our mornings are great times together to snuggle with our children and talk about our plans for the day. No more "Hurry up and get your shoes on or you'll be late for school!"
- 18) Teach kids your own values. According to the national center for education statistics, 36% of homeschooling families were primarily motivated by a desire to provide religious or moral instruction. Our family is not part of this 36%. Nevertheless, we've really enjoyed building our own traditions and living out our family values in a way that wasn't possible before. We spend a week celebrating Easter.

Many people have asked me how we do it, how my husband and I both work and homeschool.

Well, after I had my third child, I started working all night shifts as a hospital-based pediatrician which allowed me to be home with my babies and available for school pick-up. Later when my husband resigned his job to start his IT business, and have more family time, homeschooling became a real option.

I sleep (with earplugs!) the mornings after my overnight shifts, and my husband teaches. The other mornings I teach. We complete our core homeschool curriculum on Monday, Tuesdays and Thursdays. On Wednesdays our kids attend a home-school co-op, and on Fridays we take field trips, do special activities, and complete any catch-up work.

Now that we homeschool, everything has become a team effort. Both my husband and I teach, do housework, and make money. Everyone does chores. Walking in each other's shoes has made us more compassionate and less likely to criticize when things don't go right, and we've learned to be better communicators.

Every homeschooling family has their own unique management plan to balance employment, schooling, household needs, and rest time. For us, it's been a work in progress. Will we continue homeschooling through high school? I don't know. But for now, we've found a way for our family to be very happy together, which is my favorite part of homeschooling.

Home School Enrollment Increases Nationwide, According to Report by Bethany Monk / June 10, 2013

It's a fact: an increasing number of parents are choosing to either home school their children, or to enroll them in homeschooling programs.



The number of home-schooled children in the country has increased by 75 percent since 1999, according to a report in Education News. The report also says that achievement gaps related to the income levels, ethnicities and sex of home-school students are not apparent in homeschooling environments.

One of the reasons for the increase in home-school enrollment is due to academic achievement, said CitizenLink Education Analyst Candi Cushman.

"When you consider that we've been pumping lots of money into our public education system with really little to show for it — it's not that surprising," she said. "On the other hand, you have home schoolers regularly scoring highly on achievement tests and being recruited by some of the most elite universities."

There are more than 2 million home schooled children in the United States, according to the National Home Education Research Institute (NHERI). This represents about 4 percent of the nation's school-age children.

Part of the reason for the increase is the fact that a large-number of children who were home schooled in 1990's are now home schooling their own kids, according Dr. Brian Bay of the NHERI.

Among the most common reason for homeschooling, according to NHERI are:

- the customized, individualized curriculum
- the opportunity for enhanced relationships among children, parents and siblings
- a safer environment
- the opportunity to impart a particular set of values, beliefs and worldview

Religious freedom also plays into home schooling's increasing enrollment.

"It seems like we're seeing more and more headlines about schools giving sexually explicit information to children against parents' will or without their knowledge," Cushman explained. "Then you have the same-sex marriage laws being passed in many different states. So that could all affect education. I think we're going to see more parents wanting the freedom to guide their kids along the moral and spiritual values that they're teaching at home."
