

## **Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth**

#### **Christianity's Dangerous Ideas**

A review of Kenneth Samples book
7 Truths That Changed the World
Dangerous idea #6
Humanity has Value and Dignity

Two hundred years ago, the German philosopher, Friederich Nietzsche, proclaimed, "God is dead". He believed the science of his day had relegated God to mythical status since astronomy (Copernicus) had shown the earth to have no special place in the cosmos and biology had shown humans to be the product of evolution (Darwin). Accordingly, he also recognized the implication that without God, we are just adrift in space while living lives without ultimate meaning, purpose or value (nihilism). He also recognized that without God there was no objective foundation for morality and believed that humans therefore must create their own morals.

In our present day, Peter Singer, a bioethicist at Princeton University, also rejects God's existence and the notion of human dignity and the sanctity of human life. Without moral laws based on the perfect nature of God, Singer believes a more utilitarian, or practical ethic, should be followed; the greatest good, or preferences, for the greatest number of people, whatever those preferences may be. Following his worldview of naturalism (nothing supernatural exists), he advocates for late term abortion, infanticide, euthanasia and animal rights. He even believes that some animals have more value than disabled or mentally handicapped humans. He regards some animals as persons. After all, according to Darwin, we do not differ from other species in kind but only in degree, being just a little further along the evolutionary pathway. Such is the outcome of secular humanist thought that has invaded our society.

Christianity holds a different view of humanity's worth, however, and grounds this value in the biblical narrative of human creation: "Then God said, 'let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness'...so God created mankind in his own image... Male and female, He created them." (Gen 1:

26-27) Only humans, according to the Bible, bear this image of God, in Latin, the imago Dei. Not identical to God, we are unlike Him in his self-existent, all-powerful, all-knowing and other qualities, but being created in his image, we are like God in many other ways. Dr. Samples identifies six important similarities that humans have to God. Briefly they are:

- 1. Human beings are spiritual, thus they have a component of non-physical being we call the soul.
- 2. We are personal, self-conscious and rational thus having mind, will and emotion.
- 3. We are volitional and capable of making independent decisions for which we are morally accountable.
- 4. We are relational forming unique relationships with fellow humans and with God Himself.
- 5. We are immortal and have an eternal destiny with or without God.
- 6. Humans are powerful having control and custodianship over the natural order, the earth around us.

Dr. Samples points out that our moral dimension of being created in God's image was present only briefly, being entirely lost in Adam's fall but capable of restoration with a saving relationship with Jesus Christ. When that happens we can develop Christ-like qualities and become kind, forgiving, gracious and merciful although never to the degree God possesses these qualities.

The stage is now set to explore different outcomes of morality based on the opposing world views of naturalism, (secular humanism or atheism) and Christianity. The former imparts no inherent value in humans except as custom decides and the latter states that inherent worth and dignity are conferred to humans because they are created in God's image. The Bible issues strong prohibitions against injury, even slander of another human being (James 3: 9) because of this. Next month, let's explore how these differing views relate to the important issues of our day, abortion and euthanasia.

I said, "Well, God could have very easily blown those planes off course by a little puff of wind, and he didn't do it. Therefore God was right there ordaining that this happen, because he could have stopped it just like that." Everybody who believes in God should say that, because that is how powerful he is, as it was said of Jesus, "The winds obey him" (Matthew 8:27). And so just a simple wind by the command of Jesus would have blown those planes away and they would have crashed and 60 people would have died instead of thousands of people. But he didn't do that. Why is it comforting to believe that?

The answer is because there are 10,000 orphans who wonder if they have a future. Will they have a future if God isn't powerful for them? I'm coming to those families and I'm saying when they ask me, "Do you think God ordained the death of my daddy?" I say, "Yes. The Lord gives and the Lord takes away. Blessed be the name of the Lord. But the very power by which God governs all evils enables him to govern your life. And he has total authority to turn this and every other evil in your life for your everlasting good. And that's your only hope in this world and in the next. And therefore, if you sacrifice the sovereignty of God in order to get him off the hook in the death of your daddy, you sacrifice everything. You don't want to go there."

