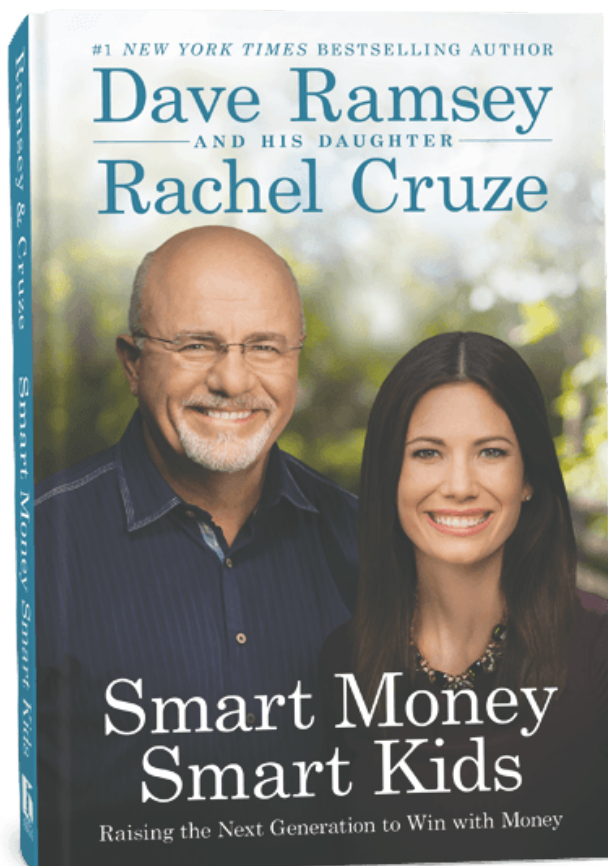

Dobson Lawsuit Update: A Big Initial Win

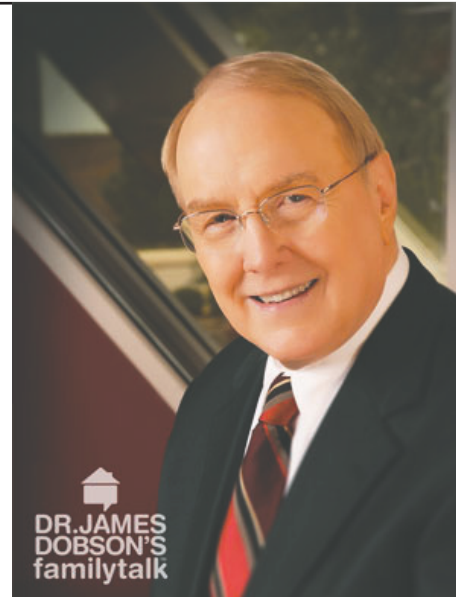
Dear Friends,

Let me share some good news with you. Perhaps this has already reached you because it was carried on Fox News, the Associated Press, the mainstream media and most newspapers. I'll tell you anyway. We at Family Talk are celebrating and thanking the Lord for the victories of this past weekend. We won our case against Sebelius, et. al., and the Obama Administration. Judge Blackburn wrote a powerful statement, which even used pro-life language, (i.e., referring to a "human fetus.").

He defended my right to follow the dictates of my conscience. It was eloquent. The mandate requiring that we provide abortifacients, including the morning after pill, would have begun on May 1st. After that, if we hadn't prevailed, fines amounting to \$800,000 per year would have kicked in. We would have closed our doors.

Alan Sears is president of the Alliance Defending Freedom, which handled our case along with attorney, Martin Nussbaum; and we are grateful to them for all they did on our behalf. Alan said this is one of the most significant religious liberty cases in American history because never before has a citizen been required by the Chief Executive to take the life of another human being. Although the ruling is called a "preliminary injunction," it is not tentative. If the government chooses to appeal to the Tenth Circuit Court, it is one of the most moderate in the country, and even if they accept the case and overturn the decision, it would be sent back to the judge that issued the ruling this week. We've also bought considerable time, and the language of the judgment is powerful.

The Fox News article contained this flashback from a letter I wrote in 2012: "I believe in the rule of law, and it has been my practice since I was in college to respect and honor those in authority over us. It is my desire to do so now. However, this assault on the sanctity of human life takes me where I cannot go. I WILL NOT pay the surcharge for abortion ser-



vices. The amount of the surcharge is irrelevant. To pay one cent for the killing of babies is egregious to me, and I will do all I can to correct a government that lies to me about its intentions and then tries to coerce my acquiescence with extortion. It would be a violation of my most deeply held convictions to disobey what I consider to be the principles in Scripture. The Creator will not hold us guiltless if we turn a deaf ear to the cries of His innocent babies. So come and get me if you must, Mr. President. I will not bow before your wicked regulation."

