### Defending the Faith - Linking Culture with Truth

#### Clash of World Views Ideas Have Consequences

The news media are currently documenting one of the greatest tragedies of our time. Civil war in Syria has resulted in widespread carnage there, displacing millions of Syrians both within that country and outside the borders as they have fled rebel enemy forces seeking refuge in surrounding countries. In Iraq, ISIS, The Islamic State, has swept across that country with breathtaking speed, in a rampage of death and destruction. In addition to killing soldiers, they are murdering civilians who refuse to convert to their brand of Islam. The gruesome carnage they have left behind is revolting. The recent execution of James Foley, a captured American Journalist, who recently was savagely beheaded by a faceless executioner on camera. is perhaps symbolic of the point I wish to make; who could do such things and what motivates them?

Over the years, evil has always seemed to be personified with a name like Hitler or Stalin. Their evil deeds could always be attached to their faces. But in recent years I was exposed to the concept of worldview through the study of Summit Ministry’s book, Understanding the Times. It became clear through that study that the names and faces of evil leaders come and go. But it is not just the leaders who govern which cause the plunder, theft, torture, murder and rape. People don’t rule, ideas rule and ideas have consequences.

ISIS has leaders who direct their path although I don’t exactly know who they are, nor have I seen their faces. But it’s an ideology that unites them in a brand of Islam which they follow. (Most of the world’s Muslims don’t behave this way.) But ISIS believes it to be true. According to their

worldview they are doing exactly right. They are commanded by a common ideology which compels them to act according to the dictates of its teaching. Such actions are barbaric to us but good and just to them, even righteous. Their worldview drives their actions.

This would be a good time to talk about the concept of worldview and begin a series of articles that discuss worldview topics. First, what is a worldview? Summit Ministries ([www.summit.org](http://www.summit.org)) founded by David Noebel, now led by Jeff Myers, teaches worldview to hundreds of young people every year at several locations throughout the country. The teaching material is also available for purchase with text, DVD’s and teaching videos featuring their top-notch apologists and instructors. Small groups can adopt the study or take it for high school or even college credit. Their students testify how “Understanding the Times” and other Summit Ministry material has solidified their faith and made them effective believers.

What is a worldview? UTT defines it as any bundle of ideas, beliefs, convictions, or values that provides a framework or map to help understand God, the world and your relationship to them. In general, a worldview should answer what is truth, define what man’s problem is, address values and beauty, address where we came from, why we are here, and how we should live. Specifically, a worldview should address ten disciplines: theology, philosophy, ethics, biology, psychology, sociology, law, politics, economics and history. In other words, a worldview affects all of life. In Summit Ministry’s Understanding the Times, the worldview of Christianity is compared to other worldviews like Naturalism, Marxism, and Islam. Interwoven into the material is an apologetic application which defends the truth of Christianity as it critiques the worldviews of other religions.

The Christian worldview should impact all aspects of life. Jesus promised that it will have a very beneficial effect in the next life (Jn 14:1-3) and this one too (Jn 10:10).

## Barna Research: Less than 10% of Pastors Talk about Pressing Societal Issues

**New research shows that while 90 percent of pastors believe the Bible has much to say about today's pressing political and societal issues, fewer than 10 percent are talking about those issues from the pulpit.**

Researcher George Barna spoke recently on American Family Radio's Today's Issues about his research project over the past two years, in which the Barna Group asked pastors across the country about their beliefs regarding the relevancy of Scripture to societal, moral and political issues, and the content of their sermons in light of their beliefs.

What he found was startling.

"When we ask them about all the key issues of the day, [90 percent of them are] telling us, 'Yes, the Bible speaks to every one of these issues,'" Barna told American Family Radio. "Then we ask them: 'Well, are you teaching your people what the Bible says about those issues?' and the numbers drop ... to less than 10 percent of pastors who say they will speak to it."

Sam Rohrer, president of the American Pastors Network, ([www.AmericanPastorsNetwork.net](http://www.AmericanPastorsNetwork.net)) says that while it is clear that there is a disconnect between knowing the truth and preaching it, the real question is why. Avoiding the politically unpopular portions of Scripture is in some respects understandable from a human perspective. From God's perspective, however, it is sin.

"The reality is that most people, including pastors, wish to be comfortable and to avoid controversy," Rohrer said. "If the primary goal is to see people leave on Sunday morning feeling good about themselves and feeling comfortable rather than seeing the holiness of God and the ugly reality of sin, then a pastor will answer to God for doing his own

will rather than declaring God's will. The issues of the day that confront our nation must be dealt with from the pulpit if God's Word is to make a difference in people's lives and if the culture is to be impacted. This includes the areas of marriage and divorce, life and family, but it also includes the areas of honesty, servant leadership, following the Rule of Law, etc."

Barna added that many pastors are afraid to get involved in political issues because of the controversy it might create. And, he added, "Controversy keeps people from being in the seats, controversy keeps people from giving money, from attending programs."