The sovereignty of God, while creating problems for his involvement in sin and evil, is the very rock-solid foundation that enables us to carry on in life. Where would we turn if we didn't have a God to help us deal with the very evils that he has ordained come into our lives? So yes, absolutely, I believe in the sovereignty of God and I believe in its comforting effects. ©2013 Desiring God Foundation. Used by Permission.

## Keeping the Doors of Electronic Media Open for the Spread of the Gospel

Each year, as the winter's end draws near, thousands of Christians gather for the annual National Religious Broadcasters (NRB) Convention & Exposition to develop and renew relationships, and to connect with new tools, services, ideas and inspiration that can advance their organizations and themselves.

Among the participants are radio and TV station owners and operators, pastors, church media professionals, radio and TV program producers, college educators, students, film producers, web and mobile developers, social media managers, marketing representatives, and ministry staff members

Though diverse, members of NRB and participants at the association's annual convention are united by purpose.

"It's a group of men and women committed to using every electronic media platform available to them to reach the world for Jesus Christ," explains NRB President & CEO Dr. Frank Wright. "It's the embodiment of

the body of Christ that we see at the Convention."

While many tend to think only of radio and television stations upon hearing "National Religious Broadcasters," the international association of Christian communicators is an exciting blend of all forms of electronic mass media: radio and television stations, program producers, film companies, worship technologies, media arts, music-only broadcasting, internet communications, emerging technologies, and affiliated media-related agencies and groups that support religious broadcasters.

Members of NRB include leading Christian organizations such as Answers in Genesis, the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, BreakPoint, Campus Crusade for Christ, Focus on the Family, Gospel for Asia, Life-Way Christian Resources, the Luis Palau Association, Open Doors, Precept Ministries International, The Salvation Army, and World Vision.

Ministries and churches of some of the nation's most prominent pastors are also among NRB's growing membership, including those of Jack Graham, Tony Evans, Chip Ingram, Robert Jeffress, Greg Laurie, Crawford Loritts, Erwin Lutzer, John MacArthur, James McDonald, Charles Stanley, Chuck Swindoll, Rick Warren, and Ed Young.

Together, the members of NRB recognize how electronic media has an extraordinary impact on the world today and can be utilized to bring the claims of Christ to people desperately in need of Truth.

They also understand that the remarkable impact of Christian media must be viewed next to equally dramatic emerging threats to the rights and freedoms of Christian broadcasters and communicators.

In fact, it was the threat of silencing religious freedoms that birthed NRB

nearly seven decades ago.

#### Access to Airwayes Threatened; Christian Broadcasters Unite

In the early 1940s, the emerging culture of hostility in America between so-called mainline Protestant denominations and the rapidly growing Evangelical Christian movement had reached a crisis phase in the world of radio broadcasting. Protestant denominational leaders argued for regulations that would restrict access to the radio broadcast spectrum. They claimed independent Evangelical preachers who were unaccountable to

any denominational entity could not be trusted with the public airwaves.

In those early years of radio broadcasting, pioneer Evangelical broadcasters including William Ward Ayer, Paul Rader, Donald Grey Barnhouse, Walter Maier, and Charles Fuller had built radio audiences in the millions and were faithfully proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ. By 1942, The Lutheran Hour was receiving more mail than the well-known Amos 'n Andy radio program, and The Old Fashioned Revival Hour was the largest program on the Mutual Broadcasting System, purchasing 50% more airtime than the next largest secular broadcaster. In that same year, the Mutual Broadcasting System received more than 25% of its total revenue from religious broadcasters.

Yet in 1943, the Federal Council of Churches (later renamed the National Council of Churches) supported proposed regulations that would result in every Evangelical broadcaster being taken off the national radio networks. They demanded that religious broadcasting should only be aired as a public service during free or "sustaining" time donated by the radio networks. They further argued that these public service slots should only be allocated to "responsible" religious broadcasters that had been approved by local and national denominational councils – like themselves.

