### Morally Produced Shingles Vaccine Approved in Both US and Canada

LARGO, Fla., Oct. 25, 2017 / Christian Newswire/ -- Children of God for Life announced today that the long-awaited, morally produced shingles vaccine has

received FDA approval for licensing in the US. Shingrix, made by Glaxo SmithKline (GSK) pharmaceutical company is produced using a yeast cell line, unlike Merck's Zostavax which uses aborted fetal cells.

"Until now, people wanting to have protection from shingles have had to either use Merck's aborted fetal version or abstain entirely," stated Debi Vinnedge, Executive Director at Children of God for Life. "We are absolutely thrilled that GSK has finally given the US a moral option!"

Shingrix was also approved for use in Canada last week.

Earlier this year, Children of God for Life issued a press release noting that the Shingrix was likely to get the FDA recommendation as a product of choice. In September, the FDA did exactly that, voting unanimously in its endorsement of Shingrix. (See: www.fiercepharma.com/vaccines/fda-panelunanimously-endorses-glaxo-s-shingrixas-1b-market-duel-nears)

The preference for GSK's shot could seriously hurt Merck's Zostavax sales, which totaled \$685 million last year. Not only is GSK's Shingrix morally produced, but it is also a far superior product as evidenced by lengthy clinical trials. The studies demonstrated that Shingrix is 97.2% effective in people over 50 years old. It also maintained 90% efficacy in those 70 years old and above with 95% immunity maintained after four years. On the other hand, Merck's Zostavax, is only 38% effective in people over 70 and only 40% duration of immunity after four years.

Shingrix combines a protein from the chickenpox virus called glycoprotein E with the immune systemboosting QS-21 Stimulon made by Agenus. This unique component is made from the bark of the Quillaja saponaria (soap bark) evergreen tree native to central Chile.

Children of God for Life is hoping that with the advancement of Shingrix, GSK could also produce a moral version of the chickenpox vaccine. Merck's Zostavax is simply a stronger version of its' chickenpox vaccine, so it seems possible that GSK could weaken Shingrix for a chickenpox vaccine.

"This is a problem we have dealt with for years and we cannot thank GSK enough for doing it right," noted Vinnedge. "There is absolutely no reason to use the remains of aborted babies to produce vaccines." In June 2005, the Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life responded to Children of God for Life's request for help stating unequivocally that:

"Doctors and fathers of families have a duty to take recourse to alternative vaccines, putting pressure on the political authorities and health systems so that other vaccines without moral problems become available. They should take recourse, if necessary, to the use of conscientious objection with regard to the use of vaccines produced by means of cell lines of aborted human foetal origin. Equally, they should oppose by all means the vaccines which do not yet have morally acceptable alternatives, creating pressure so that alternative vaccines are prepared, which are not connected with the abortion of a human foetus, and requesting rigorous legal control of the pharmaceutical industry producers."

Likewise, the US Conference of Bishops noted in their April 2015 updated statement that, "The Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities agrees with the National Catholics Bioethics Center, the Catholic Medical Association, and others that manufacturers should be urged to make alternative vaccines more widely available so that Catholics and others will not face this moral dilemma.

"I commend GSK for the development of Shingrix," said John F Brehany, Director of Institutional Relations at the National Catholic Bioethics Center. "And I commend the thousands of people who by their prayers and petitions have helped to bring about this day. I hope they will redouble their efforts. Safe, effective, and ethical vaccines can and should be provided by the pharmaceutical companies. And everyone who respects human life and dignity should make use of these ethical alternatives."

• Studies have shown that women and men are more drawn to a center name with positive connotations.


