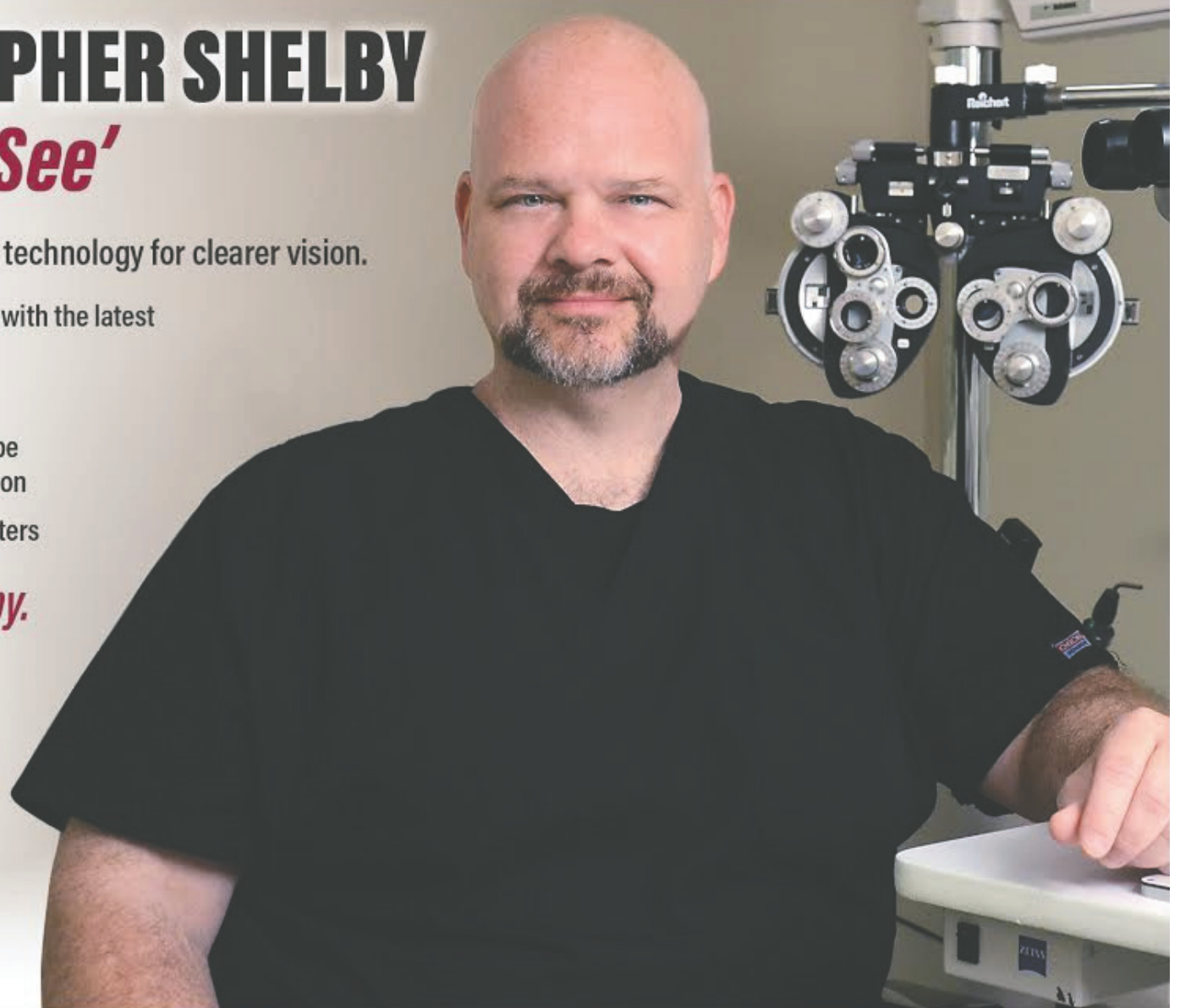

What Makes Perspectives Different?

Christians today have been blessed by many amazing bible studies and courses on Christianity. But with so many options to choose from, people often ask, "What makes Perspectives so different?"

Fuller Center NWLA is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) tax-exempt corporation, faith-driven and Christ-centered, whose mission is to promote collaborative and innovative partnerships with individuals and organizations in an unrelenting quest to provide adequate housing for families living in poverty and substandard housing.

