

Lives Changed Leon McKee

For the last ten weeks I have had the opportunity to spend time studying and praying with a small group of men at my home church here in Shreveport. The highlight of the study for me was being with some of

the men from Zion Ridge, an extension of the Shreveport Bossier Rescue Mission. Three of the nine were in the same small group with me, allowing me to get to know them. Getting acquainted with Vince, Rudy and Carlos has been very meaningful and reconfirmed to me that God changes lives when believers take time to invest in people. These men have come from seemingly insurmountable backgrounds and have all found a new life through Christ.

Zion Ridge's Discipleship Training Program teaches men to overcome life-controlling addictions and how to live victorious lives. They attend Bible and life skill classes, work around the property, and conduct outreach events. Two outreach activities are the Men's Choir performances and helping Cornerstone Church minister to the local homeless. The program accommodates up to 24 men for the nine-month program.

Constitutional Amendment Introduced to Protect Children, Parents

WASHINGTON, June 18, 2013 /Christian Newswire/ -- Congressman Mark Meadows (R-NC) today introduced a resolution in the U.S. House to amend the United States Constitution to protect children and parents from governmental overreach. The proposed Parental Rights Amendment already has 40 original cosponsors. ParentalRights.org leads grassroots support for the measure.

"In a time when longstanding truths and traditions are being tested, we must safeguard the right of parents to direct their children's upbringing and education," Meadows explained. "This amendment to our Constitution would ensure that these decisions are made not by faceless bureaucrats but by parents who love their children and know them best."

Constitutional lawyer and ParentalRights.org president Michael Farris agrees. "Traditionally the Supreme Court has held that fit parents make decisions that are in their child's best interests. But that presumption is being eroded today in our courts and in U.N. conventions. More and more, judges are making decisions based on what they think is best for the child, rather than respecting the natural right of loving parents to make that call."

The proposed amendment would establish, in part, that "[t]he liberty of parents to direct the upbringing, education, and care of their children is a fundamental right." Other sections establish a high legal standard to protect these rights and a safeguard against international law overriding the parental role. This is the fourth consecutive Congress in which the measure has been introduced.

Support for the Parental Rights Amendment has increased through a number of high-profile incidents in recent months, including a California case in which Child Protective Services removed a baby from his parents' custody because they sought a second medical opinion prior to heart surgery. And more recently, a bill that would assign a government worker to oversee every child from birth is being considered in Scotland in response to their obligations under the United Nations' Convention on the Rights of the Child. Parental rights supporters believe the proposed amendment will keep such laws from ever being adopted here.

The Proposed Parental Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution

SECTION 1

The liberty of parents to direct the upbringing, education, and care of their children is a fundamental right.

SECTION 2

The parental right to direct education includes the right to choose public, private, religious, or home schools, and the right to make reasonable choices within public schools for one's child.

SECTION 3

Neither the United States nor any State shall infringe these rights without demonstrating that its governmental interest as applied to the person is of the highest order and not otherwise served.

SECTION 4

This article shall not be construed to apply to a parental action or decision that would end life.

SECTION 5

No treaty may be adopted nor shall any source of international law be employed to supersede, modify, interpret, or apply to the rights guaranteed by this article.

20 THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE U.N. CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

Ten things you need to know about the structure of the CRC:

- It is a treaty which creates binding rules of law. It is no mere statement of altruism.¹
- Its effect would be binding on American families, courts, and policy-makers.²
- Children of other nations would not be impacted or helped in any direct way by our ratification ³
- The CRC would automatically override almost all American laws on children and families because of the U.S. Constitution's Supremacy Clause in Article VI.⁴
- The CRC has some elements that are self-executing, while others would require implementing legislation. Federal courts would have the power to determine which provisions were self-executing.⁵
- The courts would have the power to directly enforce the provisions that are self-executing.⁶
- Congress would have the power to directly legislate on all subjects necessary to comply with



the treaty. This would constitute the most massive shift of power from the states to the federal government in American history.⁷

- A committee of 18 experts from other nations, sitting in Geneva, has the authority to issue official interpretations of the treaty which are entitled to binding weight in American courts and legislatures. This effectively transfers ultimate authority for all policies in this area to this foreign committee.⁸
- Under international law, the treaty overrides even our Constitution.⁹
- Reservations, declarations, or understandings intended to modify our duty to comply with this treaty will be void if they are determined to be inconsistent with the object and purpose of the treaty.¹⁰

