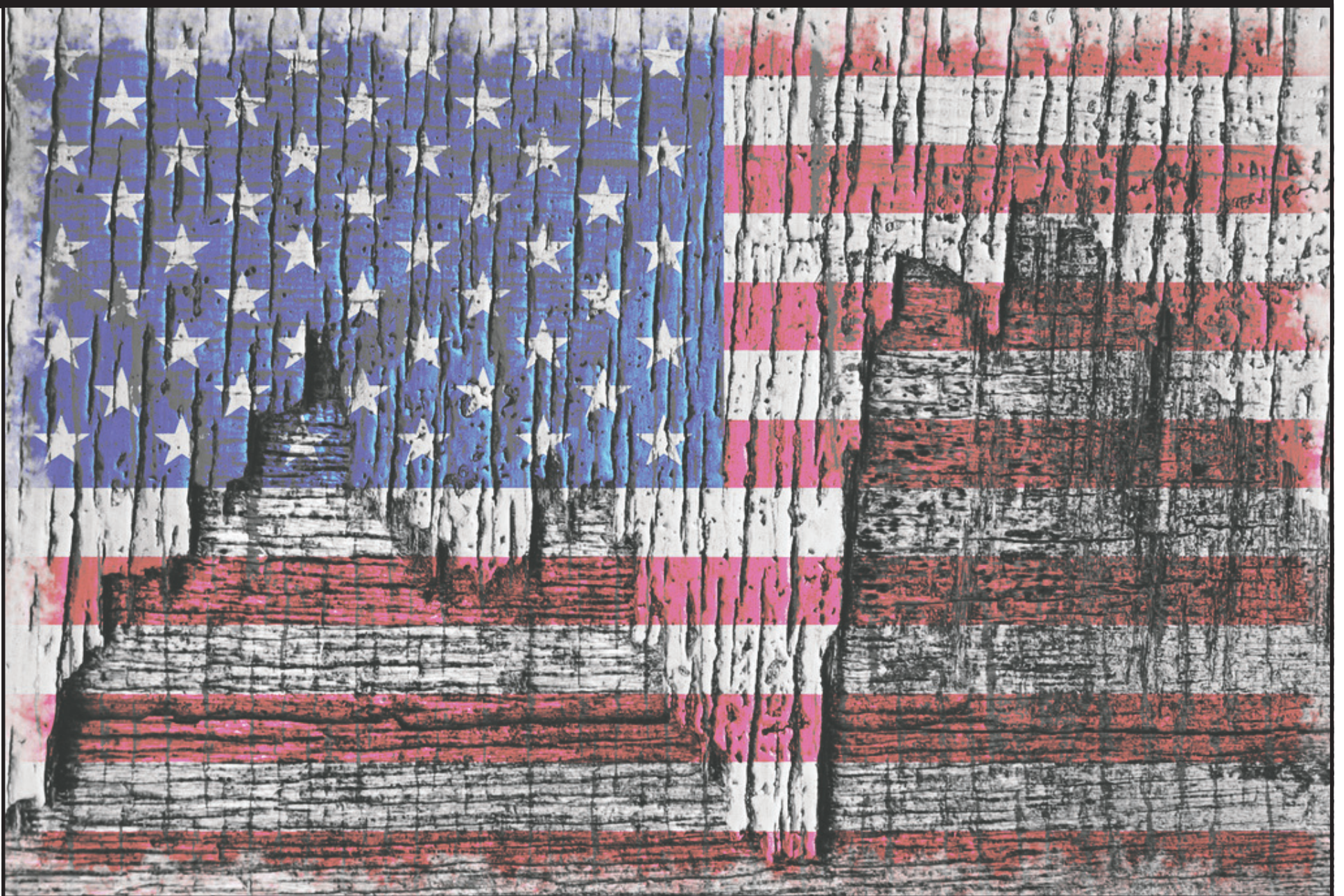

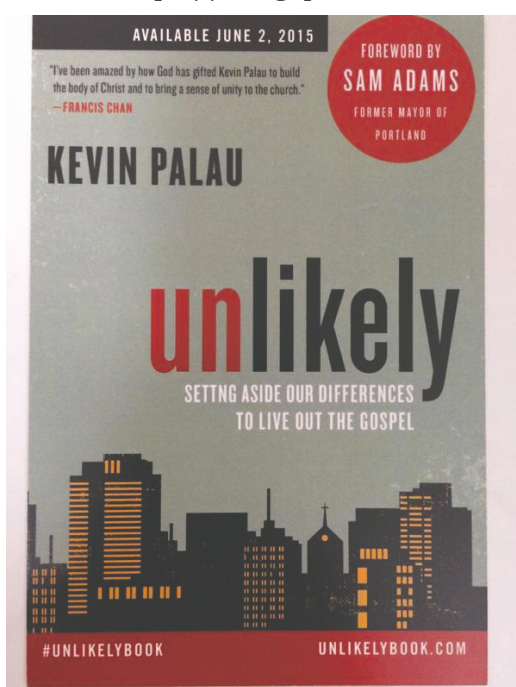

Portland is among the most unchurched and politically progressive cities in the nation. With its

