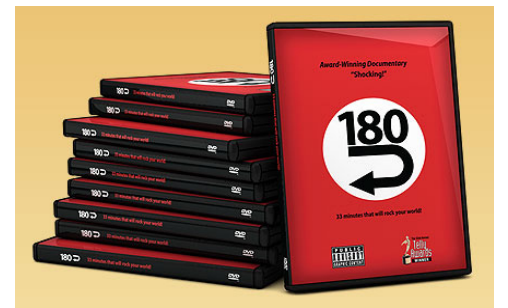

Ninety Days After Speaking Out on Politics, IRS Ignores Pastors

Well, ninety days have come and gone since over 1,500 pastors participated in ¹Pulpit Freedom Sunday on October 7, 2012. And the IRS has not taken any action against any of the pastors who participated. Actually, the title of this blog post could have been “Four years and Counting” because Alliance Defending Freedom first launched Pulpit Freedom Sunday in 2008. And since that time, Pulpit Freedom Sunday has occurred every year and thousands of pastors have participated through those four years. But the IRS has not taken any action against any of the pastors who have ever participated in Pulpit Freedom Sunday.

Now before you may be tempted to become complacent or to think that the IRS has given up on auditing churches, you should remember as ²I wrote in an earlier blog, that the IRS is in a bit of a reorganization when it comes to auditing churches. The IRS has not given up on auditing churches, and an IRS official even ³warned churches to remain silent about the last election. So what is going on then and why hasn't the IRS sought to enforce the ⁴Johnson Amendment against the pastors who participated in ⁵Pulpit Freedom Sunday?

In 2011, I gave some ⁶reasons why I thought the IRS has not taken any action. But the fact is that only the IRS knows why it has chosen to remain silent. The IRS' silence, though, should not cause us to lift up the pressure or to retreat from the battlefield. The Johnson Amendment has been in place since 1954 and has been enforced now for over fifty-eight years. It will not go away in an instant and the campaign to end the Johnson Amendment will be more akin to a siege than a blitzkrieg. We must continue to press forward until the rights of churches and pastors are secured once and for all from the pernicious censorship that has occurred under the regime

of the Johnson Amendment.

Defending Our Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

A CRUEL WORLD?

Alfred, Lord Tennyson and Richard Dawkins agree that the natural order is “red in tooth and claw.” We can look at prehistory through the fossil and see death, disease, and bloodshed on a grand scale. These things took place before man was created and sinned against God. Creationists must wrestle with the issue of death before the Fall. We must deal with the issue objectively.

At the end of the sixth creation period, God looked at everything that He had made and declared it “very good” (Gen. 1:31). This very good world included animals that ate plants and other animals that ate the plant eaters. This seems very awful to us and appeals to our heartstrings. Those meat eaters seem evil to us. However, if we look at the Bible we find that God provides food not only for the plant eaters but for the meat eaters as well (Ps. 104:21 and Job 38:41). We must also realize that animals, in eating other animals for food, are not sinning. Animals work on instinct and do not have the capacity to see moral implications in their actions.

On that sixth creation day, God created something that had not been seen on Earth before. God created a being in His own image to have dominion over the Earth (Gen. 1:26). Man is the only being on Earth that has a free will and the moral sense to obey the commands of God. Adam and Eve used that freedom and ability to disobey God in the Garden of Eden.

The consequences of that act were more than they ever could have dreamed. God pronounced the consequences of their disobedience which would bring about more pain and more toil for both the man and woman. Adam and Eve seemed to understand what pain and toil meant because they did not ask God for clarification. This can only mean they had experienced pain and toil before. Most importantly, Adam and Eve experience spiritual death and separation from God because of their sin. God also removed them from the Garden and possible access to the Tree of Life and, thus, put them on the road to physical death. But, this physical death did have a benefit. As apologist Dr. Hugh Ross explains, “Wicked people are limited by physical death in the amount of malice and evil they can

spread.”

The sin of Adam and Eve affected the earth as well. Man’s mandate from God to have dominion over the earth has not changed. Yet, man is exercising that dominion with a sinful nature. When man uses the earth’s resources selfishly and without thought to the future, he abuses that God-given dominion. God said that the ground would be cursed because of man (Gen. 3:17) and Adam’s descendants have done their part ever since. When Adam and Eve sinned, they brought spiritual and physical death not only on themselves but upon the entire human race. Mankind needed salvation. God took the initiative to bring about our redemption through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul says, “For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly” (Rom. 5:6 ESV). Man was destined for death because of his sin. God provided the way for us to be reconciled to Him.