He also found that when asked how they measure the success of their churches, most pastors look to five factors: "attendance, giving, number of programs, number of staff and square footage."

"The fact that so many pastors are more concerned with the size of their buildings and church bank accounts than with the condition of the souls they shepherd is without excuse," Rohrer continued. "By abdicating their responsibility as ministers of God to 'preach the Word' in favor of square footage, many pastors are, in essence, saying God's Word is not really authoritative. In reality, a pastor—or any person for that matter—who feels they have the right to pick and choose what portions of Scripture they will believe or teach, rather than preach the 'whole counsel of God' have in effect made themselves god."

## A Word to Pastors about Pulpit Freedom Sunday 2014: Five Reasons Your Participation is Vital

**Pulpit Freedom Sunday** is October 5, 2014. In case you or others you may know are undecided about participating, let me give you five very good reasons why your participation is so important. After considering these reasons, the next step is to go to [www.pulpitfreedom.org](http://www.pulpitfreedom.org) and sign up. You may even decide to send this information to five or ten of your pastor friends and urge them to sign up, as well. It's time this movement of bold pastors sweeps the nation.

**1. The issues the country is facing are biblical issues.** Pastors, more than many others, are uniquely suited to speak to the issues confronting the country in this election season. Issues such as life, marriage, the family, the economy, the poor, and many others are addressed specifically in scripture. The effect of the Johnson Amendment has been to make these biblical issues "political," as if slapping a "political" label on an issue somehow removes it from the purview of scripture. For example, a pastor preaching a sermon thirty years ago that abortion is wrong was just being biblical. But that same sermon today is labeled as political and, as a result, the pastor is sidelined into silence. It's not that the church is somehow becoming "political." It's that politics is invading the realm of the church.

**2. The free exercise of religion requires a free pulpit.** The First Amendment prohibits the government from enacting laws prohibiting the free exercise of religion. A pastor preaching a sermon from the pulpit is one of the core activities of the free exercise of religion. A law, like the Johnson Amendment, that prohibits pastors from speaking freely from the pulpit violates the free exercise of religion. How can the exercise of religion be free if your church is subject to fines and penalties for something you as a pastor say from the pulpit?

**3. Every church and pastor has the right to decide what is preached from their pulpit.** Pastors and churches should decide for themselves what is preached from the pulpit. The IRS should have no power to insert itself into that decision-making process. But since the adoption of the Johnson Amendment in 1954, the IRS has done just that. Pulpit Freedom Sunday removes the government from the pulpits and churches of



America.

**4. The Johnson Amendment is blatantly unconstitutional.** Pulpit Freedom Sunday is a head-on constitutional challenge to the Johnson Amendment, which is blatantly unconstitutional. This unjust law, which never should have been applied to churches and pastors, has had a devastating effect on their constitutionally protected rights. Pulpit Freedom Sunday is a strategic initiative to remove this unjust law and restore a pastor's right to speak freely from the pulpit.

**5. America needs to hear from pastors.** Pastors in America have a rich tradition of speaking prophetically and boldly from their pulpits on the great issues of the day. The voice of America's pastors led the way through independence, slavery, civil rights, and have even influenced which men and women we put into public office. But because of the Johnson Amendment, the voice of pastors is unjustly silenced every election cycle. It's time for America's pastors to become part of the process again and to stop being sidelined by an unconstitutional law.

As pastors, you have a decision to make – do you want to have the ability to speak freely on all issues the Bible addresses, or do you want to let the IRS and culture define for you what is permissible for you to address? Pulpit Freedom Sunday frees pastors to make that decision for themselves. These are just five good reasons why you should take a moment and go to [www.pulpitfreedom.org](http://www.pulpitfreedom.org) to sign up to participate in Pulpit Freedom Sunday on October 5, 2014. It's time to stand... time to stand together with hundreds of other pastors from across the country who agree that pastors, and not the government, should decide what is said from the pulpit.

### Our reason for existence

Why do we exist? We love motorcycles, and most of all, we love Jesus. For more than 39 years, the members of the Christian Motorcyclists Association have been going into the highways and byways of America bringing light into the darkness. CMA's membership is made up of people from all walks of life who ride every brand of bike. On any given weekend, in any town, you can find the familiar CMA logo serving at events in all forms. From serving water in the heat of the day, to flagging races, to picking up trash, CMA looks for ways to serve and be "Here if you need us" whenever and where ever possible. CMA is not a Christian club or riding group designed to segregate Christians from the influences of the world, but rather it is a ministry designed to thrust you into the adventure of spreading the light of Jesus into dark places!

### Getting Acquainted

My wife and I first became acquainted with CMA in 2003. I had been a biker most of my life and loved to ride. I was preparing for retirement and we had moved to a small town south of Shreveport LA. I met some bikers in a local restaurant and they invited me to their CMA chapter meeting. I attended the next monthly meeting and was overwhelmed by the kindness and heart of the group. My wife was not too keen on riding, but I was able to convince her to join me in the group's activities. It didn't take very long and we both knew God wanted us involved in CMA. We actively served in the local chapter before being appointed as Area Reps for northwest Louisiana in January 2006. We have been serving as State Coordinators since September 2013. My wife overcame her fear of bikes and now rides her own bike! God has provided us many opportunities to share the Gospel with bikers from all walks of life.

