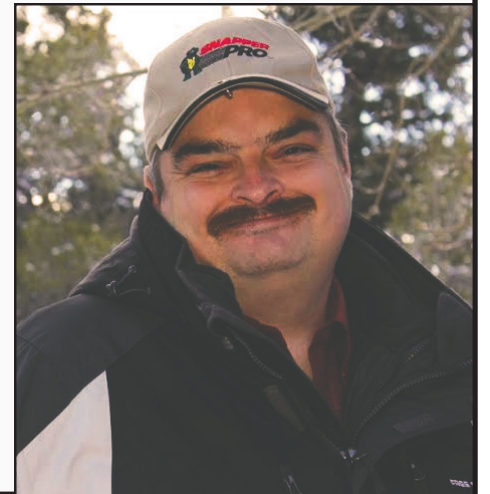

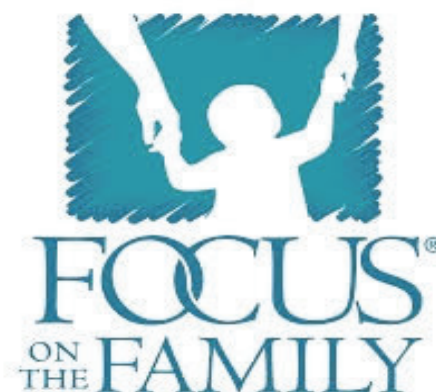

how to pack your shoebox

- 1 SHOEBOX**
Use an empty cardboard or plastic shoebox (average size). You can wrap the box and lid separately, but wrapping is not required.
- 2 BOY OR GIRL**
Decide whether your gift will be for a boy or a girl, and the age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14.
- 3 FILL WITH GIFTS**
Fill the box with a variety of quality gifts that will bring delight to a child (see Gift Suggestions).
- 4 INCLUDE \$7 AND SHIPPING LABEL**
A donation of \$7 per box is critical to transport your gift and deliver it into the hands of a child in need.

Standard Shipping Label: Donate \$7 per box by check to Samaritan's Purse (note "OCC" on the memo line) and place it in an envelope on top of the items inside your shoebox. Print and cut out an appropriate boy/girl label from page 2 of this PDF download. Mark the correct age category and tape the label to the top of your box.*

Follow-Your-Box Shipping Label: Donate your \$7 online and discover the destination of your shoebox. We'll email you a special Follow-Your-Box label to print and use. Later, you'll receive a notification about the destination of your shoebox gift.
- 5 PRAY**
Ask God to use your gifts to show His love to the child who will receive your shoebox.
- 6 DROP OFF**
Place a rubber band around each shoebox and take it to the nearest drop-off point during National Collection Week, third week in November. For locations, visit samaritanspurse.org/occ, or call 1-800-353-5949.

GIFT SUGGESTIONS

ALL AGES

TOYS! Start with a central item that a child will cherish, like a beautiful doll, a deflated soccer ball with pump, or a plush stuffed animal. Then add quality items like cars, musical instruments, puzzles, jump ropes, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES such as pencils, pens, crayons, notebooks, coloring books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS such as toothbrushes, bar soap, washcloths, combs, etc.

ACCESSORIES such as socks, hats, t-shirts, flip-flops, hair bands, sunglasses, etc.

A PERSONAL NOTE and photo of you and your family/group. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.

YOUNGER CHILDREN:

Blankets, sticker and picture books, blocks, finger puppets, pages of colorful stickers.

OLDER CHILDREN:

Small tools, tape measures, sewing kits, fabric squares, etc; deflated balls with pumps and needles; solar calculators, rulers, scissors; jewelry; deodorant

DO NOT INCLUDE

used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; seeds; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snowglobes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

The ALT CPC Learning Center

The Ark La Tex Learning Center is an extended ministry of the Ark La Tex Crisis Pregnancy Center. In the beginning, we offered parenting classes and birthing classes for our clients with the ability to earn merits for each class and use them to purchase needed baby things. This was a huge success that eventually meant we needed more space. Out of the abundance of our generous God we acquired another building and in 2011 the Learning Center was born!

We realized that the need to walk beside our clients in a crisis pregnancy was much more than the initial pregnancy test. Many times the decision to abort is made out of a financial crisis and/or the absence of a support system. We provide both of those things to our clients.

