One Last Stand for Marriage

If it seems lately that the advocates of same-sex marriage are steamrolling across the country with their agenda, it's because they are. In the past year, they've won 22 court cases in a row striking down state laws that limit marriage to the union of one man and one woman.

The latest of these battles is here in Louisiana. On June 25, before an overflow crowd in federal district court in New Orleans, we presented oral arguments explaining why our state constitution's Defense of Marriage

Amendment should be upheld. Because we expect the Court's ruling by the end of July, we will all know very soon whether Louisiana will be one of the last places in America to preserve traditional marriage.

The plaintiffs in this case, *Robicheaux, et al v. Caldwell, et al*, are like the others nationwide who have brought lawsuits demanding that the will of the people be ignored and unelected federal judges impose same-sex marriage upon their respective states by judicial fiat.

Our marriage amendment here was adopted by a landslide majority of more than 78% of our citizens in 2004, after it was first proposed and put on the statewide ballot by a two-thirds, bipartisan vote of both houses of the Louisiana Legislature. We had to defend the amendment against a court challenge back then too (I also argued that case on behalf of the State), and the Louisiana Supreme Court ultimately ruled unanimously in our favor.

After our victory a decade ago, many thought the issue here was finally resolved. But after the U.S. Supreme Court struck down part of the federal Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) last summer in *U.S. v. Windsor*, the advocates of same-sex marriage were re-energized. In the flurry of new cases, plaintiffs are arguing that the state marriage amendments violate the 14th Amendment of the federal constitution because that provision provides everyone a "fundamental right to marry."

However, while there may be a constitutional right to marry, that has always been understood exclusively as the right to marry one person—of the opposite sex. And, over the past two centuries, the various limitations on that arrangement (such as prohibitions against marrying close family members, minor children, etc.) are matters that have always been left to the sovereign will of the people in each state.

Indeed, the Supreme Court reaffirmed in *Windsor*: "By history and tradition the definition and regulation of marriage... has been treated as being within the authority and realm of the separate States." That was the very justification given by the Court in its decision to strike the DOMA provision and, consequently, uphold the State of New York's ballot initiative allowing for same-sex marriage there.

Ironically, the same activists who applauded the decision to uphold New York's ballot outcome are now howling that the 34 other states (including Louisiana) that voted the other way somehow acted in violation of the Constitution. The intellectual inconsistency of those activists is staggering.

The question today is not whether we will have same-sex marriage in some of the United States—we already do—but whether the matter will be decided by popular vote in the democratic process or by decree from a



handful of unelected federal judges. Our position is clear: only the people of each state should have such authority.

Advocates of same-sex marriage are not enemies of the State. They are American citizens too, and deserve every courtesy and opportunity to express their views and to try to convince others of their position. But both sides in this democratic debate must be civil, and the homosexual activists should not demean the vast majority of Christians and other Americans who believe that marriage, as it has been defined for thousands of years, is worthy of preservation.

Religion and morality aside, it is not bigotry to sincerely believe that traditional marriage is good for societal stability. After all, traditional marriage is structured around the biological reality that only opposite sex couples naturally procreate, and states do well to link children to an intact family formed by their biological parents. Moms and dads are both important, not just because God designed it that way, but because social science affirms this truth and most rational people understand it inherently.

Millions of Americans are also rightly concerned about what might happen if these critical boundaries on marriage are erased. If the plaintiffs are correct that the State has no authority to regulate marriage, where would we then draw the line? Would first cousins have the right to marry? A father and his daughter? An uncle and his nephew? A 20-year-old man and a 13-year-old girl? If the "right to marry" is determined to have no rational boundary, chaos is certain to follow.

So long as objectivity is applied, we ought to win our case this month. Please pray that we do. As Supreme Court Justice Samuel Alito summarized in *Windsor*, "Same-sex marriage presents a highly emotional and important question of public policy—but not a difficult question of constitutional law."

Review of Kenneth Samples book,
7 Truths That Changed the World
Dangerous Idea #5: Not by Works

Hatred and current war among Iraqi factions, Soviet aggression in Ukraine, malaria, starvation, abject poverty, tsunamis, hurricanes, IRS corruption, crime, strokes, heart attacks and cancer; all make this life uncertain, even miserable for billions. The afflicted need relief, some kind of salvation. Some time ago I reviewed several chapters of Dr. Kenneth Samples book, *7 Truths That Changed the World*, but not this important one until now. Different religions agree on the need for salvation but vastly differ on its meaning and how salvation might be achieved:

Islam teaches that humans are born good having free will to choose between good and evil. The will of Allah was entrusted to the prophet, Muhammad, who recorded in the Koran, or Qur'an he alone wrote. A Muslim is one who submits through faith, prayer and charity to the will of Allah. Among the good deeds are the five pillars of Islam: 1) Reciting the Shahada—"There is no god but Allah and Muhammad is the prophet of Allah." 2) Ritual prayer five times daily facing Mecca. 3) Fasting during the month of Ramadan. 4) Almsgiving (2.5%). 5) Hajj, a one-time pilgrimage to Mecca. Accordingly, each individual will ultimately be judged for his good and bad deeds in this life. When the final tally is weighed in the balance of final judgment, the reward of paradise is considered rightly earned and Hell a just punishment.