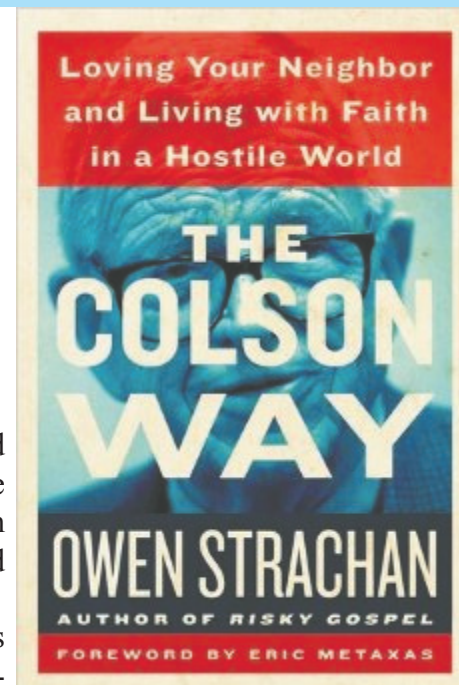
unique edge--from a popular television show dedicated to its eccentricity to hosting the country's largest naked bike ride--you wouldn't expect Portland to be home to one of the most successful partnerships between local government and area churches. But it is.

In 2007, Kevin Palau and a few dozen pastors approached Portland's mayor and posed the question: How can we serve you with no strings attached? Officials identified five initial areas of need--hunger, homelessness, healthcare, the environment, and public schools--and so began a partnership, CityServe, between the city and a band of churches seeking to live out the gospel message. Since then, the CityServe model has spread like wildfire, inspiring communities across the country to take up the cause in their own cities.

“Unlikely” not only tells the story of the inception of CityServe, but also challenges readers to evaluate their understanding of the gospel. Today's church finds itself torn between social justice and direct proclamation. “Unlikely” proposes a both/and scenario, showing how the gospel can truly penetrate a region--through word “and” deed.

CityServe is proof that when differences can be put aside for a worthy cause, real change can be attained, and unlikely beauty is born.

Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

Does Science Prove Evolution? The Cambrian Explosion

I was taught 40 years ago in medical school that stomach ulcers were caused by a breakdown of the “acid-barrier” of the stomach lining. Some patients were plagued with gastritis and peptic ulcers their entire lives. “Once an ulcer; always an ulcer” expressed the common experience. Pain, nausea, weight loss, and sometimes fatal bleeding or perforation occurred with frequency. Antacids, Zantac and special diets helped symptoms to a degree, but recurrence was the norm. More recently, dedicated researchers offered evidence that a previously overlooked bacterium caused most ulcers. The medical establishment initially scoffed at such a ridiculous notion. But scientific knowledge grew. The bacterium, *Helicobacter Pylori*, is known to cause ulcers; now everybody knows that. Certain antibiotics are now included in ulcer treatment and are generally curative. Severe complications are rather rare nowadays. Some theories die hard; the acid-barrier theory of stomach ulcers was one of them.

In the same way, the adherents to the deeply entrenched theory of evolution now scoff at new scientific advancements which contradict their deeply held beliefs. For example, explosive growth in knowledge about the genome, gene function, regulation and sequencing, especially during embryology has developed rapidly. How this works against evolutionary theory will be addressed in a later article.

Evolutionary theory is presently being taught to your children and grandchildren in government schools. It contends that all present life evolved from a simple common ancestor over eons of time, by small incremental steps into complex creatures like humans. If this is true, the fossil record should show very gradual fossil changes over long periods of time. The deepest fossil beds should show simple creatures with more advanced forms gradually developing in ever higher strata of rocks. Such a process

should show a fossil pattern evolutionists call the “Tree of Life.” But is this what the fossil record shows? The answer may surprise you.