We have a program that offers a variety of parenting, life skills, and Bible Study classes. For every class they attend they will receive merits. We have an amazing "Moms Mart," filled with donated baby items, where they can "purchase" these items with their merits. We offer free child care for their babies while they are in class.



Many of our clients come to us alone. That's how Sarah felt. The father of her baby decided he didn't want anything to do with her or the baby when she told him she was pregnant. She had a limited support system and was financially strapped. When she came to us we assured her that we cared for her and her baby, and that we were going to help her walk the road of becoming a mom. She attended classes on prenatal care, newborn care, child safety and healthy family. She was well prepared to welcome her daughter into the world. Most importantly, as a result of the Healthy Family class she attended, we saw God do amazing work. She began to see herself as God sees her; she realized that she was worth more than sex to men, and she made a decision to change how she viewed God and her relationship with men.

Throughout all of this, Sarah was able to earn, with her class merits, all the things she needed to bring her baby into a prepared and safe home. After the baby came she continued to come and get further education and her needs met. Today she is an amazing single mother, has finished her college degree and is working full time.

It's not just single mothers we see, we also serve couples or single dads who want to become good fathers. One such young couple came to us scared about this new adventure of becoming parents. They attended most all the classes together and soaked up all we had to teach them. It was so cool to see their confidence grow as their knowledge grew. They were married a few months after first coming to the Learning Center and

said they wanted to be a family for their son. I am proud to say they came into the center just a few weeks ago, just 4 days after the birth of their son, to show him off and share with us their birthing experience. It is such a privilege to witness the change of two young people from anxious expectant parents to confident parents!



At the Learning Center, we receive NO government funds...NONE! We rely solely on God and His people to heed the call for help. We rely on volunteers and donations for our existence.

Our staff is 99% volunteers, and are the very heartbeat of the Center. This is not always an easy calling, but to my amazement, volunteers come.

Regarding finances, we have learned that to do without a need for a time builds faith, not just in us, but in our clients as well. Let me tell you another story...

The beginning of August I noticed our refrigerator was not feeling well. I took its temperature every morning and knew its time was near. The beginning of September a young man came by the center with a monetary donation and asked that it be used to purchase much needed car seats. Remembering the condition of our refrigerator I asked if he'd mind letting us put his money toward a fridge. He agreed, so we began to pray that God would provide.

Thursday, September 10th the fridge died. We borrowed a mini fridge and continued to ask God to provide. Tuesday, as I was doing my morning quiet time, I wrote in my journal, "I know you are providing the fridge, could you send it soon?" We were collecting food items for our upcoming Fall Fest, and needed a full size fridge! On September 15, we found a brand new one from a local home improvement store, discontinued and marked down....for the exact amount our donor gave us, even after taxes!!

We have story after story just like this because we exist in the provision of God. Watching God show up in our needs, show up in our clients and show up in our volunteers has made us God watchers here at the Learning Center. We are learning that He is big enough for this tsunami of brokenness hitting all around us. God cannot be used up! Isn't that wonderful?!

There will be more conversation about the Learning Center at the annual Ark La Tex Crisis Pregnancy Center banquet coming up this month. Abby Johnson, former clinic director for Planned Parenthood, now pro-life advocate and author of "unPlanned" will be the keynote speaker. Look at our ad. We hope you will join us.

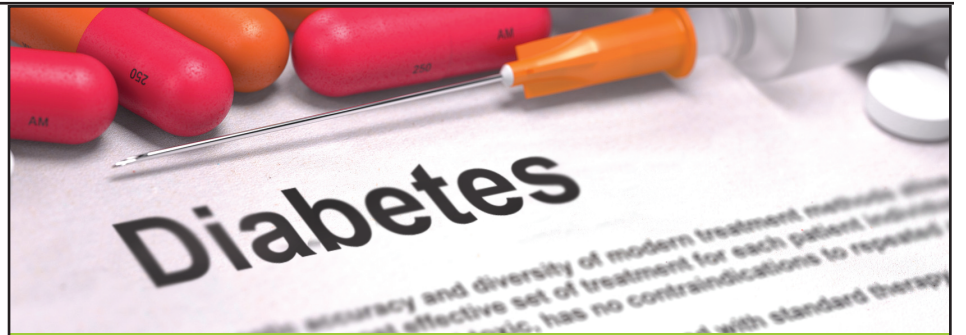