That's not all. We won another significant battle on Thursday. The Democrats in the Colorado State Senate tried to ram through an outrageous abortion bill at the end of the session. It would have prevented parental notification, reduced medical oversight of clinics, and contained other draconian measures. Democrats hold an 18 to 17 majority, and they had the votes to pass the bill. We bombarded the Senate with calls by announcing the danger on the Internet, and Democrats ran for the tall grass. One senator admitted they feared the election results. The Denver Post this morning carried a headline that said, "Colorado Senate Democrats Spike Abortion Bill."

"What (Democrats) ran into was a firestorm of public dissent. Period. A firestorm of public opposition to this political hatchet job is what Senate Bill 175 was. They got called on it--and they put this entire institution into significant turmoil," said Senate Minority Leader Bill Cadman, R-Colorado Springs.

We can win some of these battles to defend righteousness if God's people will stand and fight.

This time, they did.

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

My thoughts on the Ham v. Nye debate

Many have undertaken to write their thoughts on the recent debate between Ken Ham of Answers in Genesis and Bill Nye the Science Guy. Here are some of the takeaways that I received from the debate, which is now available on the internet.

The debate centered on the question, "Is creation a viable model of origins in today's modern, scientific era?" One of the problems with debates such as this is that the statement of the question or resolution immediately placed all the burden of proof on the affirmative, in this case presented by Ken Ham. Bill Nye was left in the very comfortable position of taking the negative case, which mainly consisted of taking potshots at the affirmative case of Ken Ham.

One of Ken Ham's central points was that there is a difference in how science is approached between Evolutionists and Creationists. Ham called this the distinction between operational and historical science. Operational science is what can be determined through direct observation and testing.

Historical science concerns the processes of the past and is subject to interpretation. I believe Ken Ham presents a false distinction between historical and operational science. The logical conclusion to Ham's science dichotomy is that we really can know nothing objectively about what happened in the past which can actually encompass what happened yesterday. Bill Nye quite rightly pointed out that what happens on any of the CSI television programs as forensic investigation is historical science. Ken Ham actually contradicted his own case by stating that the idea of uniform processes comes to us from the Bible. Those uniform processes should allow us to make conclusions about what happened in the past, including the study of origins. Ham's approach is a double-edged sword as evidenced

by his statement that we cannot observe the age of the earth. That makes Nye's model of an old-earth suspect in Ham's estimation. But, it also puts Ham's young-earth interpretation as being unprovable as well.

Bill Nye, stating the negative case, asked in his first speech, "Does Ken Ham's creation story hold up?"

Ken Ham had the opportunity to present a comprehensive case for his creation model. One of the important facets of a model is that it makes predictions about what future scientific discoveries will find to either support or disprove the model. Bill Nye continually asked Ham what predictions his model would make. It is a reasonable question and Ken Ham's young-earth creationist model makes predictions. However, Ham never took the opportunity to make predictions of what research will find in the future. It was a serious mistake.

Who won the debate? Ken Ham failed to present a comprehensive model for origins which makes predictions subject to testing. Because of this, the question of whether creation is a viable model for origins was never really answered. Bill Nye made Ham's assertions the target. He also presented evidence for an Earth that is older than 6,000 years from astronomy, ice core drilling, tree rings, and the existence of older civilizations. Ken Ham's retort to such evidence was "You weren't there."

This debate presented an opportunity to present a case for an absolute beginning of the universe, design in nature, and the origin of biological information, consciousness, and logic. Ken Ham did not make a comprehensive case for their origin in a Creator. Bill Nye spent his time almost reflexively gainsaying everything Ham asserted.

Neither man nor position won that night.

Bill Nye began his second rebuttal by saying "I am not satisfied." Neither was I.

One generation will commend your works to another.—Psalm 145:4

Titus 2:3-5 is the foundational verse for Woman to Woman Mentoring: *"Likewise, teach the older women to be reverent in the way they live, not to be slanderers or addicted to much wine, but to teach what is good. Then they can train the younger women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God."*

Paraphrased: Mentoring is simply teaching what you've been taught so you can train the next generation.

You don't have to be a Bible scholar or a senior citizen to be a mentor. If you love the Lord and have seen Him at work in your life, then God's mandate is to share this with someone. It's easy to become en-

veloped by the world's call on our life and forget God's instructions to invest in the next generation—they are the future of the church!

CHM and the Affordable Care Act

Christian Healthcare Ministries is an eligible option for individuals under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), also known as Obamacare.

That means that CHM members don't have to pay a penalty for not having health insurance.

