Thoughts on the Upcoming **Elections**

Dr. Timothy George, Chairman of the Board, Chuck Colson Center for Christian Worldview

Earlier this year, in the midst of the presidential primary season, I was asked to address a group of Southern Baptist pastors on the question of Chris-


tian faith and political engagement. Though no one knew for sure who the candidates would be at that time, the first question I was asked was, "How should an evangelical Christian decide who to support in this election?" That was a legitimate question, and has prompted me to think of some wider implications.


- 1) We should be grateful to live in a representative democracy where the right to vote and the rule of law are respected. Such has not always been the case, even in our own country, as the history of slavery, women's suffrage, and the struggle for civil rights indicates. Freedom is ever under assault from without and within. Religious liberty and political responsibility are closely related: If we default on the latter, we may well forfeit the former. Vote!
- 2) The American republic was founded on a clear distinction between church and state, as the First Amendment shows, but this has never meant the separation of faith from public life. What we believe about ultimate matters has a direct bearing on how we deal with issues of everyday life. What is a human being? How do we foster a society where justice prevails? How do we construct "a more perfect union" for the common good? These are profoundly moral and spiritual questions, as well as political ones. While IRS regulations forbid pastors and religious leaders from endorsing particular candidates (a rule that should be reversed in the interest of free speech), there is no prohibition against addressing the great moral issues of our time, all of which have political implications. Michelle Obama was completely correct in her remark at the African Methodist Episcopal Church's General Conference in June. She claimed that "there is no better place than church" to talk about political issues because they are ultimately moral issues. Distinguish!
- 3) In the Manhattan Declaration, Chuck Colson, Robert George, and I made a public argument, based on biblical wisdom and the right use of reason, that the three most pressing moral issues of our time are the sanctity of every human life from conception to natural death, marriage as a lifelong covenantal union of one man and one woman, and religious freedom for all persons. Of course, there are other issues that also call for Christian engagement: racial reconciliation, care of creation, immigration, education, care for the poor, and sex trafficking, among many others. And at other moments in history, other issues have claimed the attention of believers. For William Wilberforce, it was the abolition of the slave trade. For Dietrich Bonhoeffer, it was the persecution of the Jews. For Martin Luther King, Jr., it was the cause of civil rights. But today, life, marriage, and freedom are threshold issues that provide a basis for our concern about many other things. They are also the issues most under assault at this moment in our culture. Discern!
- 4) There is a difference between Christian discernment and partisan politics. The Kingdom of Christ cannot be equated with any political party..

Our current president, a Democrat, is the most pro-abortion president in American history, and yet Supreme Court justices appointed by Republicans gave us Roe v. Wade. What Baltimore Archbishop William E. Lori said to Catholic voters applies to all Christians regardless of party affiliation: "The question to ask is this: Are any of the candidates of either party, or independents, standing for something that is intrinsically evil, evil no matter what the circumstances? If that's the case, a Catholic, regardless of his party affiliation, shouldn't be voting for such a person." *Examine!*

Regardless of who wins the election in November, the spiritual and moral issues that ought to inform our political acts will remain on the agenda. In seeking to make a wise decision based on a rightly informed conscience, we need to listen to God's voice in the Scriptures, learn as much as we can about the candidates and what they stand for, and turn to God in prayer. These words spoken by God to the people of Israel long ago are still pertinent today: "If my people, my God-defined people, respond by humbling themselves, praying, seeking my presence, and turning their backs on their wicked lives, I'll be there ready for you: I'll listen from heaven, forgive their sins, and restore their land to health" (2 Chronicles 7:14, MSG). *Pray!*

Black Christians Abandoning Democrats, Heeding Bishop E.W. Jackson's Call for Mass Exodus

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20, 2012 /Christian Newswire/ -- For the first time since the black community's political realignment with the Democrat Party in the 1960's, a nationally prominent black Pastor has called on the black church



community to leave the Democrat Party in a movement dubbed "EXO-DUS NOW!" Bishop E.W. Jackson's call to "come out from among them" is apparently being heeded by many black Pastors and Christians across America and creating a stir in many churches. There is concern at the highest levels of the Democrat Party.