The Federal Council of Churches was eventually able to persuade all three national radio networks – NBC, CBS, and the Mutual Broadcasting System – to adopt the proposed regulations. Subsequently every Evangelical Christian broadcaster was taken off the national radio networks, with their only access being small independent stations with a very limited audience.

In response to this challenge, 150 Evangelical Christian broadcasters and church leaders held a series of meetings that led to the formation of the National Religious Broadcasters. In the fall of 1944, members of NRB adopted their Constitution, Bylaws, Statement of Faith, and Code of Ethics. And thus began a multi-year effort by NRB to build credibility for Evangelical broadcasters, to secure their fair share of the available public interest slots, and to overturn the ban on the purchase of radio airtime for religious broadcasting.

In 1949, that effort bore fruit as the newly formed ABC radio network reversed the ban on paid religious broadcasting, with the other networks following their lead. In a few short years, Evangelical radio broadcasters were again a dynamic and growing presence on major radio networks, with scores of new programs serving a vast national audience.

#### NRB Today: Advancing, Promoting, Defending

Seven decades later, the Christian multi-media association birthed by these visionary radio broadcasters operates in a far more complex electronic media environment, while retaining its original focus of defending and expanding access to electronic media platforms for the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Today, the designation of historic Christian teaching as hate speech, the demand that religious entities hire unbelievers in key staff positions, and the threat to Christian free speech by statutorily re-imposing the so-called "Fairness Doctrine" are examples of significant contemporary threats to the interests and rights of Christian broadcasters.

The unity of purpose shared by NRB members, however, has allowed the association to speak with a strong voice on issues regarding access to electronic media platforms and the freedom to broadcast the Gospel.

In recent years, NRB has had a great deal of success advocating for issues that directly connect to Christian broadcasting regulation and religious freedom, both domestically and throughout the world.

NRB Senior Vice President & General Counsel Craig Parshall worked with Senate leaders in drafting a religious freedom amendment designed to protect faith-based communicators from being wrongly prosecuted under the new federal hate crimes law simply because of their faith-based viewpoints. That amendment was part of the final legislation passed by Congress and signed into law.

NRB has also served as a go-to voice for Capitol Hill on the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA)'s chilling effect to religious liberty, testifying at a number of hearings in the past few Congresses. In addition, NRB has pressed government leaders to respect religious liberty overseas, particularly in the recent cases of detained Pastors Youcef Nadarkhani and Saeed Abedini in Iran, as well as Pastor Makset Djabbarbergenov in Kazakhstan. To date, two of these three pastors have been released.

Efforts are presently underway, through the NRB's John Milton Project for Free Speech, to discourage new media giants like Apple, Google and Facebook from blocking viewpoints with which they don't agree, and to encourage them to instead voluntarily adopt policies based on historic and well-understood First Amendment free speech principles. NRB is also awaiting the Federal Communications Commission (FCC)'s adoption of a new rule change proposed by the association that would allow non-commercial radio and TV stations to use up to 1% of their air-time to conduct fundraisers for third-party non-profit groups recognized under IRS code §501(c)(3) – a practice currently forbidden in the absence of special permission.

"NRB is one of those organizations that stand in the gap for our organization," notes Jeff Young, Assistant Professor of Communications and Director of Technical Productions at Louisiana College in Pineville.

"We do not have the time or the money to be at all of the FCC meetings or watch the IRS or even Congress. We depend on our NRB representatives to watch out and report for us. They do that reporting very well," adds Young, who was recently elected to serve as Chairman of NRB's Intercollegiate Standing Committee. "In most cases, they write papers, briefs and opinions about topics that affect every member of NRB."

Meanwhile, NRB continues to foster unity among its members, promoting their passion to share knowledge and find solutions to challenges, thereby increasing excellence in their craft. The association also embraces and continues to grow with developing media that enable greater access for the Gospel.

Next year, NRB will mark its 70th anniversary as an association. Its next convention will be held in Nashville, TN, February 22-25, 2014.