Was there any benefit to the death that came before man sinned? Death leaves things behind. The bio deposits left behind by years of animal death have allowed man to build a high-tech civilization and advanced communication. Through such communication, we have the potential to reach the population of earth with the gospel of Jesus Christ. The death that took place before the Fall of man serves a purpose to God’s glory and the salvation of man.

Will death, whether it is through the food cycle or sin, ever end? The Bible says that this creation will be replaced by a new creation that is even better than this one. The apostle John saw a “new heaven and a new Earth” (Rev. 21:10). This new creation has different physical laws and priorities. In our present time, death is all around us. But, Jesus Christ provides us salvation from our sins and the spiritual death that sin brings. He also promises those who believe in Him a new, eternal life in a new creation where “death shall be no more” (Rev. 21:4)

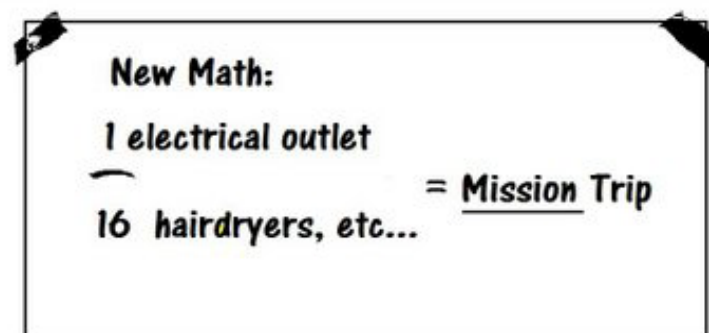

Can You Answer my Question Please?

Do Christians have to keep asking for forgiveness for their sins?

A frequent question is “what happens if I sin, and then I die before I have an opportunity to confess that sin to God?” Another common question is “what happens if I commit a sin, but then forget about it and never remember to confess it to God?” Both of these questions rest on a faulty assumption. Salvation is not a matter of believers trying to confess and repent from every sin they commit before they die. Salvation is not based on whether a Christian has confessed and repented of every sin. Yes, we should confess our sins to God as soon as we are aware that we have sinned. However, we do not always need to be asking God for forgiveness. When we place our faith in Jesus Christ for salvation, all of our sins are forgiven. That includes past, present, and future, big or small. Believers do not have to keep asking for forgiveness or repenting in order to have their sins forgiven. Jesus died to pay the penalty for all of our sins, and when they are forgiven, they are all forgiven (Colossians 1:14; Acts 10:43).

What we are to do is confess our sins: “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness” (1 John 1:9). What this verse tells us to do is “confess” our sins to God. The word “confess” means “to agree with.” When we confess our sins to God, we are agreeing with God that we were wrong, that we have sinned. God forgives us, through confession, on an ongoing basis because of the fact that He is “faithful and just.” How is God “faithful and just”? He is faithful

by forgiving sins, which He has promised to do for all those who receive Christ as Savior. He is just by applying Christ’s payment for our sins, recognizing that the sins have indeed been atoned for.

At the same time, 1 John 1:9 does indicate that somehow forgiveness is dependent on our confessing our sins to God. How does this work if all of our sins are forgiven the moment we receive Christ as Savior? It seems that what the apostle John is describing here is “relational” forgiveness. All of our sins are forgiven “positionally” the moment we receive Christ as Savior. This positional forgiveness guarantees our salvation and promise of an eternal home in heaven. When we stand before God after death, God will not deny us entrance into heaven because of our sins. That is positional forgiveness. The concept of relational forgiveness is based on the fact that when we sin, we offend God and grieve His Spirit (Ephesians 4:30). While God has ultimately forgiven us of the sins we commit, they still result in a blocking or hindrance in our relationship with God. A young boy who sins against his father is not cast out of the family. A godly father will forgive his children unconditionally. At the same time, a good relationship between father and son cannot be achieved until the relationship is restored. This can only occur when a child confesses his mistakes to his father and apologizes. That is why we confess our sins to God—not to maintain our salvation, but to bring ourselves back into close fellowship with the God who loves us and has already forgiven us.

African Countries Make Persecution Surge on Open Doors World Watch List

Mali Jumps from Unranked to No. 7; North Korea Remains No. 1 on List of Worst Persecutors

SANTA ANA, Calif. (Jan. 8, 2013) – Persecution of Christians in Africa vastly increased in 2012, according to the Open Doors 2013 World Watch List of 50 countries where Christians face the most severe persecution for their faith.

The number of countries on the African continent sharply increased on the annual list due to the increasing influence of Islam, states Open Doors, an organization that supports persecuted Christians worldwide. Mali is a newcomer on the list and holds the No. 7 position. Tanzania (No. 24), Kenya (No. 40), Uganda (47) and Niger (No. 50) also moved onto the World Watch List and Ethiopia is one of the strongest risers (from No. 38 to No. 15) on the list. In addition, the small African country of Eritrea made the Top 10 for the first time at No. 10. Libya climbed from No. 26 to No. 17.