### About us and our vision

CMA is a non-profit organization whose core focus is ministry and is a useful tool for fulfilling Christ's great commission of going into all the world and preaching the Gospel. CMA was born in 1975 by the late Herb Shreve. Leaving his secular pastorate he went full-time into the ministry he called the Christian Motorcyclists Association. Never did he dream this vision would grow from being one man on a bike preaching the Gospel, to over 160,000 members nationwide. As a Christian ministry, CMA is supported by individual gifts from the membership and from friends of the ministry. CMA is recognized by the IRS as a non-profit Christian ministry allowing all contributions to CMA National to be tax-deductible. CMA is a member of the Evangelical Council of Financial Accountability (ECFA).



CMA has experienced many changes throughout the years with God's guidance and blessing. In 2000, John Ogden Sr. was appointed the CEO/Chairman of the Board of Directors. Under the leading of the Holy Spirit, John Sr. implemented a team strategy throughout the ministry of CMA according to the principles taught by Jesus in the New Testament. The team concept starts with the Board of Directors and Evangelists and flows through to the state leaders, chapters, and National/International Support Center.

CMA's mission is to inspire our leaders and members to be the most organized, advanced, equipped, financially stable organization; full of integrity in the motorcycling industry and the Kingdom of God.

We are accomplishing our vision through:

- Evangelistic outreach primarily, but not exclusively to the motorcycling community.
- Run for the Son, where we partner with ministries of world reaching potential.

- Equipping our members in ministry training that aligns itself with biblical truths.
- A servant's attitude to the world and to our members (i.e. Here if you need us).
- Quality products that aid in evangelistic outreach.
- An efficient Support Center team.

### Working with youth

CMA's Youth Movement reaches out to teenagers whose families are involved in motorcycling and those who are riders themselves. Youth Movements in local chapters give young CMA members a place to belong and an avenue for involvement in this exciting outreach ministry to motorcyclists. Local Youth Movement Leaders mentor teenagers and help them develop in the ministry to which God has called them. Through the CMA Youth Movement the Gospel is being shared with young riders at motocross tracks, events, and races across the country.

### CMA fast lane

CMA Fast Lane focuses on the off-road and super bike section of motorcycling. We want people ministering in the area of riding they enjoy the most. We can be found working races and rallies, such as Mud Nationals, Rally in the Gorge, Star National, and local rallies and club rides.

### International missions and ministries

The outreach vision of CMA has spread around the world and CMA International ministries are established in over 30 countries around the world, with additional countries coming on board. Each country's CMA ministry works as its own entity under the leadership of CMA International. CMA USA not only helps to bring CMA to new countries, but also helps each country that already has CMA ministries to grow and mature in their work.

### Run for the Son

Run for the Son is CMA's yearly fund-raiser conducted by members and chapters. Each year, on the first weekend in May, members of CMA make a ride approximately 100 miles to raise money for specific missions' projects. Each participant seeks financial sponsors among friends and family to support Run for the Son.

From the Run for the Son proceeds, 20% will go to Missionary Ventures to purchase motorcycles for native pastors, 20% to Open Doors to purchase Bibles for Christians in other countries, and 20% to the JESUS Film Project to produce and distribute the JESUS film. The remaining 40% will be used to reach motorcyclists in the United States. With the RFS efforts, millions of people have come to Christ, over five thousand motorcycles

have been placed in the hands of native pastors, millions of Bibles have been smuggled into closed countries and placed in the hands of those looking for answers, and hundreds of countries have seen the JESUS film.

The 2014 Run for the Son ride raised \$4,047,650.35! Not bad for a bunch of bikers!!! Each dollar is an investment into the Kingdom of God, and every penny of that money will be used to spread the Gospel of Jesus!

#### Personally blessed

I have been blessed to participate in three CMA mission trips which typically consist of approximately ten CMA members. My first trip was to Nicaragua where our team dug footings for a bathroom for a local Christian trade school, visited orphanages and held precious babies, and delivered eight motorcycles to native pastors. My second trip was to Peru where we painted an orphanage, visited a local feeding center, and delivered three motorcycles to native pastors. My most recent trip to Honduras had us performing maintenance on approximately 35 motorcycles that had been given in years past to native pastors. In addition we gave away 10 new bikes to new pastors. Another pastor had a much more remote area and a motorcycle would not have benefitted him so we gave him a horse and saddle! We also purchased 200 pounds each of beans, rice, flour, and lard and made food baskets for local families.

Being involved in these mission trips to indigent countries has given me the opportunity to see first-hand how the Run for the Son funds impact evangelism in other parts of our world. It has also given me a new appreciation for the many blessings the Lord has bestowed on me and my family.

These are great opportunities to fellowship with other CMA chapters and worship together.