Fuller NWLA has constructed 56 new affordable homes of 1,200 to 1,500 square feet, and has rehabilitated 94 owner-occupied homes in the Shreveport-Bossier area.

100% of all designated donation go toward the designated project.

95% of Fuller Center homes are owner-occupied.

91% of our homeowners are the original applicants.

93% of VETERANS are paying their mortgage on time.

79% of our homeowners are currently paying mortgages on time.

Fuller has provided more than \$4.5 million of economic investment in Caddo/Bossier. Government funds are not used in the construction of homes, but may be used for infrastructure improvements.

Fuller Center is currently building its 57th home in Bossier City and will start two additional homes in the Stoner Hill community in October of 2017. The Fuller Center Surplus Store opened in September, 2012. The store accepts in-kind donations of new and used building materials, and supplies such as windows, doors, sinks, light fixtures, etc. These items are sold to the general public. The profits are used to support the organization's mission to Build Homes, Build Lives, and Change Communities.

Americanism Essay Contest For Grades 7-12

Shreveport-Bossier, LA- Members of FRA (Fleet Reserve Association) Branch 98 invite all students in grades 7 through 12 to participate in the Association's 2017-2018 Americanism Essay Contest. Participants are invited to submit a 350-word or less essay centered on this year's theme: "What Patriotism Means to Me."

This national contest, sponsored by FRA to promote a spirit of patriotism among America's youth, offers a Grand National Prize of \$5,000, with other recognition in each grade category.

"Each entrant must be sponsored by an FRA member or branch," explains Rodney Longstratt, Branch 98 President. "We're proud to sponsor students, including those who are home-schooled, from the Ark-La-Tex area."

Winners are selected at the branch level in each grade category, which are forwarded to compete in one of FRA's eight regions. Regional winners are then forwarded to the Association's National Americanism Committee, where first-, second- and third-place winners are selected in each grade category. The Grand National Winner is selected from this elite group of writers and receives a \$5,000 cash award.

Essays must be legibly written or typed on one side of the paper and each entry must include a separate sheet stating the entrant's name, address, telephone number, name of school (or "home schooled") and grade, the number of words in the essay, and name of the sponsoring member or branch.

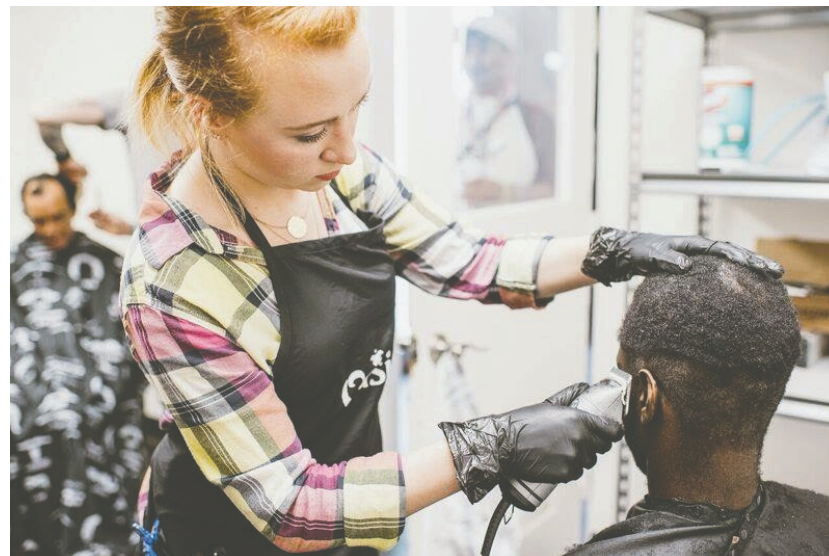

Just One Youth Group

You can't always predict what will happen when you plan a simple youth group retreat. Sometimes, God messes with your plans. Looking back, that's the testimony of Rick Eubanks.

Who's Rick, you ask? He was the Minister of Music and Youth at Crestmont Baptist Church in Burleson, Texas from 1975-1995.

You might already know that his youth group was the "womb" that gave birth to the concept of See You at the Pole in 1990.

This was a "pregnancy" that was full of humble beginnings and wonderful surprises. And like radio newsman Paul Harvey used to say, "And now, the rest of the story."

Chuck and Loretta Sharp were adult volunteers in Rick's youth group. Chuck was a guard in a jail; Loretta was a hairstylist. They had a special love for freshmen students, and so Rick put them in charge of the freshman class at Crestmont.