The fossil record actually shows single-celled organisms existed beginning 3.5 billion years ago and changed very little over the ensuing three billion years. Then suddenly, 540 million years ago, an enormous diversity of marine animals with entirely different body plans (called phyla) show up almost simultaneously in the fossil record. Their body plans differed immensely. As for example, lobsters with their skeleton on the outside differ from sharks with their skeleton on the inside. During this Cambrian period there were worm-like animals with repetitive body segments and arthropod-like creatures having a head, a thorax and an abdomen. Evolutionists teach that these creatures evolved one from another. But in this “Cambrian Explosion” there they are, all together at essentially the same time. There’s no “tree of life” in the Cambrian.

What happens in the fossil record next? The answer may surprise you again. Nothing happens. Millions of years pass and the fossils stay about the same (that’s called stasis), i.e. no evolution. Next, they go extinct. After that, altogether new, more complex animals suddenly appear. This pattern subsequently repeats itself over and over; sudden appearance, stasis, then disappearance. Intermediate, or transitional fossils are scant. That’s what the fossil record actually shows. The “tree of life” is a myth. It’s assumed but doesn’t really exist. The statement, “the fossil record proves evolution”, is a conclusion based on fossil evidence contradictory to evolutionary theory.

The actual record of nature better fits the biblical statement, “And God said, ‘Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth’... And God created... every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind...” (Genesis 1: 20,21)

"Today we witnessed the death of marriage as created by God," said PFOX Executive Director Regina Griggs. "Homosexual weddings, if attended or forced to provide service to, are in reality forced affirmation—not approval—the real purpose of this lawsuit. When you attend a homosexual wedding, you become a witness. Therefore, do you remain silent when the officiant asks if there is any reason that the two should not be married? Our silence is, in fact, a form of affirmation. Do we park our beliefs at the door when we attend? Is that something as Christians we should do?"

Griggs also cited Matthew 19:4: "*Haven't you read, 'he replied, 'that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.*"

"Marriage in America should not be redefined on the basis that love and respect for those in same-sex relationships is enough of a reason to completely redefine marriage and abandon the principles that have existed for thousands of years," continued Griggs. "We know from research, and from the thousands of ex-gays who have left the homosexual lifestyle and gone on to marry people of the opposite sex and raise a family, that homosexuality is not immutable."

Sam Rohrer, President - American Pastors Network and Pennsylvania Pastors Network

"This landmark decision had deep biblical, historical and constitutional roots, and unfortunately, our justices chose to redefine marriage for the entire nation, ignoring other constitutional rights and opening the door to a dangerous infringement on religious liberties," Rohrer said. "The fact that this issue even made it to the Supreme Court of the United States was an indictment against American Christians and against American churches. Even though some churches have sought to blend into the culture rather than change it, this ruling serves as a wake-up call for pastors and churches who are committed to being the salt and light of our society and standing up for truth. Lynne Marie Kohm - Associate Dean, Regent University School of Law

"The Court has found a new fundamental right which will expand marriage toward a broader spectrum than was ever expected when women gained rights toward equality in modern marriage law," Kohm told Christianity Today. "For centuries, that [traditional] understanding of marriage has served to forestall the ills—especially to women, children, and underprivileged populations—that all too often result when society separates sex, procreation, and child-rearing. It has provided stability where there might otherwise be disorder."

HERE WE STAND

An Evangelical Declaration on Marriage

Russell Moore, president of the Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention, assembled a broad coalition of evangelical leaders to oppose the Supreme Court's decision to legalize same-sex marriage in a joint statement,

"As evangelical Christians, we dissent from the court's ruling that redefines marriage. The state did not create the family, and should not try to recreate the family in its own image," the leaders wrote. "We will not capitulate on marriage because biblical authority requires that we cannot. The Supreme Court's actions pose incalculable risks to an already volatile social fabric by alienating those whose beliefs about marriage are motivated by deep biblical convictions and concern for the common good."

In the statement, the leaders suggest that the Court's ruling is part of a negative trajectory on marriage and "represents an aftermath that evangelicals themselves, sadly, are not guiltless in contributing to. Too often, professing evangelicals have failed to model the ideals we so dearly cherish and believe are central to gospel proclamation."

The statement recommends six points of engagement by the church:

- Respect and pray for our governing authorities even as we work through the democratic process to rebuild a culture of marriage (Rom. 13:1-7);
- Teach the truth about biblical marriage in a way that brings healing to a sexually broken culture;
- Affirm the biblical mandate that all persons, including LGBT persons, are created in the image of God and deserve dignity and respect;
- Love our neighbors regardless of whatever disagreements arise as a result of conflicting beliefs about marriage;
- Live respectfully and civilly alongside those who may disagree with us for the sake of the common good;
- Cultivate a common culture of religious liberty that allows the freedom to live and believe differently to prosper.

"We promise to proclaim and live this truth at all costs, with convictions that are communicated with kindness and love."