The impetus for EXODUS NOW, and what has given it credibility in the black community is the Democrat Party's increasingly secular stand, particularly making "same-sex marriage" an official part of the Party Platform. This came on the heels of a number of other actions which many Christians found objectionable: President Obama's support for same-sex providing healthcare to distribute free contraceptives and abortion drugs;

Convention speakers support for unrestricted abortion up to the moment before delivery; and taking God out of the party platform and no longer recognizing Jerusalem as the capital of Israel.

Across the country, as black Christians debate the call to EXODUS NOW, Democrats are shaken. They desperately need the votes of black church goers. Democrats are responding by attacking Jackson personally on left wing blogs.

"They can say anything they want about me," says Jackson, "but I do not intend to leave Christians in bondage to a party that is hostile to everything Christians hold dear. Either we worship and rely on God or we worship and rely on a political party. We are supposed to rely on Almighty God, not the government or any party. When a party disdains God and His word, as the Democrat Party clearly does, it is time to leave that party."

Says the Bishop, "This movement is not about Party, but principle; not about race, but righteousness. This is not about winning an election, but saving a generation."

The Biology of Sin:

"Grace, Hope, and Healing for Those Who Feel Trapped" A Review of Matthew S. Stanford, PhD's Book, part III

In last month's issue I discussed the human mind, or soul, and presented its God-given features including the capacity to think rationally and make moral choices. Every day you must choose how to respond to situations that inevitably come up and require your response. Often there are conflicts between selfish desires on the one hand and doing what we know to be morally correct on the other. Should I cheat on my taxes and get a refund or be honest and pay up? The soul of the non-believer has little power to resist selfish desire and perhaps not even to recognize right from wrong. The soul of the Christian on the other hand, which has received God's Spirit, has this additional capacity to recognize and overcome evil. Followers of Christ are explicitly instructed to resist evil (I Peter 2:11). But sometimes the temptations of the flesh are so intense they make resistance extremely difficult. In his book, The Biology of Sin, Dr. Matthew S. Stanford, PhD, explains the neurobiology of sinful conditions. He explains what's going on in the brain during addiction, rage, adultery, lying and stealing, homosexuality and other similar conditions. Let's take drug addiction as an example.

Imagine for a moment that you are eating ice cream, all you want. While devouring your chocolate sundae, certain cells in an area of your brain called the nucleus accumbens, let's call it the pleasure center, are stimulated by a neurochemical called dopamine. Dopamine is released there

Dr. Patton is member of Broadmoor Baptist Church and a practicing phywhenever pleasurable experiences take place and because of this, people tend to get in the habit of eating too much ice cream. Now suppose you take a dose of cocaine and measure the amount of dopamine released in

this pleasure center compared to chocolate ice cream. How much more is it? The answer is an astounding five-hundred times as much! Dr. Stanford says, "Cocaine takes your brain to a place it was never supposed to go, a place you will always try to get back to." The effects of doing cocaine even once can be so intensely pleasurable that some users become hooked from the first dose! Once used, more and more becomes required to obtain the same effect. After a while, withdrawal symptoms begin to occur when the drug is not taken and the cycle of addiction becomes established. To a degree, alcohol, PCP, nicotine, heroin, and marijuana all have the same potential.

The state of addiction, once established, becomes an all-consuming lifestyle of enslavement to procurement and use of the drug. Careers are destroyed; overdoses claim lives. Knowing now just how the body and soul can become seemingly overpowered by addiction, should we give the addict a free pass on this behavior? Compassion, yes, but not a pass. However difficult, this entrapment still constitutes sinful behavior which is freely chosen. There is hope! In Christ we have been fundamentally changed by receiving God's Spirit into our very being. His Spirit gives us the capacity to overcome even the worst temptations and sins. Addictions don't just disappear overnight but through effort with detoxification and treatment. Through counseling, Bible study, prayer, helpful medications, and persistence, even the worst addict can eventually shed the scourge of such affliction. There are countless examples and testimonies of success stories and retransformed lives. God's power can change people; sinful lives can be redeemed. The things which are impossible with men are possible with God (Luke 18:27).