Ten things you need to know about the substance of the CRC:

- Children would have the ability to choose their own religion while parents would only have the authority to give their children advice about religion.¹³
- The best interest of the child principle would give the government the ability to override every decision made by every parent if a government worker disagreed with the parent's decision.¹⁴
- A child's "right to be heard" would allow him (or her) to seek governmental review of every parental decision with which the child disagreed.¹⁵
- According to existing interpretation, it would be illegal for a nation to spend more on national defense than it does on children's welfare. ¹⁶
- Children would acquire a legally enforceable right to leisure. 17
- Christian schools that refuse to teach "alternative worldviews" and teach that Christianity is the only true religion "fly in the face of article 29" of the treaty.¹⁸
- Allowing parents to opt their children out of sex education has been held to be out of compliance with the CRC.¹⁹
- Children would have the right to reproductive health information and services, including abortions, without parental knowledge or consent.²⁰
- Parents would no longer be able to administer reasonable spankings to their children.¹¹
- A murderer aged 17 years and 11 months and 29 days at the time of his crime could no longer be sentenced to life in prison.¹²

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

In Spirit and in Truth

Practically every church I have attended or visited has had a church building that could be described as an architectural big box, even those churches whose congregations later moved into a large fan-shaped sanctuary. Each church building that I had seen had the same elements: pews for the congregation and a platform for the pulpit, musicians, instruments, and choir. Dr. Alistair McGrath, in his book Christianity's Dangerous Idea, makes an important distinction between the design of the platform of Catholic and Protestant churches. In Catholic churches, he says, the altar is central for the ministry of the sacraments. The attention of the worshipper is drawn to the central location where the Eucharist is administered by the priest. The platform of a Protestant church, McGrath continues, features a central pulpit. The pulpit facilitates the ministry of the Word, which is, the preaching and teaching from the Scriptures in music or spoken word. The congregation is drawn to the individual who is leading the service of worship.

As we look at the platform each Sunday in our Protestant houses of worship, we have to ask ourselves the question has the design of churches (in the case of my tradition, Southern Baptist churches) created a participatory or a spectator culture in our congregations? Do we participate in worship as a group of believers or do we look on as others, the musicians, singers, and ministers, do all the work? When I served as a minister of music and lead worship services from the platform, one of my concerns was encouraging the congregation to be active participants in worship. Perhaps all the while, the very design of the building was working against me.

Are our church buildings designed badly? Do they cause our congregations to participate or merely sit and watch? What is our goal for the congregational meeting each weekend? We should want our fellow Christians engaged as we meet together for worship. If the members of the congregation are not participating with the leaders on the platform, what is the difference between a worship service and a musical concert or lecture

by a personality?

In looking at the many things the Bible says about worship, I was drawn to what Jesus said to the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well, "But an hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth. Yes, the Father wants such people to worship Him" (Jn. 4:23, HCSB). There is a vital connection between the heart and the head in worship. As the Christian goes into a worship service with his or her congregation, it should be a sincere act of praise and thanksgiving based on the truth of who God is and what He has done in providing us salvation through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Spirit and truth motivate and empower us to worship. It is impossible to leave our hearts or our minds at the door of the sanctuary.

I think that apologetics can serve the goal of helping us worship in truth. We can take one of the basic apologetic arguments, the Kalam Cosmological Argument, as an example. The argument informs us that things that begin to exist have causes. That includes the universe. Therefore, the argument concludes, there is a cause to the universe. The implication of the argument is that the Cause of the universe must be outside the universe. That Cause of the universe, as Christian philosopher Dr. William Lane Craig points out, is timeless, spaceless, uncaused, and immaterial. We can describe God as transcendent, being outside the realm of the material universe.

There is one other important point that must be made. The Cause of the universe must be personal as well. The Cause of the universe, the Creator God, chose, as an act of free will, to create the universe. Psalm 103 tells us that the Personal Cause of the universe also loves us as well. As it says in verse 17, "but from eternity to eternity the Lord's faithful love is toward those who fear Him..." (HCSB). It takes a personal God to show faithful love. God is transcendent and personal as well!

No matter the shape or style of building in which we worship, Christians worship a great, mighty, majestic, loving, and personal God. Remember that as you engage your spirit and your mind in worship on Sunday morning.





Washington, DC (July 22, 2013) - In response to the growing international problem of online pornography, UK Prime Minister David Cameron announced that public Wi-Fi and most households will start having filters automatically in place starting in 2014. Households can request these filters be turned off if they choose. Cameron said in his speech, "This is, quite simply, about how we protect our children and their innocence."

