



Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

Christianity's Most Dangerous Idea

"Seven Truths that Changed the World"
A Review of Kenneth Samples book
by
Stephen R. Patton, M.D.

Two hundred years ago the biblical doctrines of Christianity were common belief in the U.S.. Since then a profound shift of thought in Western culture has changed the common mindset. Atheist philosopher, Fredrick Nietzsche's declaration, "God is dead," and ideas embraced by Darwin's theory of evolution have changed mainstream thought. Their once dangerous ideas are now promoted by public education, secular media and the entertainment industry. Now Christianity is presenting the dangerous ideas. This reversal is the subject of a book, *Seven Truths that Changed the World: Discovering Christianity's most Dangerous Ideas*, written by Kenneth Samples, Ph.D.. He is a Christian theologian and scholar working with Reasons to Believe (www.reasons.org). Dr. Samples re-expresses the basic truths of the Christian faith that once revolutionized the world. The seven ideas are only "dangerous" to our unbelieving, post-Christian culture which has replaced them with secular thought.

Dr. Samples first discusses Christianity's most dangerous idea: "Not all dead men stay dead." Naturalism (only the physical world is real) proposes a desperate predicament: We will die soon, die alone, and stay dead forever after living a completely meaningless life. Furthermore, the universe will soon grow cold and die so all of humanity will become extinct. Such utter hopelessness is the natural end point of our world and universe if there is nothing more than the physical world.

The resurrection of Jesus completely reverses this hopeless and nihilistic thought. It stands as Christianity's most dangerous idea. Naturalists say that bodily resurrection from the dead is impossible, and it is... without God. But if the resurrection is true, it overturns naturalism and God becomes ultimate reality. Here is a brief summary of evidences that Dr. Samples outlines supporting the claim that Jesus rose from the dead.

1. The tomb was empty. As the gospel accounts testify and many non-

biblical, ancient writings corroborate, Jesus' life ended in death by Roman crucifixion and was laid to rest in a tomb in Jerusalem. The fact that the tomb was empty three days later was never contested by those in Jerusalem who could have easily discredited the claim by producing Jesus' body. Instead, they argued that the body had been stolen.

- **2. Jesus' postmortem appearances.** The large number and varying circumstances of multiple individuals who experienced Jesus' post-resurrection appearances are not easily dismissed as religious visions or hallucinations (Mark 16:6).
- **3. Short time frame between events and eyewitness claims.** The gospels were written very soon following the events they record, not centuries later. If the recorded events had been manufactured, opponents of Christianity who were still living could easily have refuted them. They didn't.
- **4. Extraordinary transformation of the apostles.** The apostles sacrificed their lives for their belief that the risen Jesus appeared to them. Only they were in the position to know if their claims were false. Although many are willing to die for their beliefs, few are willing to die for a lie.
- **5. Paul's conversion.** Initially an enemy of Christianity, Paul believed he encountered the risen Jesus and died defending this claim.
- **6. Rapid emergence of the historic Christian Church.** Dr. Samples points out that an explanation for this is required. The resurrection explains it.
- **7.** Emergence of Sunday as a day of worship. Apart from the resurrection, no reason existed to replace Saturday (the Jewish Sabbath) with Sunday as a day more significant for worship.

The purpose of all this is not to detail each point favoring the claim that Jesus rose from the dead (better read the whole chapter for that). The purpose here is to briefly outline the reasonableness and large amount of evidence. Jesus' resurrection from the dead is reasonable, and well supported by a large body of verifiable evidence. This Easter, plan to worship in the full confidence of our risen Lord.

Home Run - The Movie

When I was given the opportunity to visit the set of the movie HOME RUN, my first thought was oh another baseball movie. But after spending a couple of days on location speaking with the cast and crew I realize that this movie is so much more than just another baseball movie. This movie is a sports story, a love story and a story of redemption.



Home Run tells the story of Cory Brand (Scott Elrod) a big league base-ball player who struggles with alcoholism. His past is riddled with problems including having an abusive alcoholic father. Cory is suspended from baseball when his out of control drinking collides with his rage. His suspension forces him to seek help and Celebrate Recovery is the only option available to him. Through the character of Cory Brand the viewers will realize that personal transformation is possible. This character is a strong-willed, tough know it all who doesn't need anything from anyone--yet deep inside is damaged, scared, unsure and struggling. For years, Cory hides his pain until one day it explodes. He uses anger to cover up what he is really feeling. This character craves approval and feeds this need for approval by playing baseball really well. As the movie unfolds, Cory is eventually forced to deal with his demons.

Can people really change? This movie explores the challenges that Cory Brand faces from losing everything to discovering what really matters. *Home Run* explores this transformation and reveals that there doesn't have to be shame along the journey.

Producer Carol Mathews and her producing partner Tom Newman develop "projects that matter." Carol was inspired to produce a feature film giving hope to those suffering from addiction.

"We want people who feel imprisoned by their choices or habits to know they don't have to carry that burden alone anymore," Mathews said. "We hope people will sit in the theater and see themselves, and will consider that whatever holds them back, God can heal it. Change is possible."