Rick had scheduled a "DiscipleNow" weekend for the entire youth ministry in early 1990. DiscipleNow is a retreat idea popular among Baptist youth ministries. Rick says that although the youth group met en masse at the church for worship, the real teaching of the weekend happened in six homes, where the students met with their adult leaders. The freshmen were hanging out at Chuck and Loretta's.

There was another dynamic at work, though: the freshmen were hungry for God, and had caught the vision for praying for their schools from upperclassmen in the youth group throughout the 1989-90 school year. Some of the "discipling" had already taken root. Many were already claiming their campuses for Christ in prayer. One had started a campus Bible study.

The guest speaker at the Sharps' home that weekend was a young man named Kelly, a youth minister from the Texas Panhandle. He challenged the ninth graders to surrender every part of their lives, habits – the whole deal – to the lordship of Jesus Christ. They responded eagerly. Later that night they went to pray at some of the schools in Burleson.

The fact that they would go to a school and pray was not so unusual. That passion had been growing all year. But someone suggested they hold hands – in public, in front of the school! Some – including one of the football players – were nervous, and a little self-conscious. What if one of his buddies saw him? But Rick recalls, "When they started praying, they 'got down to business.'"

The prayer times were rich. They felt God's presence. And they told Rick about it.

That planted the seed in Rick's mind prior to a meeting with Chuck Flowers and some other Baptist youth workers at his office. Chuck was the director of youth evangelism for the Baptist General Convention of Texas. The question on the table was, "How can we help students follow up after SuperSummer (the statewide conferences for Texas Baptist churches) this year?" They wanted the impact of the summer camps to carry over to the schools. Rick Eubanks, thinking about his students, suggested: "Let's have kids pray in small groups at their own schools – all on the same day."

The quote of the day came from one of the leaders: "We might have 3,000 kids pray on one day!"

The brainstorming continued: Where should they meet? "Every school has a flagpole...you can say anything you want to under the American flag," Rick observed.

Neil McClendon, one of adults, exclaimed, "Hey! 'See You at the Pole!'"

After some more discussion came agreement: "We'll try it for one year." A date in September was set, and the challenge was extended by McClendon to 20,000 students at Reunion Arena in June.

Then came the surprises. First, youth workers in other states – Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Mississippi – heard about See You at the Pole and wanted to get involved. Like a Texas prairie fire, the idea was taking off.

Chuck Flowers set up a single cassette answering machine and asked people to call in their reports. On the night of See You at the Pole, he sat and wept as report after report came in. When the documented attendance was tallied, at least 45,000 students on 1,200 campuses were involved.

As Eubanks reflects back, the surprises kept coming.

He was stunned at how See You at the Pole became a time not just of prayer, but where kids led their friends to Christ. Denominational walls broke down at the flagpole.

"I broke down and cried when I heard about students planning their See You at the Pole in Moscow, Russia – near Lenin's tomb – so that they would pray at the same time as us in the U.S," he remembers.

A small town in Texas. Freshmen students. Working-class adult volunteer leaders. And a God who loves to take ordinary people and do great things through them. Could there be another ordinary youth group out there that is ready to be the birthplace of something extraordinary – maybe in your ministry?

Rick is now the Worship Pastor at Grand Parkway Baptist Church in Sugar Land, Texas. He was asked what he would say to a youth worker who might feel, "God would never do something like that in MY youth group."

He replied, "You're the best God has in your place right now. It's your calling. When we're out in the trenches, we think we don't have the credentials; we're too old or too young; but as we're available, there will be a God-given opportunity. We have to submit to Him and allow Him to use us."

He also challenges youth workers to commit to long-term ministry, and share their very lives with the students they lead: "You can teach more about patience while changing a flat tire on a missions trip than in a Bible study in Sunday School."

As in all historic movements of prayer, See You at the Pole did not begin in the hearts of people, but in the heart of God. God used the obedience of a small group of teenagers in one town to ignite what has become an international movement of prayer among young people.

But there will be other movements, in other towns - including maybe yours.



See You at the Pole™

“Fix Our Eyes” (from Hebrews 12:2) is the theme for See You at the Pole 2017, which is all about students praying at their schools. The event is scheduled for Wednesday, September 27, at schools across the United States and in many other countries.

In recent years, the event has become more than just one day of prayer. With diverse schedules at participating schools, students are being challenged to find new and unique ways, places, and times to pray throughout the Global Week of Student Prayer—September 24-30.



