

The Louisiana Family Forum (LFF) recently released a comprehensive analysis of life in Louisiana entitled "The Louisiana Cultural Indicators Report (LCIR)." The LCIR was modeled after former Reagan adviser, Bill Benett's 1994 Index of Leading Cultural Indicators. Bennett held that even as we measure economic data as a measure of societal fitness, so we must also consider key social indicators.

Decades of Louisiana data has been compiled and illustrated through charts, graphs and snapshots. The LCIR tracks Louisiana's progress in the area of health, crime, family, education, poverty, welfare, government and business.

For 2015, Louisiana has reason to celebrate:

- 1. The high school graduation rate is at an all-time high of 83 percent.
- 2. 4-year college degrees have increased 148 percent since 1970.
- 3. 25 percent of Louisiana K-12 students participate in some form of educational choice, saving taxpayers \$1.7 billion.
- 4. Since 1969 the percentage of families in poverty has declined by 35 percent.



Troublesome trends include:

- 1. Out-of-wedlock births jumped 490 percent, since 1969.
- 2. Only 36 percent of teens grow up in intact married biological families. 16 percent of black teens with married parents.
- 3. Louisiana has the third highest HIV infection and syphilis rate in the U.S., second in chlamydia and highest rate of reported cases of gonorrhea.

This document is Louisiana Family Forum's invitation to explore solutions for struggling families. LFF has demonstrated that when elected officials, churches and non-profits cooperate, families grow and thrive.

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

Thinking Clearly about Science Metamorphosis

Last month I addressed the mindset used by naturalists who believe that there are no possible explanations for the world around us other than material processes. God is ruled out ahead of time. They claim that science cannot allow for any supernatural explanations and operate under a philosophy of science termed "methodological naturalism". That thinking is okay when it comes to the day-to-day workings of nature but not to research on the subjects of the origin of the universe, origin of life, or the discussion about creation vs evolution. Unless a Creator's involvement is arbitrarily ruled out by this defective mindset before considering the facts, God is clearly in the picture.

Question: How did human beings come to be? Answer: Either they evolved through natural processes or they were created. If you can think of another alternative to those two considerations you are to be congratulated as no one else has ever been able to do so. Creation or evolution exhausts the possibilities when it comes to explaining how we humans came to be. But If I could show you that the evolutionary process cannot explain the biological complexity of life then only creation is left to explain it. Even one example is sufficient to break the chain of evolution that naturalists use to explain how human life came into existence. Logically, the syllogism goes this way: A or B. Not A, therefore B; Evolution or Creation. Not evolution, therefore creation.

As an example, let's consider the process of metamorphosis and how butterflies might have come into existence. Could they have evolved through a gradual step by step process? Metamorphosis is the subject and name of a DVD produced by Illustra Media and is promoted by The Discovery

Institute which also promotes the idea of intelligent design. By going to the website, metamorphosisthefilm.com you can link to a YouTube trailer or you can buy the DVD. Material such as this should be given a wide showing especially to developing minds who are learning how to think critically about such subjects. In the film, first the process of a caterpillar becoming a butterfly is outlined.

If you recall the biology of this, first a caterpillar eats and eats and becomes very large. Next, the caterpillar attaches itself to the bottom of a leaf or something and hangs upside down. Then it becomes a chrysalis. Inside the chrysalis the old caterpillar body essentially liquefies, then transforms the old parts in an amazingly complex and intricately timed process. This transformation involves thousands of biochemical and mechanical steps. The end result is a butterfly. But if even one of the steps inside the chrysalis misfires, no butterfly, just a caterpillar gone bad. So what? Well, caterpillars can't reproduce. Only butterflies can reproduce. So to propagate, a caterpillar either becomes a butterfly through this process or the species goes extinct. Evolutionists cannot explain how a slow and step-by-step process of thousands of steps could develop by trial and error into a butterfly when all of the steps are needed to make the first butterfly. Evolution cannot produce a butterfly because any failed step in the chrysalis produces nothing. In the eyes of a creationist, the answer to this problem is quite simple. Evolution could not possibly have made butterflies, but an Intelligent Designer could have designed the process so it worked perfectly the first time. God once reminded the prophet Jeremiah about his direct and personal involvement in his development. Jeremiah 1:5 says, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations."NIV

Cantor Schwartz was installed August 16, with Rabbi Michael Rascoe of Long Island, NY officiating. The congregation's guests included members of the press and area clergy, and Rabbi Jana di Benedetti of Shreveport's Reform Jewish Synagogue, B'nai Zion.