The faith message is developed in this movie by means of the Celebrate Recovery program. Celebrate Recovery was founded in 1991 by John and

Cheryl Baker. While John Baker was attending Alcoholics Anonymous he longed for a Biblically based, Christ-centered program. His thoughts were expressed in a 13-page letter to Saddelback Senior Pastor Rick Warren. Warren's response was, "John, you do it." Today, there are 19,000 individual churches and organizations hosting programs worldwide. More than 700,000 people have completed the program. The mission of Celebrate Recovery is to take a lost broken person, introduce them to the saving power of Christ and teach them how to grow into a fully devoted follower of Christ. The door to recovery is opened by spending time together sharing experiences, strengths and hopes with one another and celebrating God's healing power in our lives.

During my visit to Tulsa, Oklahoma I was fortunate enough to attend a Celebrate Recovery meeting. I witnessed people sharing stories of abuse and addiction while being supported by those around them. There is no need to suffer in silence because there are people who love you and will walk with you on your journey. They feel you can love the sinner, not the sin. Real recovery testimonies from addicts are used in the movie *Home Run*.

One of the scenes I had the opportunity to see being filmed in the West Tulsa United Methodist Church was that of Cory and Karen giving their testimony. Karen Brand is played by Nicole Leigh and is Cory's sister-in-law. Cory has no idea of the burden she has carried until the day her secret is revealed. Clay Brand played by Jim Devoti is Cory's younger brother



who wants Cory to start making better choices. Dorian Brown plays the girl that Cory left behind and Charles Henry Wyson plays the son that Cory Brand never acknowledged. Vivica A. Fox plays the role of Helene Landy, Cory's go getter agent whose only goal is to get Cory back on the field.

I also had the opportunity to speak with the director and cinematographer David Boyd before shooting began at Driller's stadium in Tulsa. David is known for his work on the television series Friday Night Lights, Firefly and most recently The Walking Dead. David explained that after receiving a call from Carol Mathews, he read the script and thought it was a great story and was excited to be a part of this project. David Boyd's hope is that the viewers walk out feeling encouraged and believing that there is always hope. Transformation can happen.

Home Run the movie is a feel good, Christian based family film that will be an inspiration to all. The film gives hope to those suffering from addiction. This is a movie about baseball, love and encouragement. A must see movie that will undoubtedly score big.

An Open Letter Regarding Celebrate Recovery and the Movie Home Run

WOW! It has been quite a ride since my wife and I first started attending Celebrate Recovery. I remember the day that the program was first introduced at Church at Red River, in Shreveport.

After seeing the emotional healing through this twelve step, Christ oriented program, both of us thought this would be a great avenue for us to help others.

Well, there have been a lot of surprises in the past seven years since we first stepped out to assist others who've been injured emotionally. Our realization was huge. Oh my gosh, we ALL need healing from life's hurts.

First and foremost, my wife Diane and I realized that Christ wanted to reveal and heal life's hurts within us - before we attempted to be helpful to others. Secondly, we saw others being healed of many forms of hurts, habits, hang-ups, and addictions, and we wanted to share that with our Christian family. Thirdly, we knew the Lord wanted to heal families broken apart due to the actions and, in many cases, the inactions of family members involved. God does truly restore the years that the locusts have devoured. The Bible verse, Joel 2:2 is true. "I will repay you for the years the locusts have eaten - the great locust and the young locust, the other locusts and the locust swarm - my great army that I sent among you." (New International Version) These three factors have been our motivation to pursue healing for ourselves as well as in others.

Our church, Church at Red River, has supported financially, spiritually, physically and emotionally the people who have come forth to receive healing through this dynamic Christ centered ministry. Celebrate Recovery at CARR has grown from the 13 people who first offered themselves to this ministry to a thriving community of 125 men, women, youth and children. On any given Friday night you will see 85 to 110 people meeting there to fellowship, worship, and learn more of Christ's healing power. In small groups they discuss their successes and failures.

James 5:16 (NIV) says "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective." This verse is fundamental to healing once we confess our sins to God . "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:9 (NIV)

There are other churches in the area that are active in Celebrate Recovery. First Baptist Church in Bossier meets each Monday night at six. Sean Gregory, the Ministry Leader there, has experienced the same success that we have seen due to prayer and the dedication given to "broken" people. First Baptist Church of Minden meets on Tuesday evenings and has been active for the past ten years. Also, Trees Baptist Church, located between Oil City and Vivian, LA, meets each Friday evening.

Celebrate Recovery is in its 21st year and is now in over 10,000 churches in the US. It is also in 21 foreign countries.

Although the movie *Home Run* is not a part of Celebrate Recovery, it does highlight the ministry and shows the healing power of Jesus through this Christ based program. The directors and driving forces behind the movie were each members of a Celebrate Recovery group. While going through CR they realized the powerful effect Christ had in healing their lives as well as the other participants.

It is our prayer and hope that those who see *Home Run*, (Christian and non-Christian alike), will realize that healing is available and will join in and receive the freedom we enjoy. In addition, my wife and I are hopeful for the opportunity to personally discuss with other churches how they can be involved in supporting a CR in their community.