Hinduism promotes dharma, or right conduct through righteousness, moral law and duty. The individual soul in this life reaps the consequences of accumulated actions called karma. At death, the soul "transmigrates" to

another body, even into some other animal according to the type of karma acquired. Bad karma can be worked off through reincarnation into lesser species. The goal of Hinduism is to release the soul from the cycle of death and rebirth. Moksha is achieved when the soul reunites with Brahman, the universal reality.

Buddhism regards suffering not as a real thing but as a wrongful state of mind. The right state of mind, Nirvana, can be achieved through the eight-fold path attaining wisdom, ethical conduct and right-mindedness. The eightfold path is 1) Right view-seeing reality as it is, not as the suffering it appears to be. 2) Right intention-renouncing desire. 3) Right speech-truthful and non-hurtful. 4) Right action-non harmful. 5) Right livelihood-non harmful. 6) Right effort-making progress. 7) Right mindfulness-aware of reality without craving. 8) Right concentration-meditation.

Each of these religions shares self-reliance and good works as the means to salvation. According to Ken Samples, Christianity's dangerous idea, Not by Works, comes from God Himself. It was revealed by His prophets, His scriptures, and His Son, not man's opinion. Our good works are to God like filthy rags (Isaiah 64:6) when compared to a completely Holy and just God. Dr. Samples says Not by Works stands at odds with the so-called spiritual consensus of humanity that God accepts people on the basis of their own efforts.

In Christianity it is sin which separates us from God, because He says so (Romans 3:10; Psalm 14:3). Only by the unmerited grace of God can we receive forgiveness of our sin, by accepting Jesus' substitutionary atonement as the perfect sacrifice on our behalf (Eph. 2:8,9). Grace undeserving through faith reliably revealed by God is the only means of salvation (John 14:6). Praise be to God!

God's price for sin.

Romans 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

Who paid the price?

Romans 5:8 "But God showed his great love for us by sending

Christ to die for us while we were still sinners."

The only way out.

Romans 10:9-10 "For if you tell others with your own mouth that Jesus Christ is your Lord and believe in your own heart that God has raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in his heart that a man becomes right with God; and with his mouth he tells others of his faith, confirming his salvation"

Take God at his word and claim His promise for your salvation.

Romans 10:13 "Anyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved."

And pass this along: When one passes the road marker that says "Saved," it's important to take a picture of it by being baptized. A Bible too, will be like a good map for the rest of the ride. Romans 9:33 says "Those who believe in Him will never be disappointed." JMc, Editor

By Andrew Ingerson**

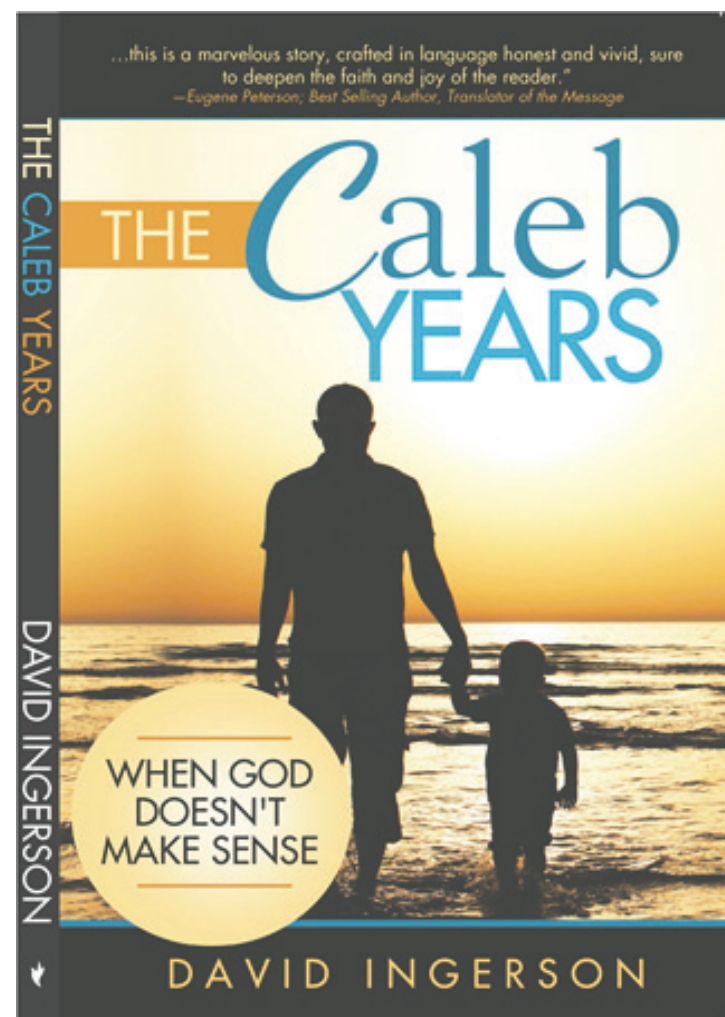

From A Vision to Reality

His love of God has translated into helping others help themselves.