We're sometimes asked at Christian Healthcare Ministries how CHM fits within the PPACA, more commonly known as Obamacare. There are a great many opinions, pro and con, on Obamacare. The three most common questions we receive are:

- *Will I be penalized by the government if I'm a member of your ministry?*
 - *How can I be sure CHM is an eligible option under the ACA?*
 - *Where does it say that a health cost sharing ministry is allowable?*
- Here is the PPACA text dealing with health care sharing ministries:*

(I) ...described in section 501 (c)(3) and is exempt from taxation under section 501 (a),

(II) members of which share a common set of ethical or religious beliefs and share medical expenses among members in accordance with those beliefs and without regard to the State in which a member resides or is employed,

(III) members of which retain membership even after they develop a medical condition,

(IV) which (or a predecessor of which) has been in existence at all times since December 31, 1999, and medical expenses of its members have been shared continuously and without interruption since at least December 31, 1999, and

(V) which conducts an annual audit which is performed by an independent certified public accounting firm in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and which is made available to the public upon request.

CHM received notification from the federal government's Department of Health and Human Services that says, "...the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has determined that Christian Healthcare Ministries has submitted sufficient information to substantiate its compliance with the standards specified in section 5000A(d)(2)(B)(ii) of the Code [i.e. the PPACA] and will be considered a health care sharing ministry for the purposes of subpart G of 45 CFR part 155."

There you have it. This is information you can share with friends, with your health care providers (should they ask), and anyone else. I hope this is helpful to you. With all the confusion and turmoil surrounding health care coverage and insurance we see in the media virtually every day, it's important for you to know that none of it affects CHM members.

As a CHM member, you will have done what you need to do to meet the requirements of the law, what you need to do to meet this critical life need, and in a way that shows the world this testimony of Christian love.

All in all, a good position in which to be.

Casseroles, Cookies, and Christ:

A Plea for Mentors

The years God has given you are a sacred trust from Him.

I was happy to be meeting with a new young church member for a cup of tea. She was bright, talented, and her devotion to Christ was sincere. But it quickly became evident she had something on her mind that was hard for her to verbalize.

“I want to ask you something,” she said, blushing. Even with my encouragement, it took her a few tries before she finally blurted out, “I want to spend more time with you. I want to go beyond our women’s ministry meetings and see how you do real life. Could I possibly do errands with you? Help you with your garden or other responsibilities around the house? Maybe drive you to one of your ministry events?”

Oh my, what an endearing, head-shaking offer! And it is not because I am some sort of saint. The truth is, I’m just old! Or at least old—er! (What’s your definition of old, anyway?) She knew I had walked paths that she was just starting to step foot on. She needed me to call back to her, to tell her she’d find Jesus in her journey, and that He was worth every penny, every tear, every effort expended. She wanted to hear my stories—the victories and the failures, and God’s nearness through it all.

Let me speak to the older women. No matter what your age or stage of life, there are women younger than you. And that age difference brings with it a responsibility. The years God has given you are a sacred trust from Him. Steward the experience of those years well.

The young women around us need us—want us! They are hungry for authenticity. They want to be honest and open with someone they can trust (Ruth 1:16; 1 John 1:7). They have questions to ask and burdens to be shared (Gal. 6:2; Isa. 50:4). They have ministries to develop and gifts to use (Eph. 4:12; Rom. 12:6). They need encouragement to embrace the challenge of hard work and hear of its rewards (2 Chron. 15:7; Ecc. 9:10a). Who will tell them if we don’t? Our women’s meetings often focus on the truly important role of homemaking. After all, the home is the basic unit of society, ordained and sustained by Him (Ps. 127; Pro. 24:3–4). Casseroles and cookies are great topics of conversations! Disciplined home management is worthy of our efforts.

But let’s take it deeper than that. Let’s be willing to go beyond bringing a casserole to that new mother, or baking cookies for our next women’s ministry meeting, because ultimately, it’s a woman’s faith that matters most (Pro. 31:30b). Whenever we gather as women, let’s make Jesus the focus—His grace, His power, His care for us. Let’s leave with His name on our lips

and His Word in our hearts.

There’s a whole generation of brave, smart, dedicated young women who want to change their world for Christ’s sake. They want to wrestle with theology, and serve in their community, and pester God with prayer needs (in the most biblical sort of persistent way—Isa. 62:6-7; Luke 18:1–8). And they don’t want to do it alone.

You don’t need to be a celebrity speaker or a renowned author or Bible teacher. You just need to know Jesus. You need to be able to tell “the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done” (Ps. 78:4). If you can’t verbalize how He has worked in your own life yet, why not read a Christian biography together and talk about the wonders He did for that believer, asking Him to be mighty in your lives as well. How might He answer?