#### What remains the same?




### More than Enough By: Jason Weber

In 1981, Herman and Donna Ostry bought a farm just outside of Bruno, Nebraska. But they had a barn with a BIG problem. Every time it rained, the barn flooded. In fact, at one point they measured 29 inches of standing water. One night, Farmer Herman made a joke at the dinner table. "If we just had enough people we could pick this thing up and move it." Everyone laughed. To make a long story short, that's just what they did. On July 30th, 1988, a crowd of 4000 people came to watch 344 people pick up the barn by a steel grid that had been installed and carry it 115 feet up 6 feet of elevation, turn it 90 degrees and set it back down. It took about 20 minutes. Right now, it's likely that the foster care system in your community is flooding. There are more kids who need safe and loving homes than there are families willing to provide them. The traditional approach we take when things are flooding is to grab a bucket and start scooping out water. When we see that it's not working, we just ask for more buckets. We do that in foster care as well -- "if we just had more money" or "if we just had more workers." However, the truth is no quantity of buckets would have made the barn dry. Yes, buckets will make the barn less wet, but they will never make it dry. In the same way, added programs and initiatives may mean fewer kids who don't have a safe and loving to place go. However, we live in a country where there should never be a child that doesn't have a safe and loving place to go.

At some point, we need to stop and say, "It's time to move the barn." What does that mean?

There are several places around the country that have demonstrated that





when the community works together in unity and churches partner with the state as allies rather than adversaries, significant progress can be made and has been made to reduce the number of kids in care and move closer to the day when the barn is on dry ground.

If you pick up a barn but don't know where to take it to get it to dry ground, you've accomplished nothing. We have to know where the dry ground is. And in the foster care system, we believe that dry ground can be summed up in three words:

#### More than enough.

Throughout scripture, we see a God of "more than enough." When he provided manna in the desert for the people of Israel or when Jesus fed 5000 on the hillside, God didn't provide "not enough," and He didn't provide "just enough."

He provided "more than enough."

We believe this same God can provide *more than enough* through His church for the kids and families in foster care in your county and state. Here is what we mean by that:

•*More than enough* foster homes for every child in foster care to have an optimal placement

•More than enough families for every child that needs to be adopted

•*More than enough* help for biological families trying to stay together or get back together

•More than enough support in the Church for ALL these families

Local foster care movements that have been successful around the country have had a clear and specific vision: "No More Waiting Kids in Colorado" or "300 new foster families" are a couple of examples. Often in foster care, the tendency is to gravitate toward a "more, better, faster" approach (the bucket approach). The problem with that approach is that it might tell us what to do next, but it doesn't paint a clear picture of where we want to end up.

Ultimately, we desire that some manifestation of "more than enough" would be the vision in every community in the country. The great thing about that is that there are specific numbers of kids in care, waiting kids, bio families and adoptive families in every community. Through just a little bit of investigation and asking the right people the right questions, those numbers can be found. And once you know these numbers, "more than enough" can become a very clear and attainable vision for the churches and organizations in your community.

#### THE BRIDGE - Building Community in Shreveport Bossier

The other great thing about a clear vision is that everyone can easily see the part they need to play. If the vision in a county is adoptive homes for all 75 waiting kids, then the 25 churches involved in the movement there clearly know they have a responsibility to help find permanency for three kids. A church armed with that kind of clear goal will be much more effective than one that is simply asked to do "better."



- Small flashlight with batteries (Most families don't have electricity)
- Good quality melamine plate, bowl, and/or cup (Practical and also special.)
- Soap AND a plastic soap dish that has a cover.
- Toothbrush in a toothbrush holder.
- Pencils, erasers, colored pencils, and sharpeners for all school-aged kids. And good quality pens for kids aged 10-14, in black, red, green, and blue. The ones from America last so much longer than those here.

#### **GREAT GIFTS**

- Jump ropes
- Band-Aids
- Hard candy and gum
- Comb
- Hair elastics or head bands for girls
- Marbles
- Harmonica
- A simple watch for older kids
- A solar calculator for older kids
- Sunglasses for older kids
- Socks
- For the youngest girls, a baby doll with light brown skin and no hair (good for a child of any color)
- Toy car, truck or airplane big enough to have big wheels

The Lord is the Lord of all – including which child receives which shoebox!