Birthing the Vision

Through the desire to help others help themselves, an important community outreach plan was conceived by local pastor Ron Hampton. At the time he was working as a Chaplain/Community Liaison with the Shreveport-Bossier Rescue Mission. His thought? How would you let people who need them, know about the services the Mission offered— services that could transition the homeless to wholeness? These services included discipleship training, educational services, work study, health and wellness education, job search, drug rehabilitation resources and social services— all available to those struggling in these areas. His idea? Take it to the streets...

Back in 2009, when the concept was presented to Rescue Mission Executive Director, Rev. Henry Martin, Men’s Programming Director, Jim Brackman, and the Rev. Eddie Rivera, everyone thought it was a great idea. Pastor Hampton and Rev. Rivera were then placed on staff with the Rescue Mission to plan and implement the project. They decided to call it “Takin’ It to the Streets.”

Putting It to the Test

The first “Takin’ It to the Streets” community outreach was held October 30 of that same year and was hosted by Evergreen Baptist Church in the Allendale community of Shreveport. It was attended by over 1500 residents. Thirty people gave their life to Christ, several requested prayer and many were reunited into Christian fellowship. Over 100 volunteers and 35 local ministries and resource organizations partnered with the mission to put it on. One of the many partners in that project was Shreveport Community Church, who provided the music ministry of their youth choir and also renowned artist “**Forever Jones** and **Jeoff Benward**.” They also provided a Kid Zone for children attending. It was a great success, and the seed was planted for future community outreach projects.



A Change in Plans but Continued Success

Due to financial constraints, the Shreveport-Bossier Rescue Mission, after just four “Takin’ It to the Streets” events, could no longer financially subsidize the project. Everyone realized the need and saw the importance of the project’s purpose - to assist individuals and families with improving their quality of life and building strong spiritual foundations. The project had to go on...

With the blessing of the Mission’s Executive Director, Henry Martin, Pastor Hampton took over the responsibilities of continuing this outreach. Thus, “Takin’ It to the Streets, Inc.” was formed as an independent non-profit organization. A Board of Directors was established which included Ernest and Tina Palmisano, Rev. Terrance Trammel, Rev. Eddie Rivera, Jan Core, Gwen Tennell, Washington, DC registered agent, Rev. Jermaine Randall and Maryland registered agent, Rev. Dr. John Shropshire.

Though “Takin It to The Streets” is no longer a project of the Shreveport-Bossier Rescue Mission, it continues to be one of the strongest supporters of this effort and participates in each local event.

New Vision Community Church, at 727 Flournoy Lucas Road in Shreveport now serves as headquarters for “Takin’ It to the Streets, Inc.” The organization is in the process of starting a community food distribution center there in cooperation with the NWLA Food Bank.

Shreveport is home base for the organization, but “Takin’ It to the Streets, Inc.” now has chapters holding events in Forestville, Maryland, Passaic and Garfield, New Jersey (provided three Hurricane Sandy relief efforts)



and Washington, D.C. An event was also held in Arlington, VA.

Pleased with what God has accomplished, Pastor Hampton asserts that each community outreach event has continued to draw massive crowds, averaging 2000-3000 attendees with over 300 volunteers and more than 150 ministries and resource groups as partners. At all times during the event, ministers are roaming the grounds engaging participants in conversation and prayer by providing them a listening ear.

A Great Sense of Gratitude

Pictured below is Rev Ron, as he is affectionately called. He understands and *appreciates* the concept of team play. “Without all of the ministries, donors, support groups and volunteers who join together in this effort, there would be no “takin’ it, anywhere,” he says. “These people have a



heart of compassion for those struggling too. Together we’re here to serve in any way we can, because we are a ‘community coalition’ convicted to serve those Jesus considers ‘the least of them.’”

Summing it up this way, Pastor Hampton says, “To date, “Takin’ It to the Streets, Inc.” has served over 55,000 people with hot meals and various services. Over 7,000 have given their lives to Christ, and 15,000 have reunited in Christian fellowship. There have been thousands of volunteers, ministry and social service organizations as partners and a limited, but dedicated group of financial contributors.”