New to Shreveport, Cantor Schwartz's professional background includes service as a teacher, choir director, and adjunct professor for Hebrew College in Newton Centre, Massachusetts.

Interesting note: In 1904 the building of the original synagogue was halted by the yellow fever epidemic. When news spread of the setbacks, Jews and Christians from across the city stepped forward to provide the needed funds. On September 8, 1905, much of the town crowded into Agudath Achim's "magnificent edifice" to participate in the new synagogue's consecration service. 

SEE YOU AT THE POLE SEPTEMBER 23, 2015

On Wednesday, September 23, 2015, thousands of middle and high students around the ArkLaTex will gather before school for a time of prayer at an event known as See You at the PoleTM. See You at the Pole is simply a prayer rally where students meet at the school flagpole before school to lift up their friends, families, teachers, school, and nation to God. See You at the PoleTM is a student-initiated, student-organized, and student-led event.

In early 1990 a small group of teenagers in Burleson, Texas, came together for a DiscipleNow weekend. On Saturday night their hearts were penetrated like never before, when they became broken before God and burdened for their friends. Compelled to pray, they drove to three different schools that night. Not knowing exactly what to do, they went to the school flagpoles and prayed for their friends, schools, and leaders.

God used what He did among those teenagers and others who were holding similar prayer meetings at their schools to birth a vision, the vision was that students throughout Texas would follow these examples and meet at their school flagpoles to pray simultaneously. The challenge was named See You at the PoleTM.

On September 11, 1991, at 7:00 a.m., an estimated one million students gathered at school flagpoles all over the country. From Boston, Massachusetts, to Los Angeles, California, from North Dakota to the tip of Texas, students came together to pray. Some sang, some read Scripture, but most importantly, they prayed. Like those first students, they prayed for their schools, for their friends, for their leaders, and for their country.

Since 1991, See You at the PoleTM has grown to God-sized proportions. Within the first few years, the movement began to spread to other nations through missionaries from the U.S. Now each year, more than 3 million students from the entire world participate in See You at the PoleTM. Students in more than 20 countries take part. In places like Canada, Korea, Japan, Turkey, and the Ivory Coast, students are responding to God and taking seriously the challenge to pray.







First Priority ArkLaTex - CITYWIDE EVENT

Also on September 23rd, in conjunction with See You at the Pole, First Priority ArkLaTex will present an event called CITYWIDE, a bi-annual gathering of students across Shreveport/Bossier for the purpose of worship and celebration of God's movement on middle and high school campuses. First Priority ArkLaTex, founded locally in 2010, is a non-profit organization that networks students, church leaders, school faculty, parents, and community leaders with the aim to reach the local campuses for Christ and connect unchurched students with local church youth ministries. First Priority launched 2 campus clubs in the ArkLaTex in 2010 and currently has clubs on sixteen public school campuses in the ArkLaTex that are studentled and student-initiated.

The first CITYWIDE event, which was held in Bossier City, was a small gathering of 100 students. Over the last few years the event has grown rapidly with 750 students in attendance at last year's event held in conjunction with See You at the Pole. So to accommodate the crowds, First Priority has decided to expand the event to two venues. The Shreveport event will be hosted by Broadmoor Baptist Church in their new contemporary worship facility with Runks Runkles, a regional youth evangelist. The Bossier City event will be hosted by Airline Church of Christ in the main sanctuary with Acton Bowen, also a regional youth evangelist. Both events are free admission and will happen from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm.





The unique function of CITYWIDE is to unite student ministries from multiple denominations under the banner of the gospel. Seldom will various Christian denominations choose to work and worship together, and yet teenagers from across the area are finding a sense of unity in Christ, and anyone can see it happen at CITYWIDE.