Cable and Internet providers in the United States could follow suit without any government action. By automatically providing filters, which customers could then turn off if they chose, children would be protected from harmful content. Many parents do not realize the extensive access to pornography that their children have.

When the average child views pornography for the first time at age 11 or earlier, it is necessary for parents to take action. Until the time when children can safely go on the Internet or watch TV without stumbling across hardcore pornography, we encourage parents to add filters and protect their families from pornography.




MIM is the leading national organization opposing pornography and indecency through public education and the application of the law.

MIM was launched in 1962 by an interfaith group of clergy in New York City. Now, headquartered in Washington, DC, MIM takes on a number of projects which include: educating the public on the harms of pornography and ways to prevent those harms, getting existing federal obscenity laws enforced, defending broadcast decency standards, getting filters in schools and libraries and much more. Did you know?

Federal obscenity laws, which are not being enforced by the Department of Justice, prohibit distribution of hardcore, obscene pornography on the Internet, on cable/satellite or hotel/motel TV and in sexually oriented businesses and other retail shops.

We launched and direct a coalition effort of more than 130 national, state and local groups to work together with many mem-



bers of the U.S. Congress to pressure the U.S. Department of Justice to once again vigorously enforce these laws.

• In 2012, the FCC bragged that they threw out more than 1 million indecency (nudity and profanity) complaints by concerned citizens without investigating them simply because too much time had lapsed before they could get to them, making it clear that the networks are free to break the rules. The FCC still has approx. 500,000 public complaints. Are they willing to investigate and enforce these at least? Since they have not enforced a single decency regulation since 2008, we feel it is unlikely.

70 Groups to Senate: Oppose Wheeler Unless Committed to Decency Enforcement

WASHINGTON, D.C. (July 9, 2013) – Seventy organizations, led by Morality in Media, signed a letter to U.S. Senators asking them to oppose President Obama's nominee to chair the FCC unless he commits to enforcing decency laws. The letter was hand-delivered to Senate offices on July 9

Tom Wheeler was nominated to chair the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and is up for confirmation by the Senate. He was given the opportunity to state his position on decency enforcement during his nomination hearing but instead sidestepped the issue. The FCC is the guardian of decency on broadcast TV and radio and it is time for them to enforce the law.

"One of the most important duties the FCC Chair has is to enforce decency standards on network TV and radio. If Wheeler shirks his responsibility, no one else will enforce the law," said Patrick A. Trueman, President of Morality in Media. "It is up to the Senate to make sure that the next leader of the FCC enforce the laws passed by Congress and supported by the American people."

During the four years of the previous FCC chairman, Julius Genachowski, not one decency enforcement action was started against any TV show, despite more than a million citizen complaints.

Safe Schools, Safe Libraries Project

Many schools and public libraries have either no or inadequate filtering software in place on their computers, allowing children and adults access to hardcore pornography and leading to many other dangers at these supposedly safe places. This project equips concerned citizens with knowledge and assistance to get filters in their local libraries and schools. We invite you to take on this project in your area.


After ignoring the will of Congress for nearly two decades on the issue of sexually exploitive materials sold to servicemen, the Pentagon has been given an ultimatum of sorts by the U. S. Senate Armed Services Committee. The Military Honor and Decency Act prohibits the sale of pornography on Military bases but this law has all but been ignored by the Pentagon since it passed Congress in 1996. The Military's sexual ex-

ploitation scandal may change that...in a June letter to Defense Secretary Hagel, *Morality in Media* asked him to stop selling sexually exploitive magazines and to prohibit access to pornography by electronic devices on military bases worldwide. *Morality in Media* would urge that if the Secretary believes porn is a problem, as we certainly do, then eliminate all porn. It is incongruous to prohibit service members from possessing pornography and offer to sell it to them at the same time.

Pentagon Watch, Number 5 – July 3, 2013

Pornography is causing a terrible spiritual crises in the Church, especially among the youth. It is destroying marriages, curbing vocations, and leading to a range of sexually exploitive behaviors.

Morality In Media, in partnership with other organizations, is organizing faith-based conferences on the spiritual, psychological, physical and social consequences of pornography consumption.



MIM is partnering with key groups to bring expert speakers, materials, and exhibitors for Diocesan, General Christian, Inter-faith-centered conferences.