Then on Wednesday, September 27th at 7:00 a.m. local time, if possible, students are encouraged to gather at a school flagpole to pray at See You at the Pole. This means that, all around the world in every time zone, for 24 hours, students will be praying for their school, friends, families, churches, and communities.

This is the 27th anniversary for See You at the Pole, a student-initiated and student-led movement that started in the Ft. Worth suburb of Burleson, Texas, in 1990. SYATP brings students to their school flagpoles to intercede for their leaders, schools, and families, asking God to bring moral and spiritual awakening to their campuses and countries.

can be ordered online or by calling (817) HIS-PLAN (817-447-7526) between 9-5 (Central Time), Monday-Friday. Brochures, a promotional DVD, and posters are some of the materials available for 2017.

The San Diego-based National Network of Youth Ministries coordinates SYATP promotion. Daryl Nuss, executive director of the Network, commented: “See You at the Pole empowers students in prayer at the beginning of the school year to take leadership at their schools.”



Church congregations can show support for See You at the Pole by sponsoring special “Pray for Schools” emphasis in their worship services September 16-17, two weekends before See You at the Pole. Participants can recognize and pray for Christian students, educators and schools in their congregations.

Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body. Hebrews 13:3.

Nigeria: Freed Chibok Girls Held

Elizabeth waited three years for Boko Haram to release her youngest daughter, 20-year-old Mariam. Today, months after Mariam gained her freedom, Elizabeth is still waiting to bring her daughter home.

Government officials are holding Mariam and the other 81 girls released with her in Nigeria's capital, Abuja. Elizabeth said she and other families aren't being told why they can't have their girls back. Since Mariam's release in May, Elizabeth has only seen her daughter for about 24 hours. "We are not angry because there is nothing we can do," Elizabeth told a VOM worker. "But we would love to have her at home. There is nothing we can do and nobody is communicating with us. We don't know anything that is happening, but we know that they are safe now."

Boko Haram abducted Mariam and 218 other girls around midnight on April 14, 2014, as they slept at their boarding school. The Islamist group then traveled with the girls for about four days to its headquarters in the



Sambisa forest. During her recent time with her daughter, Elizabeth learned the girls didn't eat during the journey. More than once, they slept among snakes.

"The only thing that saved them was God," said Elizabeth, who has three other children. "They shouldn't be alive. Mariam was telling me, 'Mom it is only God that rescued me. Only God.'"

Elizabeth hasn't heard the details about Mariam's life under Boko Haram's control. She does know, however, that her daughter's faith is still intact. The night of the abduction, Mariam managed to grab her Bible and a hymnal. During

her time in captivity, she hid the books from her captors, reading them as often as possible. The day of her release, Mariam held the books in her hands. "Mom, I depend on God and nothing else," she told her mother during their brief reunion.

Prior to the 82 girls being released, other "Chibok girls" had been released following negotiations with the Nigerian government. Others were able to flee on their own. Today, 113 girls remain in custody.

"Our cry is still for those remaining to be rescued," Elizabeth said. "Our prayer is that God would rescue them."

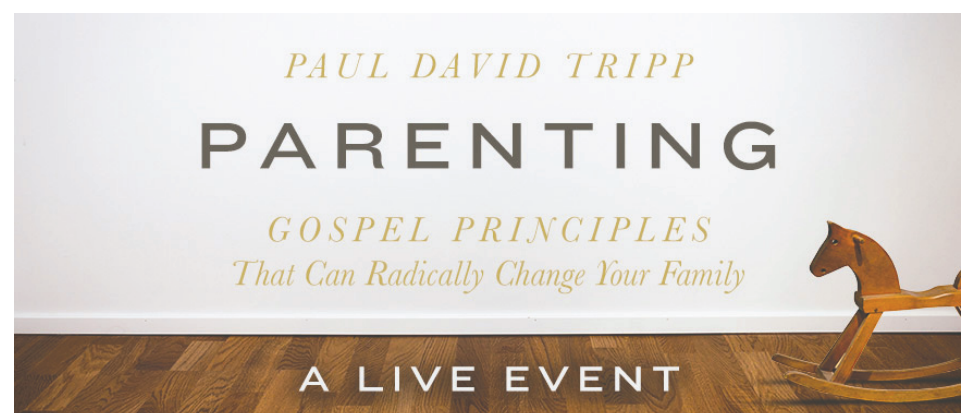