North Korea is still No. 1 when it comes to persecution of Christians. For the 11th consecutive year, the hermit communist country heads the World Watch List. Possessing a Bible alone can be a reason for a Christian to be executed or sent to a prison camp along with three generations of his or her family. It is estimated that between 50,000 and 70,000 Christians suffer in horrific prison camps. The intense persecution has continued under new leader Kim Jong-Un. The number of defectors to China greatly decreased in 2012 and half of those who try to defect do not make it.

“Nothing much has changed under new North Korean leader Kim Jong-Un,” says Open Doors spokesman Jerry Dykstra. “In fact, persecution of Christians has increased. Reportedly one labor camp alone could hold up to 6,000 Christians.”

Apart from North Korea, the Top 10 on the World Watch List consists of eight countries where extreme Islam poses the largest threat for Christians. They are (from No. 2 to No. 9) Saudi Arabia, Afghanistan, Iraq, Somalia, Maldives, Mali, Iran and Yemen. Worldwide, Open Doors reports an increase in the persecution of Christians.

Attacks and infiltration

The most notable trend Open Doors researchers found was the increase of persecution in Africa. Fundamentalist variations of Islam rapidly gain influence on the continent. On the one hand, this was due to focused attacks, such as Boko Haram in Nigeria (No. 13). On the other, the influence of Islam increased through infiltration in different social and economic areas. Open Doors saw a similar pattern in several African countries.

“We do not necessarily distinguish one overall plan from one source in the whole of Africa. However, we do see that radical Islamic groups are patiently waiting for the right time to show their power,” Dykstra explains. “Apart from the pattern of violent attacks, we see that radical Muslims are infiltrating into politics, business and the judicial power, such as introducing Sharia family courts. On a number of occasions, Muslims were ready to step into a power vacuum. Take Mali, for example, where Touareg rebels and Muslim fundamentalists gained power in April 2012.”

Mali was a model country

Of the African countries, Mali is the most noticeable newcomer on the World Watch List due to its sudden emergence to No. 7. The situation in Mali escalated after the coup.

“Mali used to be a model country,” says Dykstra. “The situation in the north used to be a bit tense but Christians and even missionaries could be active. Currently the situation in northern Mali is somewhat similar to Saudi Arabia. Christians are simply no longer allowed to be there.

A pastor from the northern part of Mali told Open Doors that he was informed that Muslim fundamentalists were planning to kill all Christians. He warned all the members of his congregation to leave. That happened. Hundreds of Christians fled from the north to the south of the country or neighboring countries.

Syria makes big jump

Outside of Mali, Syria made the largest jump on the World Watch List. The country is No. 11 on the list, compared to No. 36 in 2012. For years under the regime of President Assad, Christians were allowed the freedom to worship but not evangelize. They have now come under pressure from rebels fighting against the regime. To add to this, jihadists entered Syria with an anti-Christian agenda making life for Christians in the country virtually impossible. Tens of thousands of Christians have fled.

China continues drop

China continued its descent on the World Watch List. Five years ago, the country was ranked in the Top 10, but now it has dropped from No. 21 to No. 37. The government still considers the church to be a political movement and wishes to be informed of all Christian activity. However, house searches, arrests and the confiscation of Bibles and Christian books no longer occur on a large scale. Instead, the government forces many church leaders to keep an accounting for their whereabouts; a way to keep them subdued and under control. At least 100 Chinese Christians are still in prison.

Difficult situation in Egypt

Egypt has also descended on the World Watch List, going from No. 15 to No. 25. Nevertheless, the country’s score does not show any improvement. The drop is a result of Open Doors’ change in methodology to monitor and chart the persecution of Christians. The Christians with a Muslim background are facing the most serious problems. Apart from that, Egypt is going through a difficult stage. Islamist groups, such as the Muslim Brotherhood, are gaining more power after the election of Mohammed Morsi last summer.

Change in methodology

More than ever before, the World Watch List provides an insight in the overall spectrum of the persecution of Christians in all spheres of life (private, family, community, national and church.) The freedom to come together and the degree in which Christians are exposed to acts of violence are also included in the monitoring. This results in a balanced scoring, taking into account both the impact of violent incidents and less visible, structural developments threatening the position of Christians.

Christians are persecuted in at least 60 countries for their faith. They suffer interrogation, arrest and even death in some of the most dangerous and restrictive countries in the world. For 58 years Open Doors has supported and strengthened believers worldwide through Bible and Christian literature distribution, leadership training and assistance, Christian community development and prayer and presence ministry.