The Power of Intercession

How to make a difference by praying for others Charles F. Stanley

How do you respond when people ask you to pray for them? In the first chapter of Colossians, the apostle Paul gives us a powerful model for intercession. Because the words come straight from the Word of God, we can be confident the Father will answer. And while it does not guar-

antee a problem-free life for those you love. God can use your commitment to prayer to have an eternal impact on those around you.

Ask God that the person you're praying for would . .

1. "Be filled with the knowledge of God's will" (Col. 1:9).

This first request is the prayer's foundation. Our heavenly Father desires to reveal His will, but we must listen to Him and obey. The apostle Paul prayed for the early church to have "spiritual wisdom and understanding" (Col. 1:9). Christians need God's direction and perspective for daily decisions as well as major ones, and knowing His will prevents us from wasting our time, talents, and treasures.

2. "Walk in a manner worthy of the Lord" (Col. 1:9).

Ask God to help this person live his or her life in a way that honors the Lord's name. When we call ourselves Christians, the unbelieving world expects us to be different. Our conversation, character, and conduct should reveal our obedience to God.

As a believer, the Lord Jesus Christ lives inside you through the Holy Spirit. His character flows out of you as you relate to others, and if you ask, He'll guide you into right choices and convict you of sin. With His help, you can make a difference in the lives of the people around you.

3. Be "bearing fruit in every good work" (Col. 1:10).

A Christian's life should have an eternal impact. That means we need to make time in our schedules to serve the Lord. I want to challenge you to evaluate whether you are making a positive difference in the lives of others. When yours comes to an end, what will you have accomplished?

"The unspiritual self, just as it is by nature, can't receive the gifts of God's Spirit. There's no capacity for them. They seem like so much silliness. Spirit can be known only by spirit—God's Spirit and our spirits in open communion. Spiritually alive, we have access to everything God's Spirit is doing, and can't be judged by unspiritual critics. 4. Be "increasing in the knowledge of God" (Col. 1:10).

A believer should continue to grow in his or her relationship with God. Just as a married couple knows each other better after spending many years together, we should also grow closer to the Lord and mature spiritually. To do so, we must study God's Word. By reading the Bible, we learn about the character and ways of the Lord. Also, we need to apply what we learn, and the Holy Spirit will teach us how to take it to heart. Finally, we should observe the consequences of our choices. We all make mistakes, but it's wise to learn from them. When we do, we'll quickly see how foolish it is to disobey God.

5. Be "strengthened with all power" (Col. 1:11).

Our loving Father moves on our behalf when we realize our helplessness and cry out in faith for His power. ¬Ask God to help the person you're praying for to lean on Him rather than his or her own ability. If you are interceding for a believer, that person has the strength of the indwelling Holy Spirit who will enable them to do the Lord's will.

6. Be "joyously giving thanks to the Father" (Col. 1:11-12).

Pray that the person would be thankful—even in hardship. A Christian can be joyful and grateful despite adversity when he or she trusts the Father to work a blessing through suffering. God uses hardship to build character in the lives of His children. In other words, this prayer doesn't guarantee that every moment of our lives will be easy, but they will help us become more Christlike.

Do you want your loved ones to have intimate, powerful relationships with the Lord? Do you desire for them to serve Him passionately and faithfully? It all begins with intercession. Regularly lift them up to Him and trust that God will do mighty works in their lives. Your heavenly Father will be faithful to fulfill His Word.

In the workplace it can lead to the termination of your occupation which means the elimination of your compensation. Procrastinate on changing your oil, and you will see the disintegration of your transportation. If it's home repairs, it will be the dilapidation of your habitation.

Procrastinate on spending time with your children, and you'll experience the alienation of cherished family relations. But the worst procrastination is when we procrastinate on the things of God, which may lead to the expiration and revocation of God's offer of salvation. So don't procrastinate. Initiate! And redeem the time.

Take Action: Consider the accumulating consequences of your procrastination. What will eventually happen if you don't change?