Through First Priority public schools are seeing Christian students work together on a weekly basis to share the message of Jesus with their peers. Student pastors throughout the ArkLaTex are also networking behind-the-scenes to train students to see themselves as missionaries with compassionate hearts for their schools. Ultimately, the ArkLaTex is seeing a widespread evangelistic movement on the greatest mission field in America, the local middle and high school.


In order to train, empower, and support student missionaries, First Priority builds networks with different roles to accomplish this vision. Parents of teenagers can get involved by joining a "Priority Parent Network" that can serve these clubs in a variety of ways. Youth ministry workers can attend a monthly luncheon for networking that is hosted by a different church each month. Community leaders who want to see the world changed through young Christian disciples can also take up the cause by contributing their influence in the community to see the vision for evangelism accomplished year after year.

US Bible museum partners with Israeli archaeologists

JERUSALEM, Israel – It's hard to tell who's more excited about the new joint venture between the Museum of the Bible in Washington, D.C., and the Israel Antiquities Authority.

When it opens in the fall of 2017 near Washington's National Mall, the eight-story museum will dedicate its top floor gallery to display biblical artifacts chosen from approximately 2 million antiquities from Israel's National Treasures.

Both a permanent exhibit and special rotating exhibits are being planned. With 39 active archaeological excavations in Israel today, it's possible that some of the artifacts to be featured in the museum's top floor gallery have yet to be discovered.

The Museum of the Bible, which also takes part in Israeli excavations, is about to begin a dig at Tel-Shimron, one of the Jewish state's largest and most biblically significant sites.

IAA Director Israel Hasson said part of the museum's "mission" is to make Israel's archaeological heritage accessible to people around the world.

"The Israel Antiquities Authority is thrilled and proud to partner with the Museum of the Bible on this landmark project," IAA Director Israel Hasson said.

The "rare opportunity" to display Israeli antiquities that "illuminate the Bible" will provide visitors with a firsthand look at the "rich and diverse history and archaeology of the Holy Land," Hasson said.

Meanwhile, Museum of the Bible President Cary L. Summers appeared equally excited with the newly formed alliance.

"The Israel Antiquities Authority's unparalled two million artifacts, along with the 40,000 objects in Museum of the Bible's Green Collection, will combine for a new standard of museum experience unlike any ever seen before," Summers predicted.

The Green Collection's 40,000 objects from its founder, Hobby Lobby President Steve Green, includes some very rare and significant biblical texts and artifacts such as cuneiform tablets dating to the time of Abraham, biblical papyri and manuscripts, Torah scrolls, and rare printed Bibles.

This section of Bible Gateway, created in partnership with the Taylor University Center for Scripture Engagement, www.taylor.edu, outlines a set of practical exercises and activities you can undertake to interact more meaningfully with the Bible. Below is an article excerpt to give an example. (This material is © Phil Collins, Ph.D., 2014.)

Hand Copying Scripture

• Remember, the goal of Scripture engagement is to meet God in his Word. Writing the Bible out by hand offers us the unique opportunity to participate in an activity that forces us to slow down the process of reading and encourages a more reflective engagement with God's Word. It gives us more time to think about what is written and to dwell on the meaning and implications of a passage. Hand copying is a focusing ac-

tivity.

- How about writing out a whole book of the Bible instead of isolated sections, especially of narrative style books? This will help you view the book as a whole, understanding its complete message in context.
- Quiet your thoughts by praying for the Holy Spirit to reveal his truth to you in the passage and help you focus each time you start.

Interesting point: The kings of Israel were commanded to personally make their own hand copy of the Bible. In Deuteronomy 17:18-20 God commands that:

When he takes the throne of his kingdom, he is to write for himself on a scroll a copy of this law, taken from that of the Levitical priests. It is to be with him, and he is to read it all the days of his life so that he may learn to revere the Lord his God and follow carefully all the words of this law and these decrees and not consider himself better than his fellow Israelites and turn from the law to the right or to the left. Then he and his descendants will reign a long time over his kingdom in Israel.