Let’s be “hope-setters” for the women in our spheres of influence.

Will you wrestle and serve and pray with these precious ones? Ask God for a younger woman to befriend. Let her help you make cookies and casseroles and share Christ together while you do it! Let’s not let it become an either/or—let’s work to make it a both/and! Think of the joy of bringing casseroles and baking cookies and all the while going deeper with Christ together.

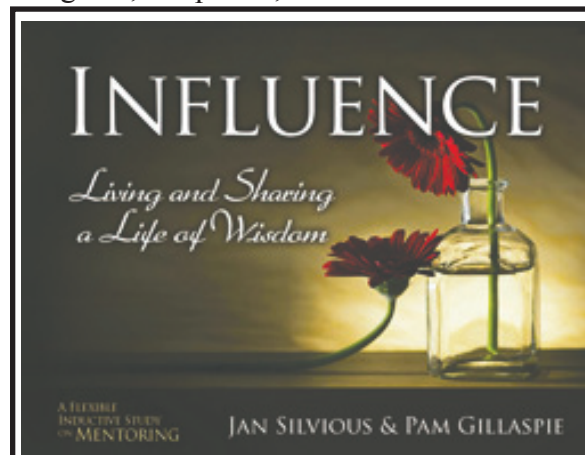
Let’s be “hope-setters” for the women in our spheres of influence. I wonder what He will do through you and in you “that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, so that they should set their hope in God” (Ps. 78:6–7a).

Never Grocery Shop Alone

It's time to grocery shop. I've made my list, checked my budget, and clipped my coupons. There's only one thing left to do—call a teenager. What? You don't take teenagers with you on your weekly runs to the grocery store? Let me encourage you to start.

For years, I've been passionate about mentoring younger women. God has given me a hunger for living out the principles of modeling godliness and training younger women laid out by Titus 2. I've focused most of my efforts in this area toward the teenagers I encounter at my church.

Despite my passion, for many years I struggled to make time for mentoring. With a busy work and family life, I found it really tough to carve out the time needed to take girls out to lunch, attend their school and sporting events, and engage them through individual counseling and Bible study. Despite my best intentions, I just couldn't keep up with the demands on my time that mentoring required.

Then I discovered the secret—never grocery shop alone. Now I make a conscious decision to invite girls to come with me as I run my routine errands. I take them grocery shopping with me. I invite them to hang out with me at home on days when I have nothing more exciting or spiritual to do than laundry and cleaning. I ask them to come over and help me cook dinner. And you know what? They love it.

I've stopped trying to schedule mentoring. I'm done trying to model godliness from inside Starbucks. I simply invite girls into every crevice of my life. I live transparently in front of them, and I work hard not to miss any teachable moments when the opportunity to speak God's truth in love presents itself.

The payoff is two-fold. Lessons about maintaining a godly home, loving my husband, raising godly kids, and serving those around me are better learned by doing than by hearing. Modeling is a better teaching tool than preaching. Because of that, I am able to impact the lives of the girls I mentor more effectively. The payoff for me is sustainability. I have time to mentor because I weave it into the fabric of my real life. I can't imagine that I'll stop going to the grocery store, cleaning my house, or cooking dinner for my family any time soon. Every one of those activities provides a built in opportunity for me to live out Titus 2 in front of a pair of younger eyes.

You can be a Titus 2 woman. You can have a huge impact on the next generation. You can be a truth speaker to the young women around you who need it so desperately. It all starts in the produce aisle.

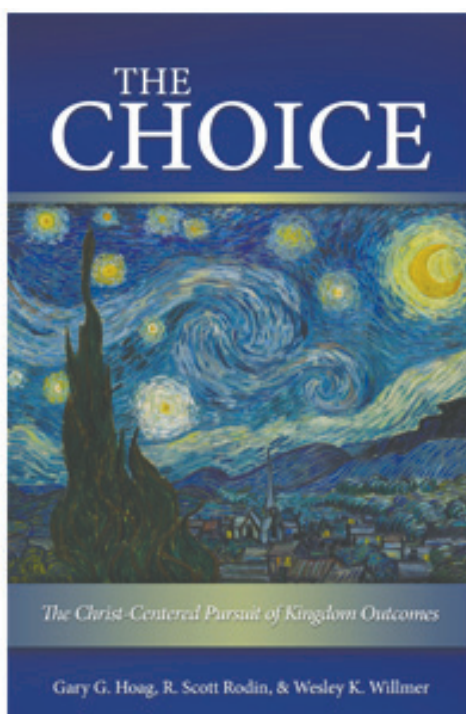
